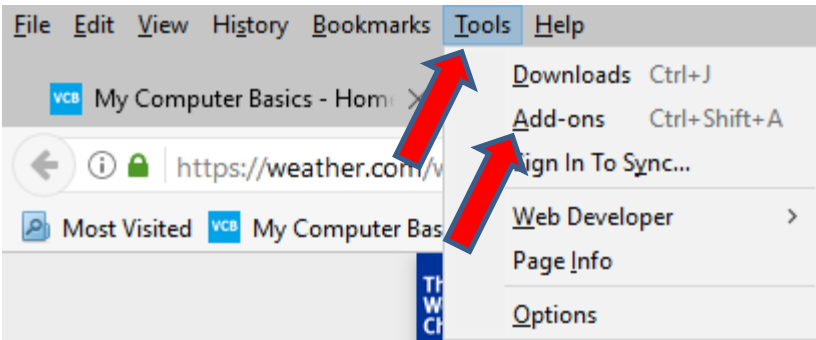


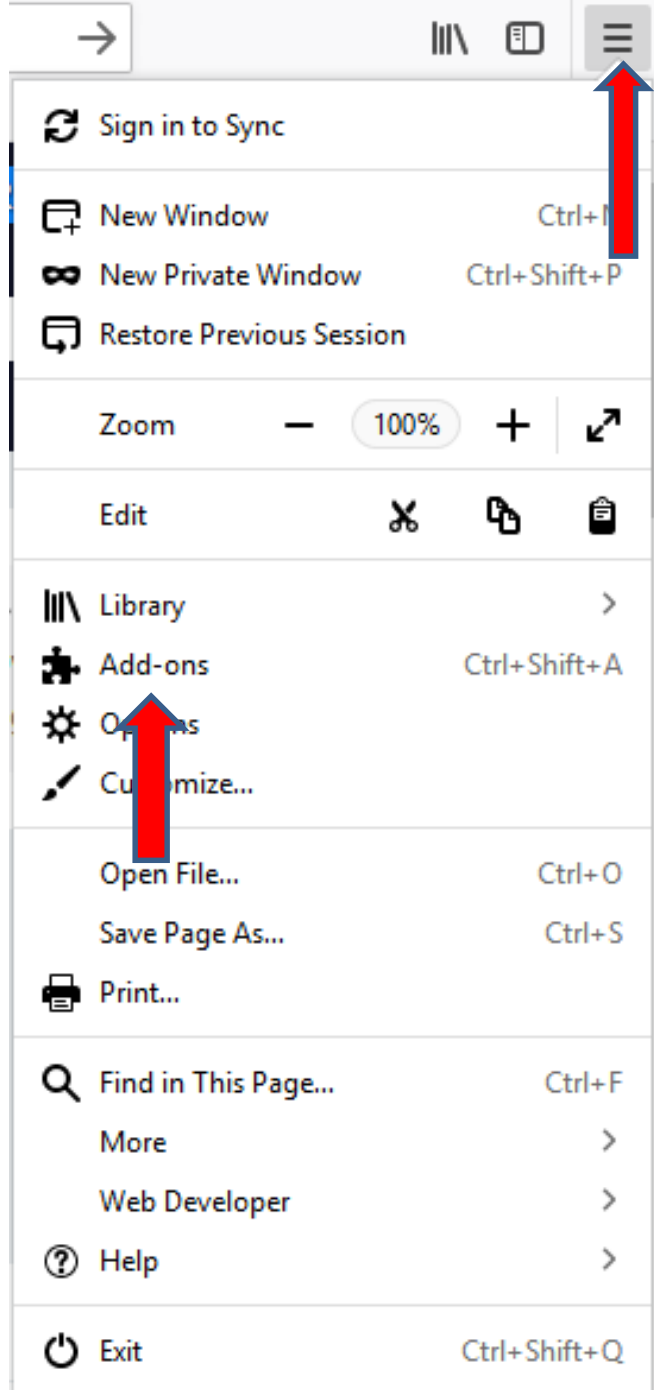
## **Step 5 – How to add and change Add-ons or Extensions with Mozilla Firefox.**

- As I mentioned in the Introduction, if you download a program from ninite.com, it is safe and it does not add Extensions. If you download a program from another website, sometimes it adds an Extension and it may not be safe. Also, when you click on a link in your e-mail or a website, sometimes it adds Extensions. That's why you should check the Extensions and check them again after you download a program.**
- Next I will show you how to get to Extensions and disable them or remove them. Make sure Firefox is open.**

- If you added the Menu bar, as I showed you in Step 2, you click on Tools and click on Add-ons.



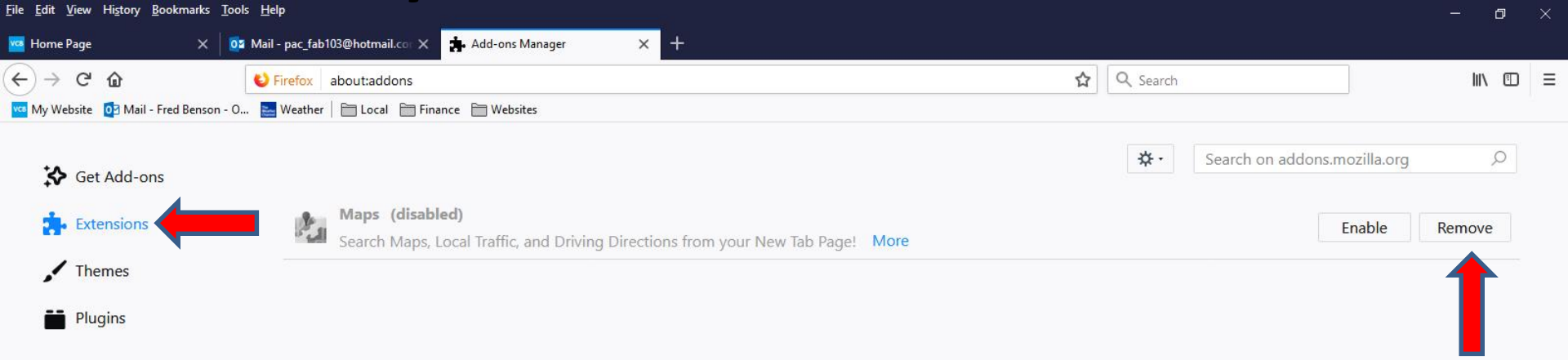
- If you don't have the Menu bar, click on the Icon in the upper right and click on Add-ons.
- Next is what happens.



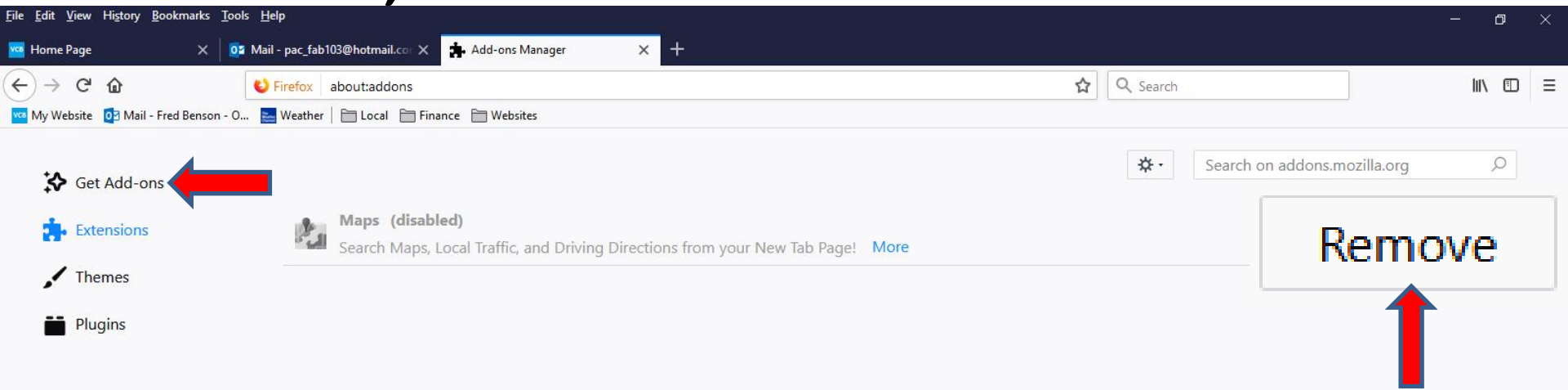
- When you click on Add-ons, a new Page opens and you see Get Add-ons highlighted. Click on Extensions below it and next is what happens.

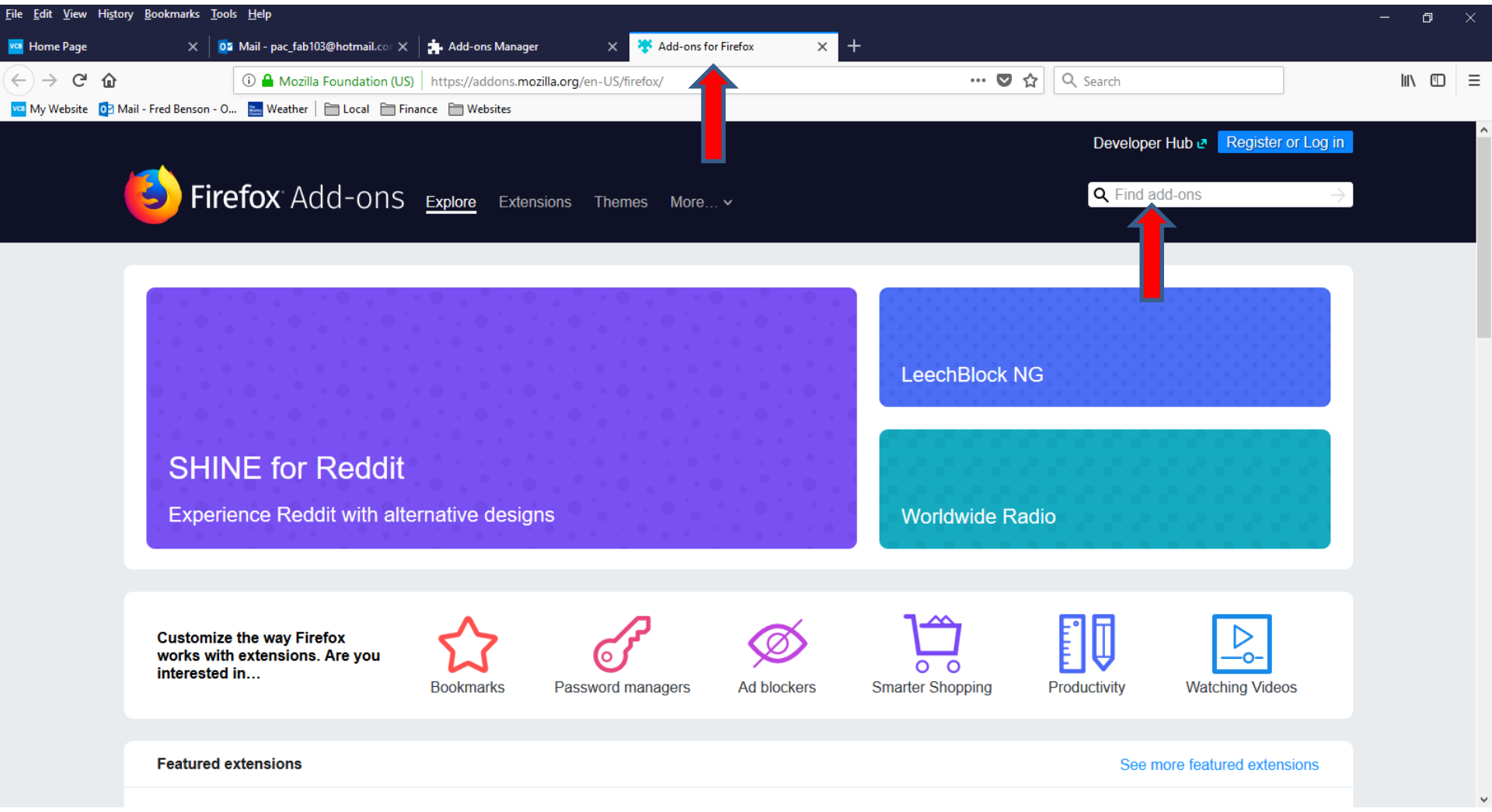

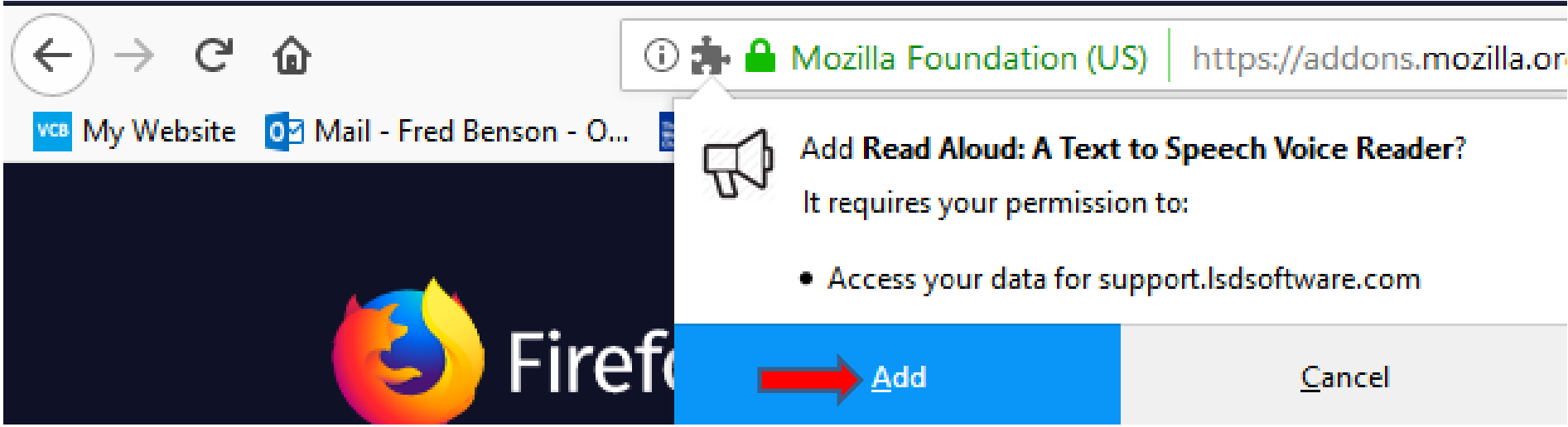

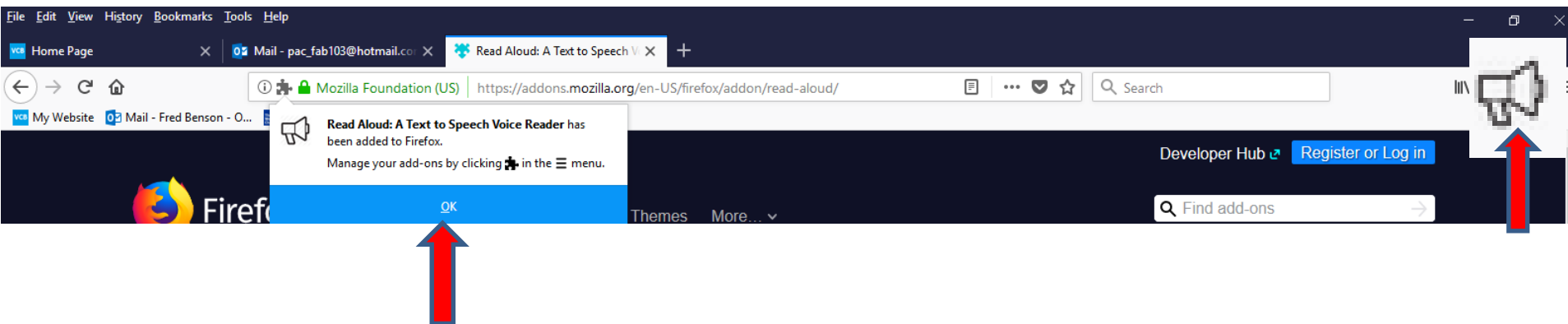

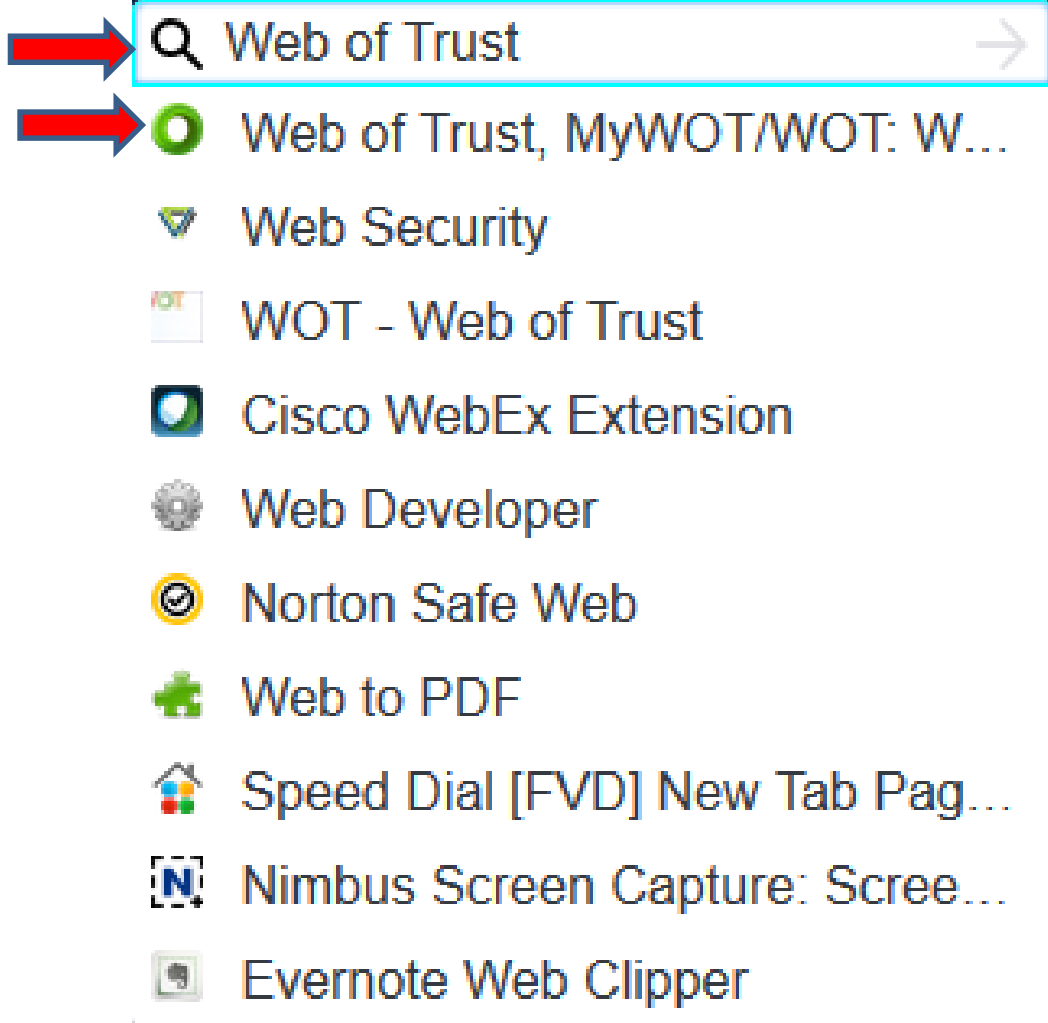



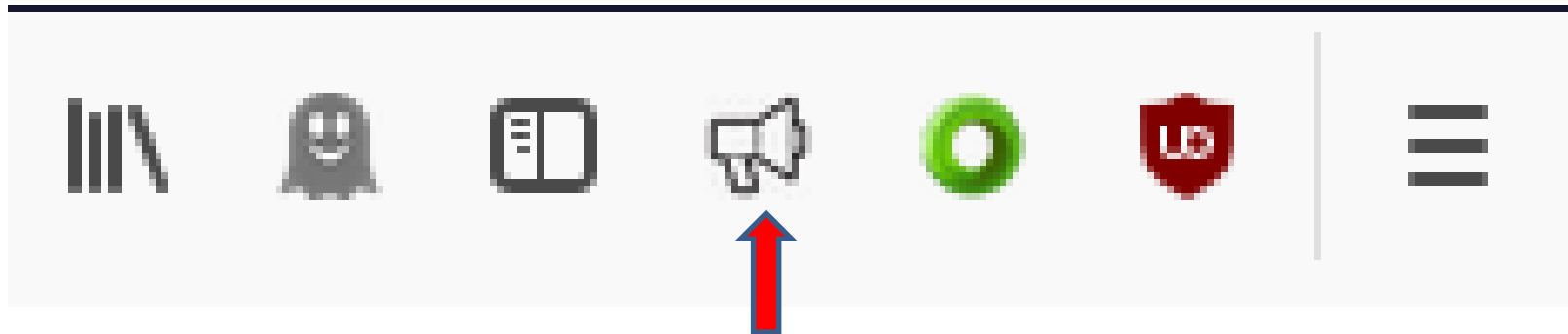

## Browsers Introduction

- Windows 10 has a new Browser called Microsoft Edge. The Icon is on the Taskbar. But, Windows 10 also comes with Internet Explorer Browser, but you have to search to find it. Step 1 shows you how to find Internet Explorer and how to Pin to Taskbar and how to download new Browsers with Internet Explorer and Microsoft Edge. I recommend you download two new Browsers.
