
Step 2 – CamStudio Options

 If CamStudio is not open, open it as I showed you in Step 1. You click on Options and next is what happens.




When you click on Options, a new Window opens and you see a list and sometimes the default is Do not record audio. When you record, it does record Music or your own Voice. Next explains about Record audio from microphone and Record audio from speakers in the list.




- If you have a Laptop, sometimes it allows you to Record audio. If yes, when you click on Record audio from microphone or Record audio from speakers in the Options list and Record with CamStudio, you can add your own Voice or if you Record a Video that has Music, the Music is on the CamStudio recording, which is Step 6.
- If your Laptop or other Computer does not allow you to Record audio, you need to have a Microphone or Speaker and plug it in to your computer. If not, you have to buy one.
- Note My Laptop allows to Record audio, but Microphone is better, that's why I use Microphone. Next is a sample of clicking on Record audio from microphone in the Options list.

 When you click on the Record audio from microphone, the Window closes. When you click on Options again, Window opens again and you Record audio from microphone is checked. Note – if you plug in a Microphone, you have to hover over the Audio Options, which is next.



 Below is what happens when you hover over the Audio Options and you see a list, and then click on Audio Options for Microphone and next is what happens.




 Window closes and a new Window opens and then click on the Microphone and you see a list and then click on the Microphone that you plugged in, like I did and next is what happens.



 Here is a sample of the Highlight Cursor when you record. As I mentioned before, I did not like it. That's why I just use the changed Cursor vs. the Highlight.  To change the size of the Highlight Cursor, you left click on the Icon in Size and hold it down and drag to the left to make smaller or to the right to make it larger. Next is a sample of dragging left a little to make in smaller.



 Here is a sample of dragging left a little and see the Halfsize is smaller. Next you click on Color to change the Color, which is next.






 When you click on OK the window closes and you see the new Color. Once complete, click on OK and the window closes and you have to click on Options again, which is next.


 When you have to click on Options again, you see the list again. Enable Autopan will allow you to select a small region of your screen as the recording area, then the record region will scroll following your mouse to keep what's under your mouse visible. I decided not to click on it or Autopan Speed. Next explains other options.



 Automatically stop recording allow you to select the Seconds to stop recording. I decided not to that and just click on the stop icon to just stop recording, as I will show you in Step 6. Next is about Program Options.




 When you hover over Program Options, a new window opens with a list of options. I decided to hover over the Play AVI file when recording stops and next is what happens




• When you hover over Play AVI file when recording stops a new window opens and sometimes it shows Use System Default Player. If not, I recommend you click on it. Next is other option.


