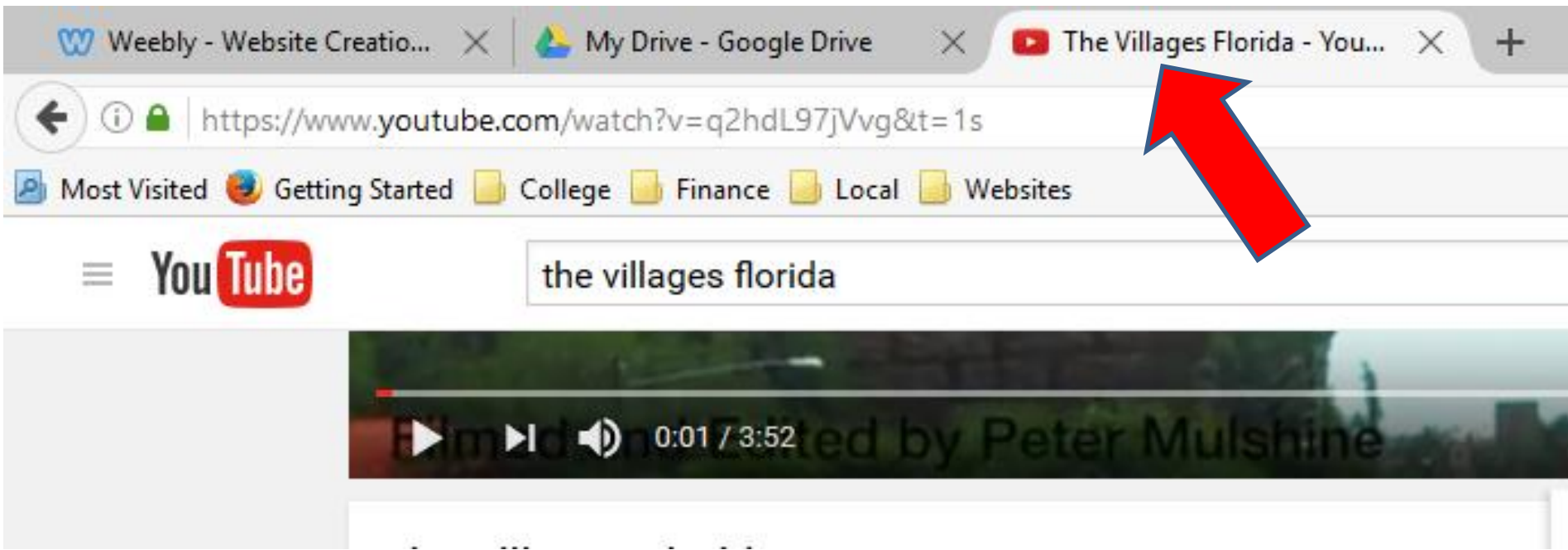


# Step 5 - Part 2 – Embed YouTube Video and customize

- The reason to Embed vs. using YouTube element is you can change the size.
- First click on the YouTube Tab.
- Next is how to Embed.



- Once you click on YouTube Tab, you will see the video again and may see Embed next to Share or have to scroll down to see.
- Then click on Embed and next is what happens.

- Once you click on Embed, you see code highlighted. Follow same process to copy.
- Once you copy, click on the Weebly Tab again.
- Next is to delete the YouTube element and do the Embed Code element.

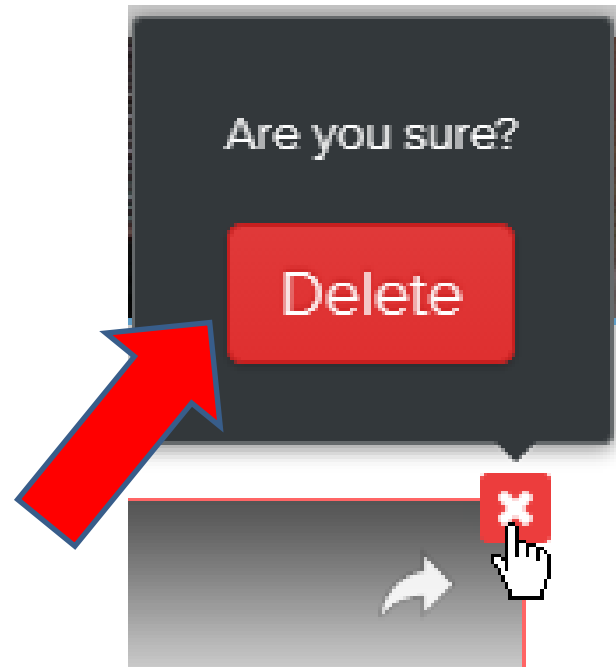

Context menu options: Undo, Cut, Copy, Paste, Delete, Select All, Search Google for "<iframe width="..."", Check Spelling, Inspect Element (Q)

- When you go back to Weebly, hover over the video and you see X on the right and click on it to delete it.
- Once you click on it, a new window opens, which is next.



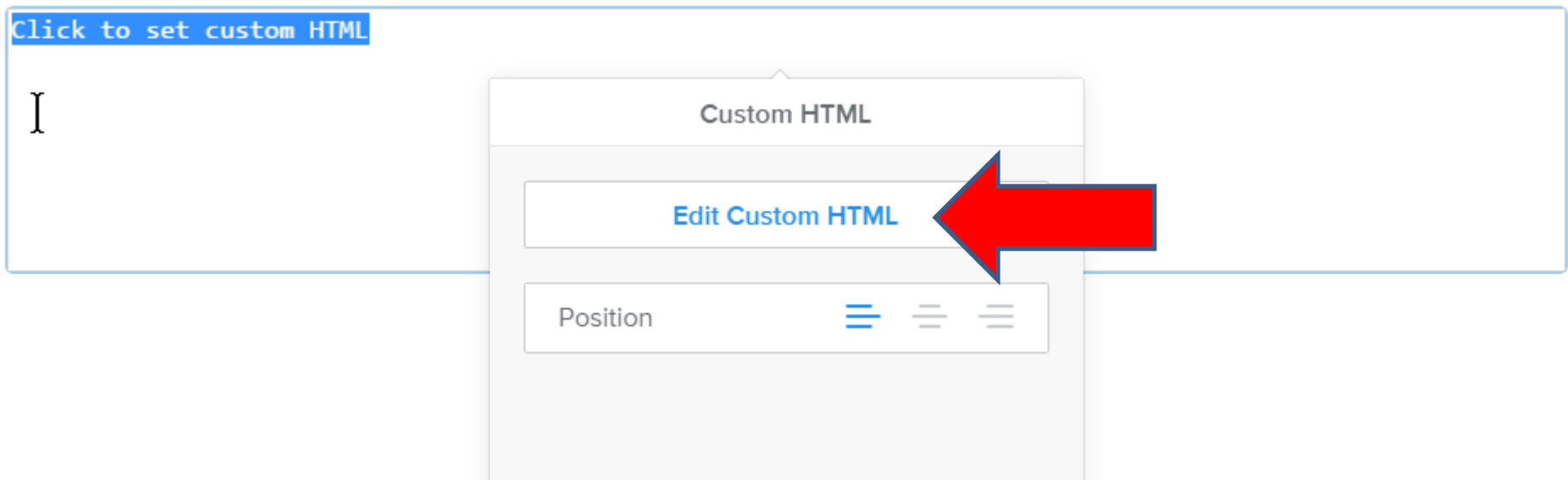
- You see it and click on Delete.
- Next is to drag and drop the Embed Code element.



- You may have to scroll up to see Embed Code.
- Then drag and drop the Embed Code element to the same page, which is next.



- You then see **Click to set custom HTML**.
- When you click on it, it is highlighted and a new window opens. Sometimes you have to click on the video and click on **Edit Custom HTML**.
- You follow the same process to paste, click **Ctrl V** or right click and paste.
- Next is what happens.



- You then see code.
- The size is smaller than the YouTube element, that is a full page width.
- You can make it the same size as the YouTube element or a little less size.
- When you click outside the element, you see the video, which is next. After that is to change the size.

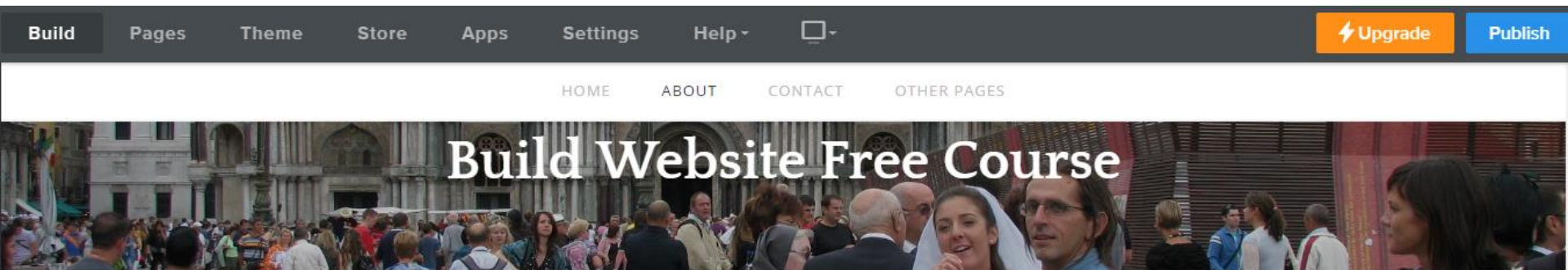

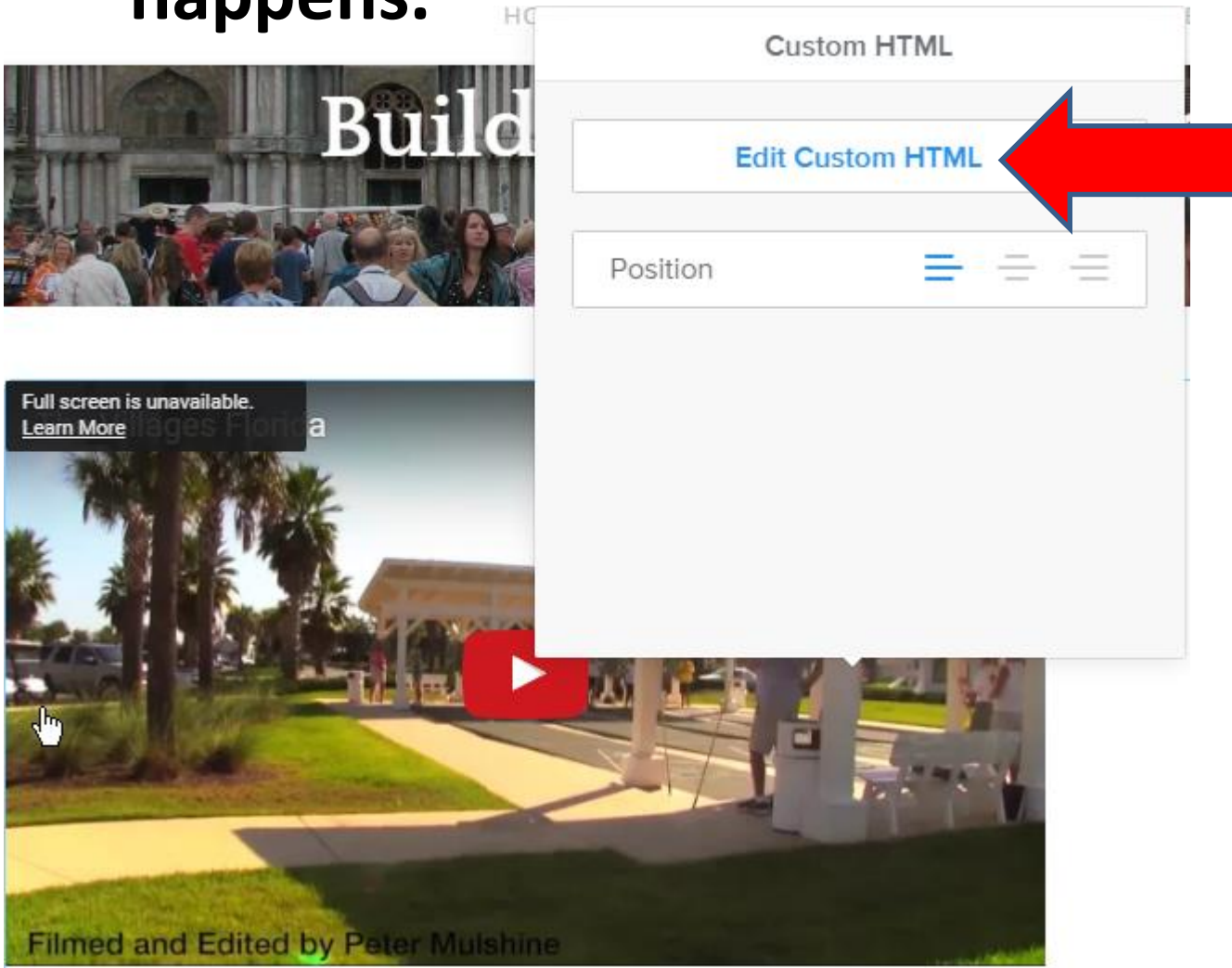




- You then see the video smaller.
- Click on the video to make changes, which is next.



- When you click on the video, the same new window opens.
- Click on Edit Custom HTML and next what happens.

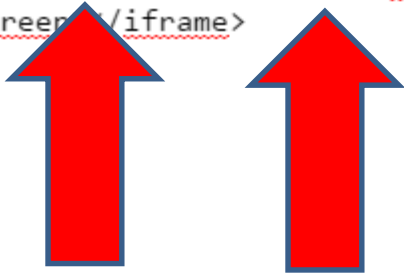


- You then see the code highlighted.
- Click on the code and next is how to change the size the same as the YouTube element.

- You highlight 560 and change to 922.
- Then highlight 315 and change to 548.
- Or you can change to 760 and 415 to make it a little larger, but not the same as full page.
- When people play the video, they can show it in a full screen. They hover over the video and click on the full screen when is next.

- Here is a sample of playing and hover over and you see Full screen.
- When you click on it, it goes to Full screen and they can click on ESC key to got back.
