## Part 3 - Rotate or Flip

- The reason to Rotate is if you took a Picture with your camera turned, the Picture may not be straight. Note - some new cameras automatically Rotate it.
- First, I will open a Picture that was not straight and how to Rotate it.
- Flip is interesting. You will see it after Rotate.
- First you open a Picture in PicPick that is not straight. If you don't have a Picture that is not straight, you may want to open a Picture to Flip.
- Next is explains if you don't have PicPick.
- As I mentioned before in the other Parts, if you don't have PicPick, hover over Courses again and click on Screen Capture page and Step 1 shows how to download PicPick and open PicPick. If you have PicPick before June 2018, I recommend you download the new version.
- If you don't have a Picture on your Computer, I recommend you Screen Capture, which explains next.
- As I mentioned before in the other Parts, if you don't have a Picture on your Computer, hover over Courses again and click on Screen Capture page again and it has a lot of Steps that shows you how to Screen Capture with PicPick and it opens an Image on PicPick and you can Flip it.
- If you have a Picture on your Computer, next is how to open a Picture that is not straight with the new version of PicPick and after that is open a Picture with the new version of PicPick. The other Parts also showed you how to open a Picture with PicPick. If you know how to open a Picture in PicPick, you may want to forward to page 8.


# - PicPick Opens like this in the new version as I showed you in the other Parts, then click on Open again in the Left and next is what happens. 



# - A new window opens, like File Explorer. Then find the folder with the Picture you want. Next is a sample of find one.

- Here is a sample of finding a Folder with a Picture that is not straight. Double click on it or click on it and click on open as I mentioned in the other Parts. Next is what happens again.

- It opens in PicPick. I recommend you Zoom out to $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$ as I showed you in Part 2. Next is a sample of Zoom out.

- You then see it smaller. Next click on Rotate in the upper left and next is what happens.

- I zoomed in so you can see it. Then click on 90 clockwise and next is what happens.

- You then see it Rotated. Next is to save it as I showed you in Part 2. Click on File in the upper left again aand next is what happens again.



## - Page changes again and then click on Save on the left and next is what happens again.



- It changes the Picture on your Computer and the page goes back to Home. Next is how to Flip it or open a new Picture you want to Flip.

- You click on Rotate again and I zoomed in again and then click on Flip Horizontal at the bottom and next is what happens.



## - You click on the Rotate drop box and click on Flip Horizontal.



## - Once you click on it, you see the Flip rotated.



Next, you may want to Save As
vs. Save to
create another picture.
