

# **Movie Maker Alternative**

## **PowerPoint 2016**

- The reason is that Microsoft no longer supported Movie Maker in Jan 10, 2017 and you can't download it.**
- If you have Movie Maker, you can use it, but if something happens with it, you may not be able to use it anymore.**
- Next I will explain the Movie Maker features and what features can't be done on PowerPoint. Note – I explained it in the presentation for all Alternatives.**

# Movie Maker Features

- You can create a video with Pictures, Videos and Music.
- You can add your own Voice.
- You can add your own “video” with webcam.
- You can edit Pictures, Videos and Music.
- You can add Titles.
- You can add Captions and effects on the Pictures and Videos.
- You can Snapshot a Video to create a Picture.
- You can save it will different size of Video.

# **Movie Maker Features that can't be done on PowerPoint**

- Webcam video. But, you can use a different program, like ManyCam and add it to PowerPoint.**
- Snapshot a Video to create a Picture. But, you can use a different program, like Snipping Tool to create a picture and add it to PowerPoint.**
- You can save Video will different size of Video. But, you can use a different program, like aTube Catcher to change the size of the Video.**
- PowerPoint does Trim the Music, but Movie Maker does that with Splits and can remove part of it. You can do that with a free Program called Audacity and then add it to PowerPoint. Next is more of them.**

# **Movie Maker Features that can't be done on PowerPoint**

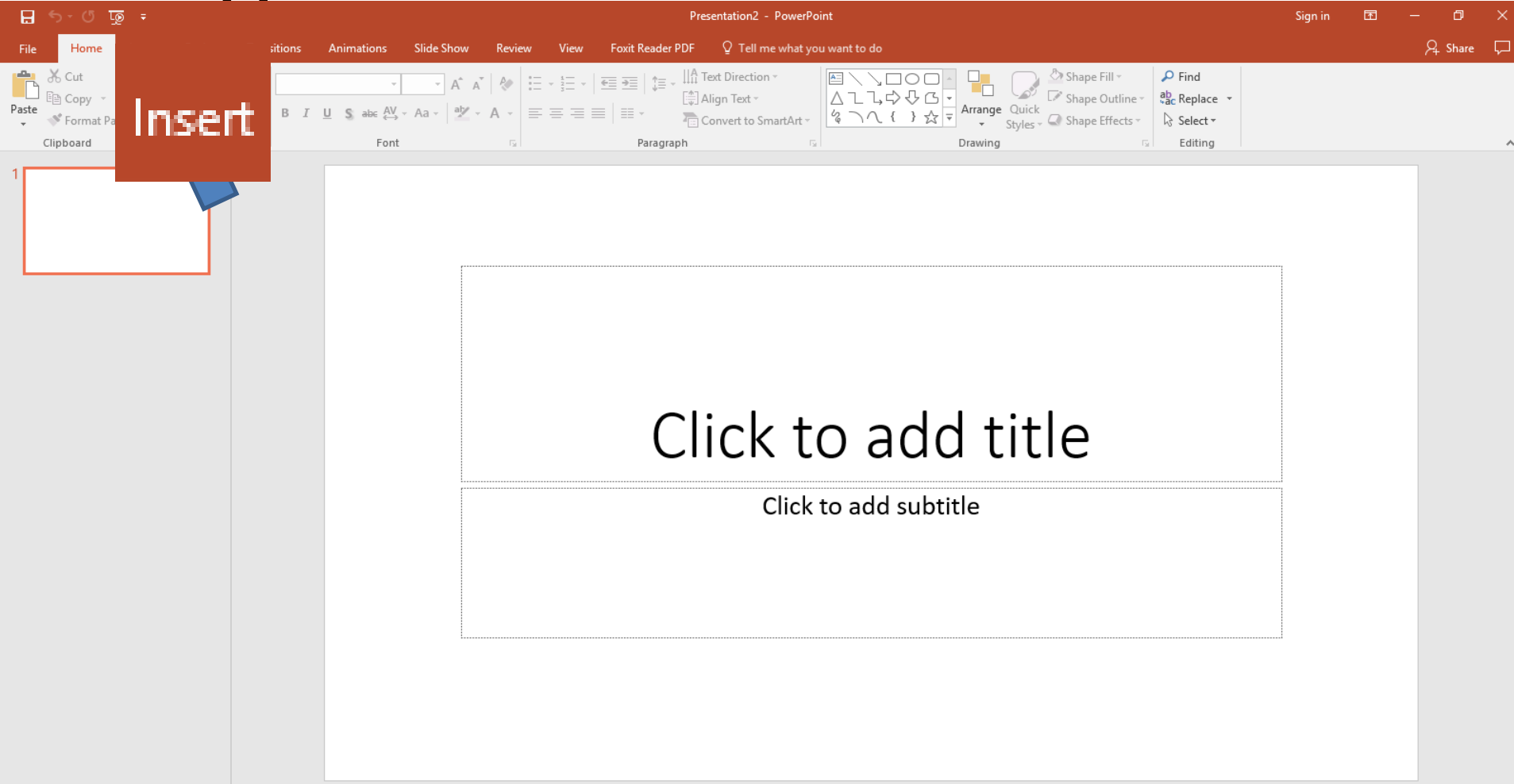
- Edit Video with Split and remove part in the middle. PowerPoint does Trim, which is to change the start and end, but it doesn't do split to remove part of the video. But, PowerPoint can Trim and add the same video on another slide and do a different Trim to remove part in the middle**
- Next is what PowerPoint can do that Movie Maker can not do.**

- **Movie Maker does not display Gif images effects, but the PowerPoint does display the Gif images effects. Also, PowerPoint can download Gif images and other Photos from on-line.**
- **PowerPoint can add more then one image on a slide, but Movie Maker can't add two images together.**
- **Next I will show you part of PowerPoint.**

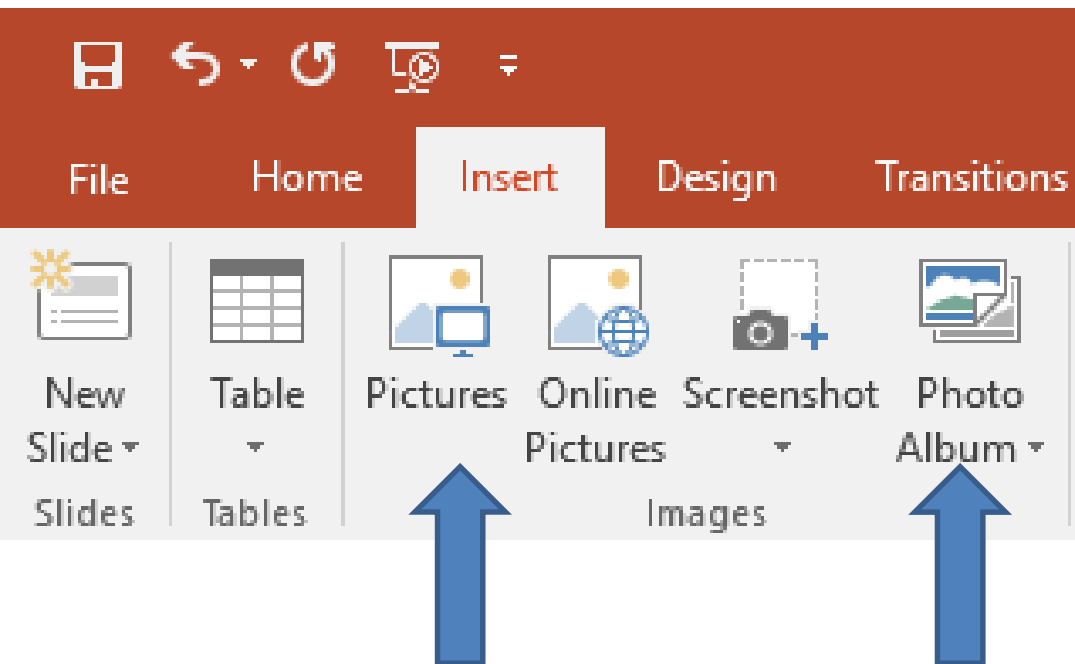
# PowerPoint

- **The 2013 and 2016 version changed the size of the slide pages.**
- **But, you can change it back to the original.**
- **Next is how to add multiple pictures for a slide show.**

- This is what it looks like in 2016. First click on the Insert tab next to Home.
- I will zoom in, so you can see it. Next is what happens.



- You see Pictures options. I recommend you click on Photo Album, because it adds a picture on each slide.
- If you use Pictures, you have to add each slide and add a Picture on each slide. Photo Album is easier for Slide Show which is next.





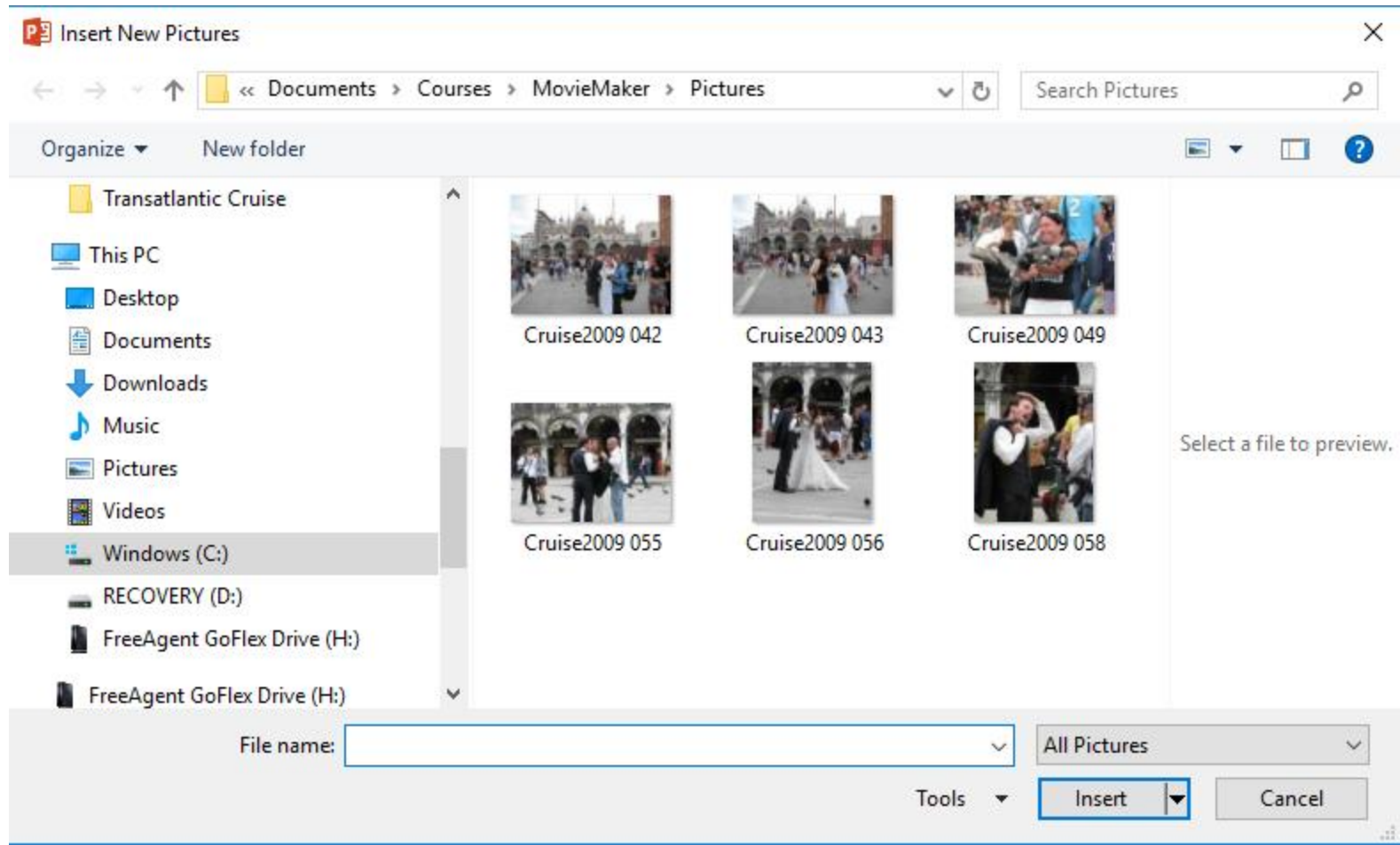
- When you click on Photo Album a new window opens and click on File/Disk
- Next is what happens.

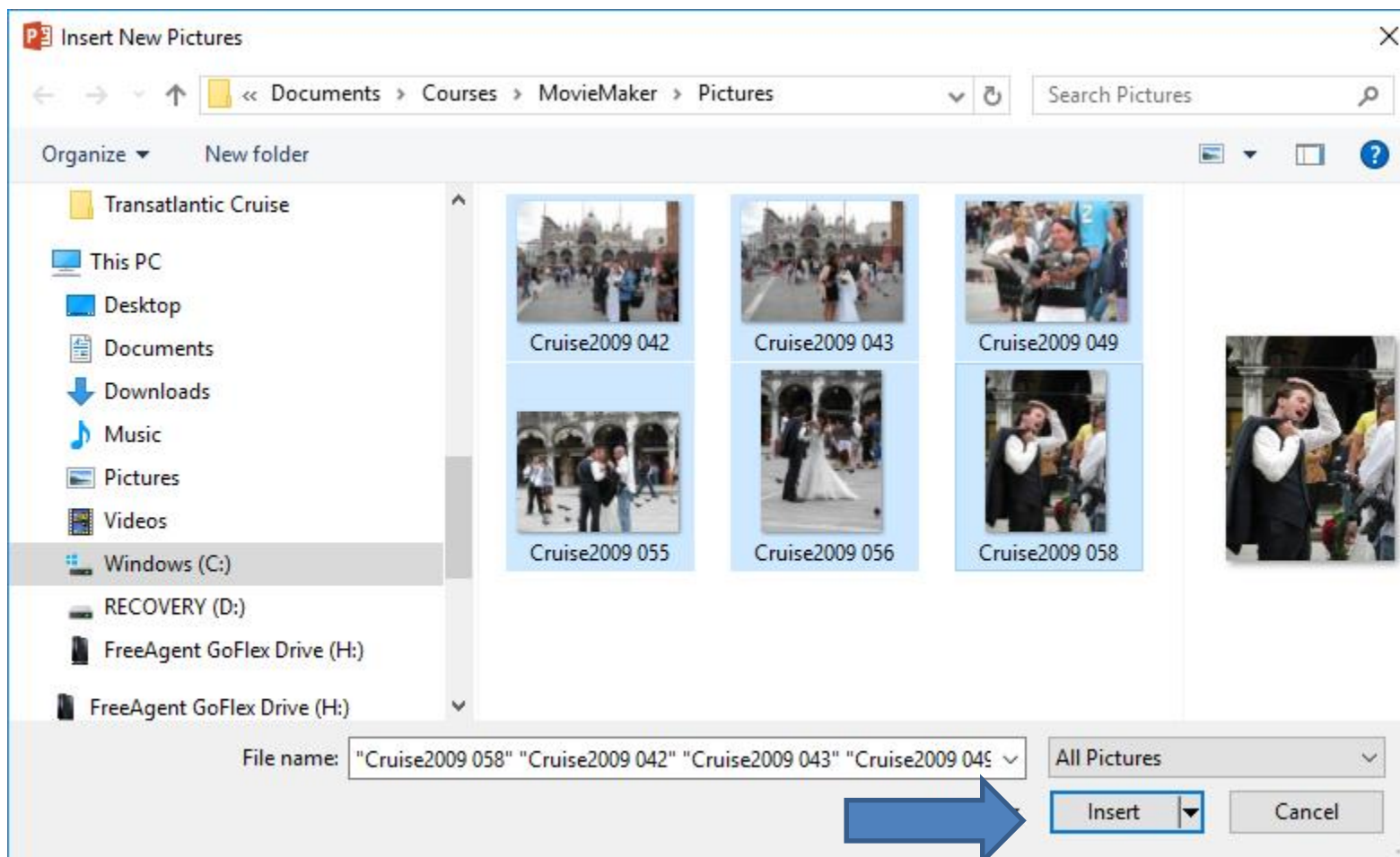

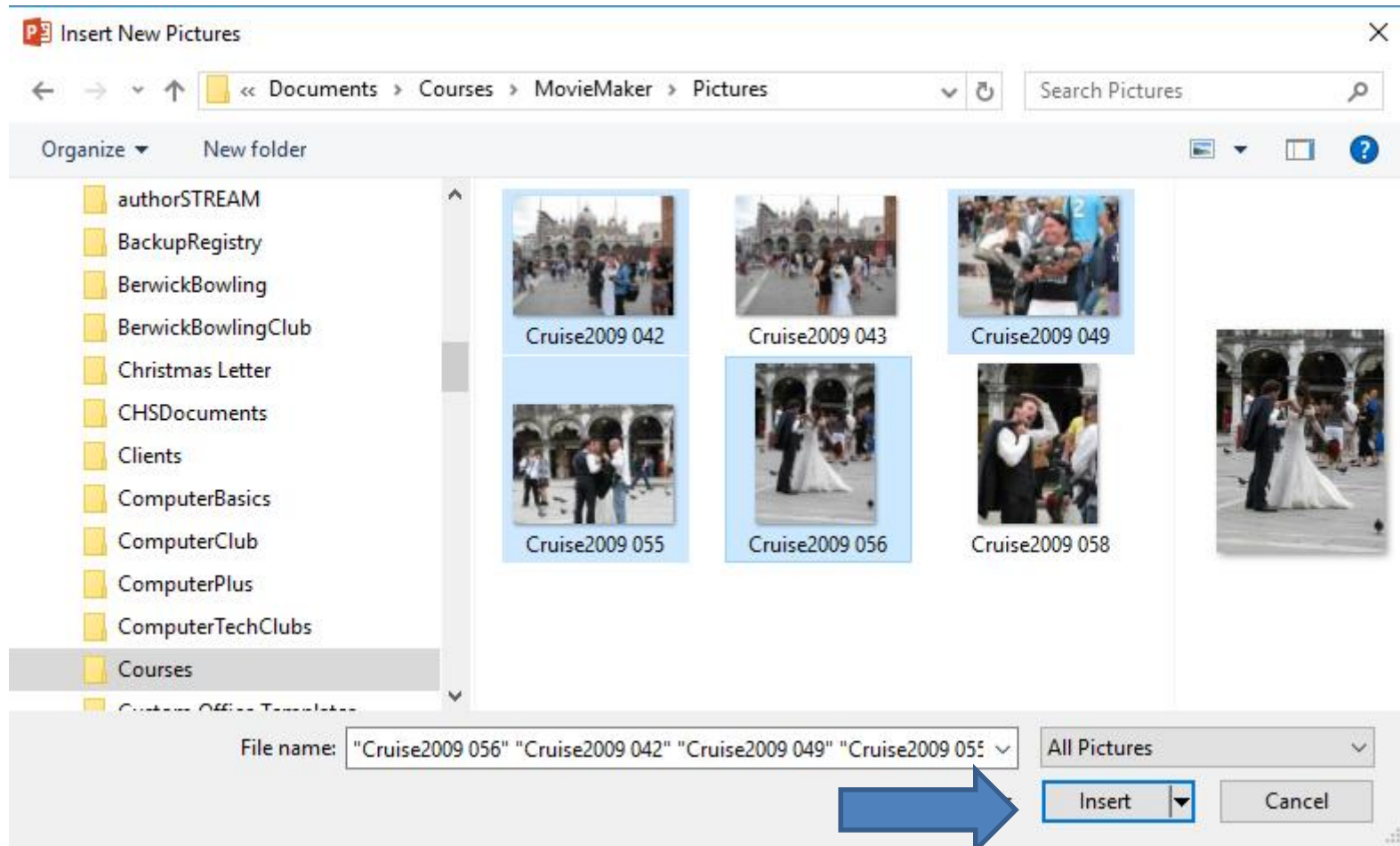
- **File Explorer opens and you find a folder with the Pictures you want to add.**
- **Next is to highlight them all.**



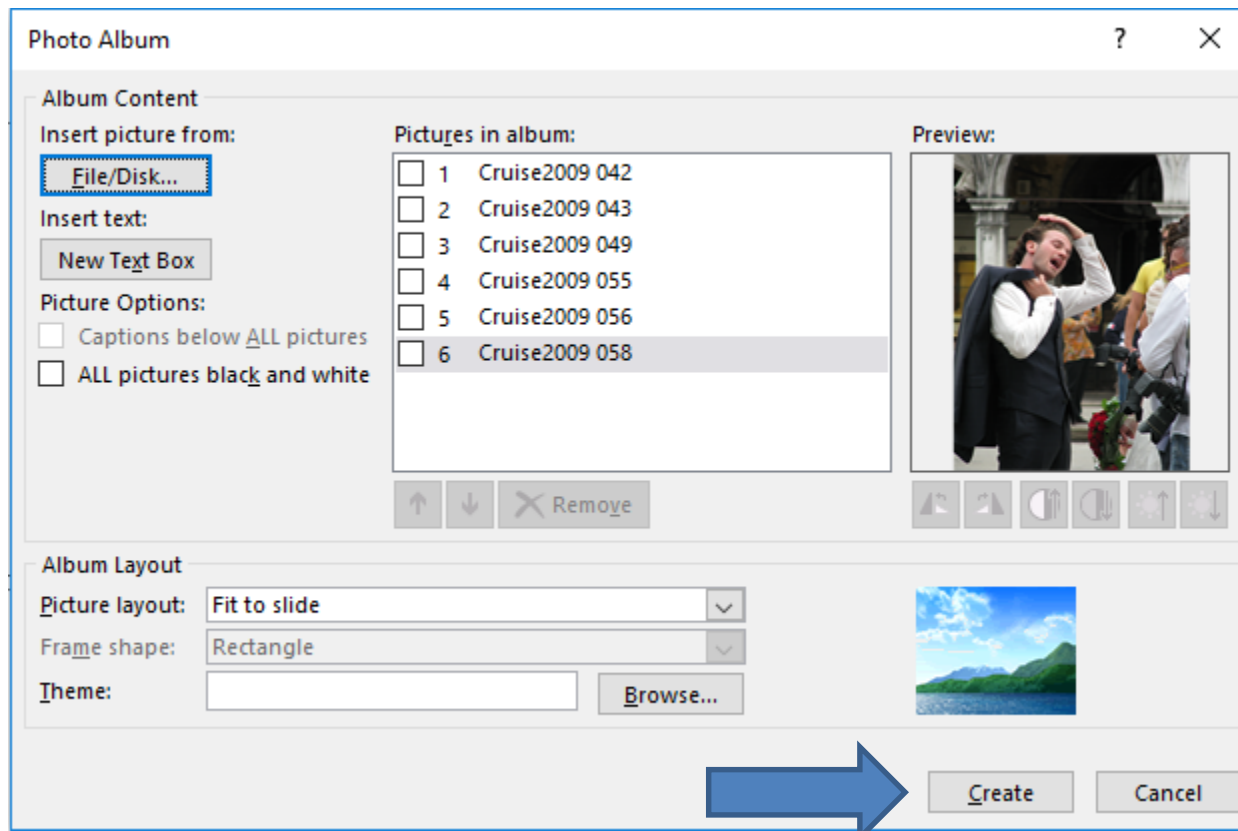
- You click on the first one and press and hold the Shift key and click on the last one and then click on Insert.
- Next is the how to not select all of them.



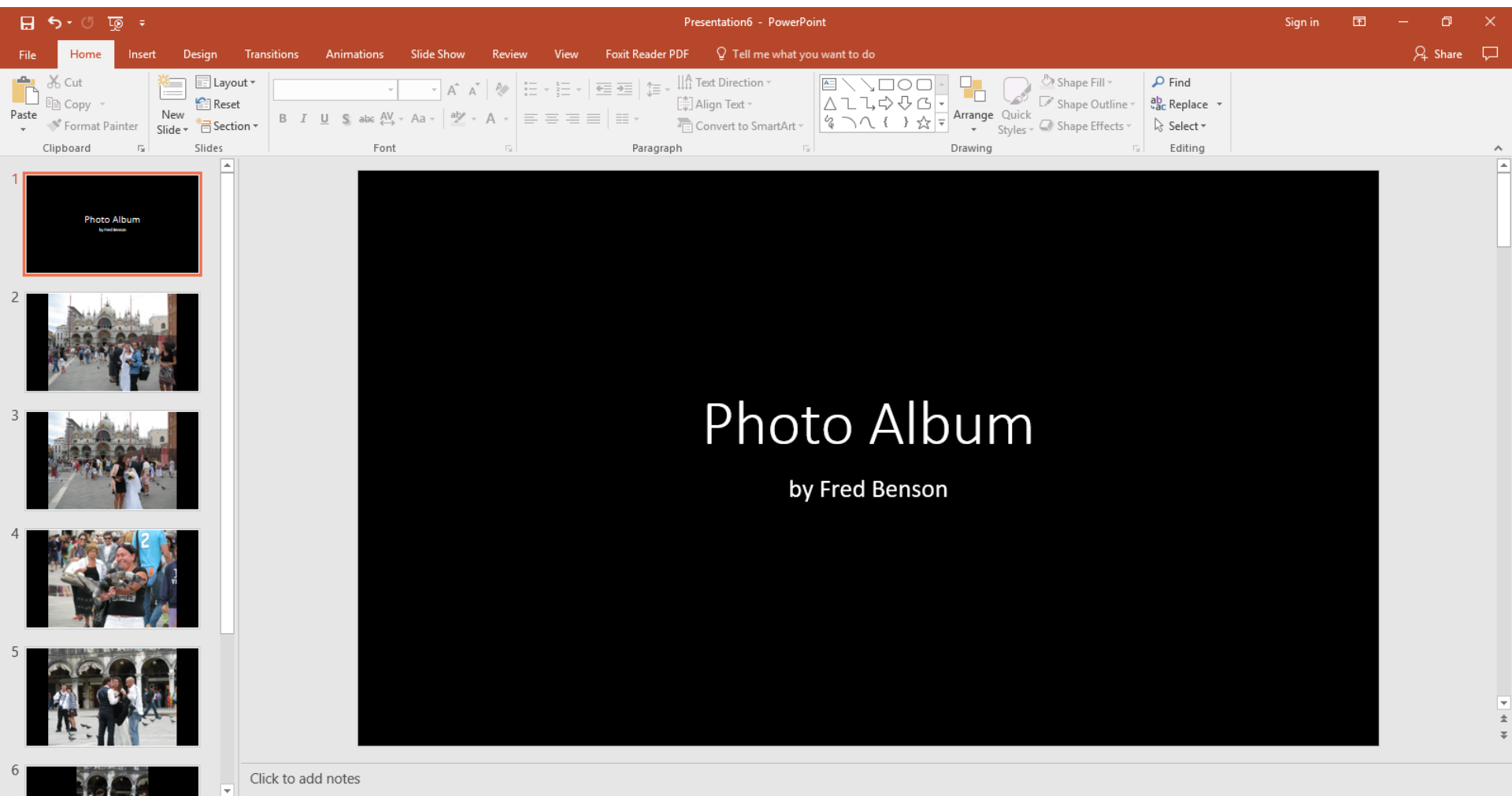
- You click on the first one you want and press and hold the Ctrl key and click on each one you want.
- Next is what happens when select them all.



- It goes back to the other window with all the pictures. Then click on Create.
- Next is what happens.



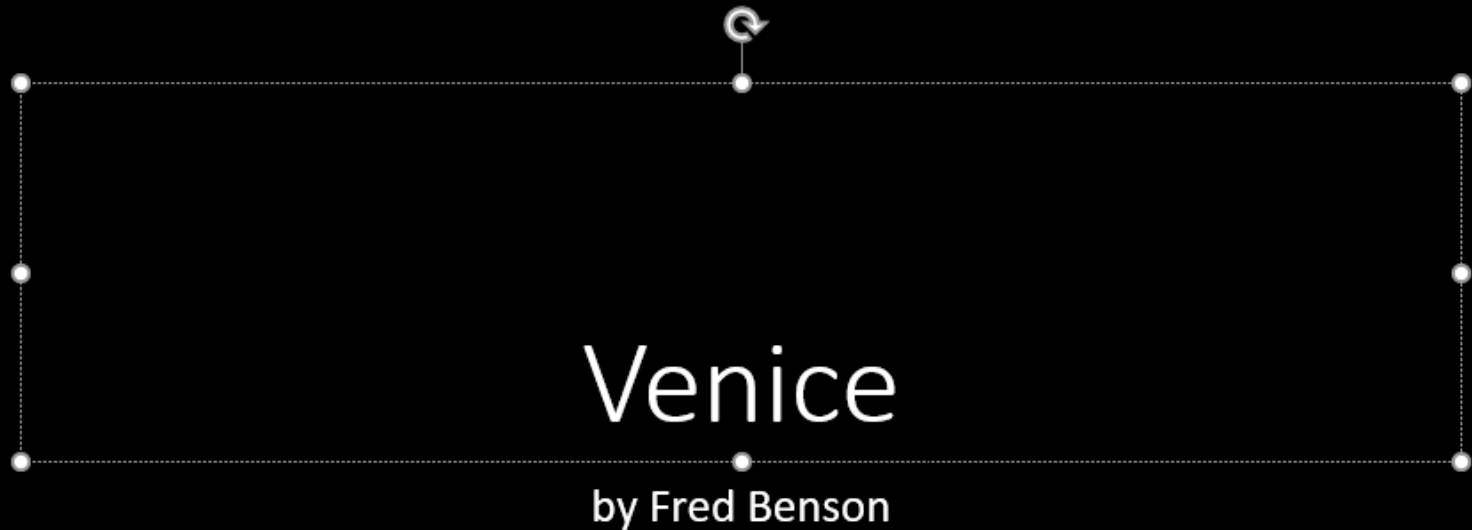
- It creates a new Presentation name and you see Black background with Title and all the Pictures. Next is to change the Title.



- You click on it and then highlight it.
- Then type in new Text, which is next.



- Here is a sample. You have a lot of options to make changes. Next is a sample of changes and removing - by Fred Benson.





- Here is a sample of changing Font, Bold, Italic and changing background color.
- Next is a list of other features and I will show you some of them.

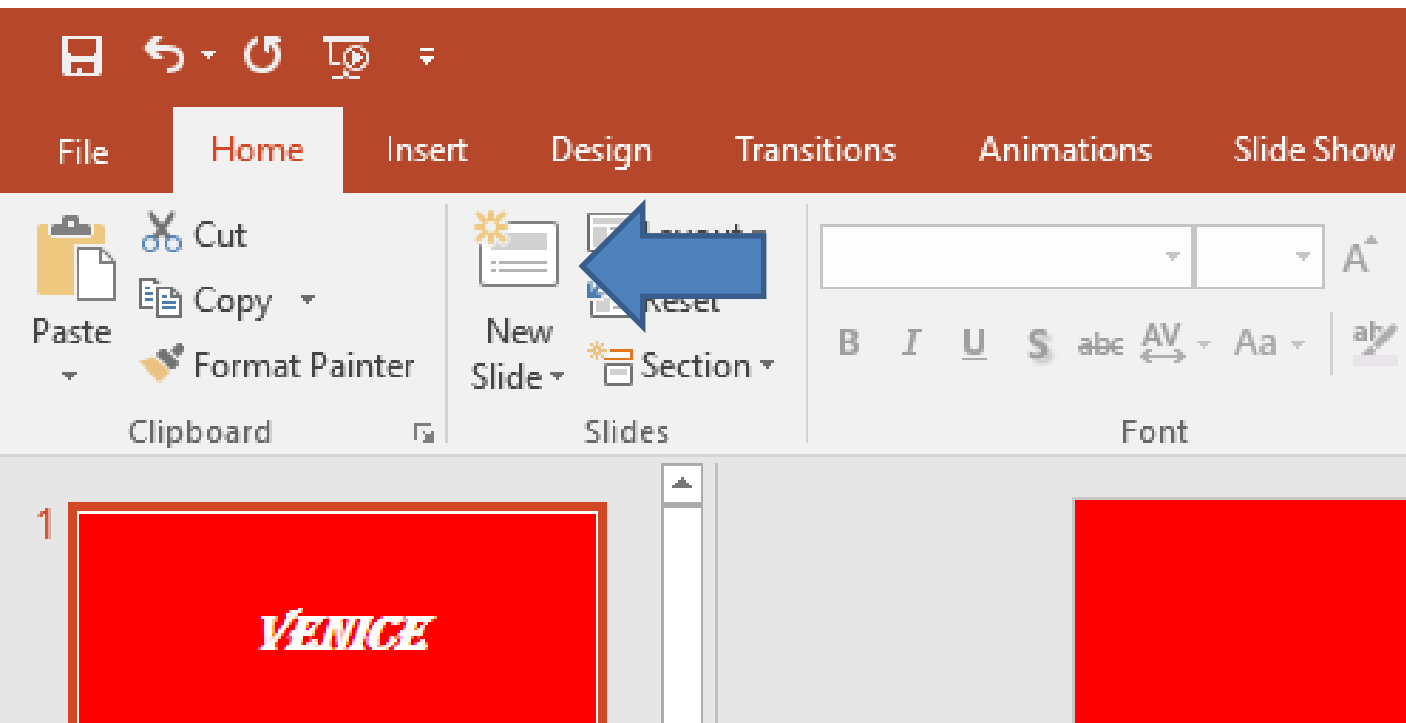

- **You can change the seconds played the same on each slide or change different on each slide.**
- **You can add Transitions similar to Movie Maker. You can Apply to all slides.**
- **You can add Animation similar to Movie Maker. You can't Apply to all slides, because it is like Text, etc. So you can do Animations on any slide you want.**
- **You can add videos and set them up to auto play. As I mentioned before you can Trim the Videos or change volume, like Mute.**
- **Next is more features.**

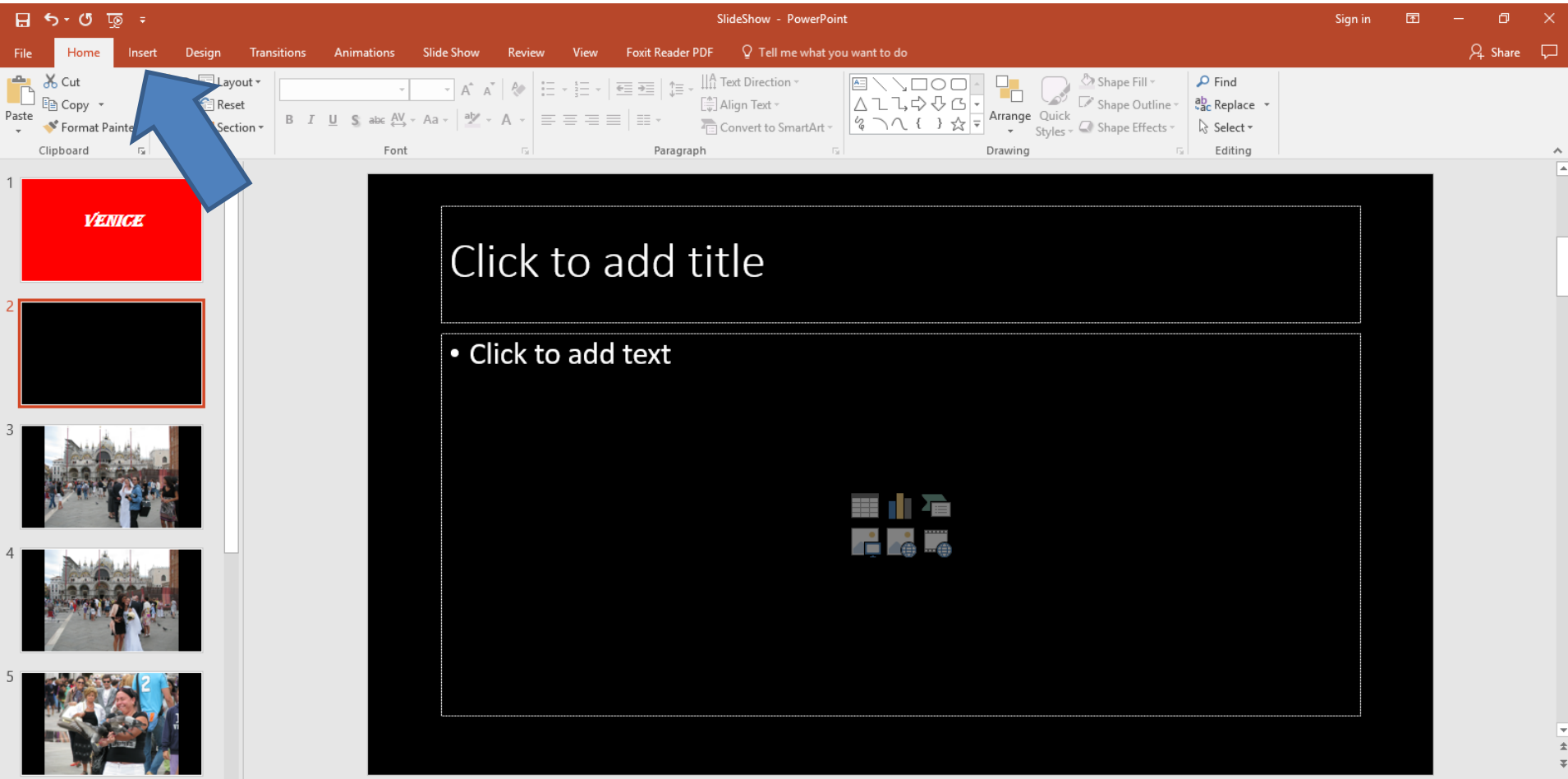
- **You can add music from your computer. Note - there are different sites that have free music. If you have a Google account, like Gmail, you can download free music from YouTube.**
- **You can add your own Voice.**
- **As I mentioned before, you can Trim the music, fade in and fade out, and change volume.**
- **You can add a Gif image from your computer or PowerPoint shows you from on-line.**
- **You can add Captions/Text on top of the Pictures, but you can't Apply to all, like Movie Maker does. Next is the last features.**

- **You can change the location of the Picture/Video by moving the slide.**
- **You can remove a Picture or Video by deleting a slide.**
- **As I mentioned before, once you are complete, you can save it as a Video.**
- **Once you have the Video, you can upload to YouTube, if you have a Google account.**
- **The other option is burn to a DVD. To do that in Windows 10, you have to download a free program, like DVD Styler.**
- **Next I will show you how to add a GIF image.**

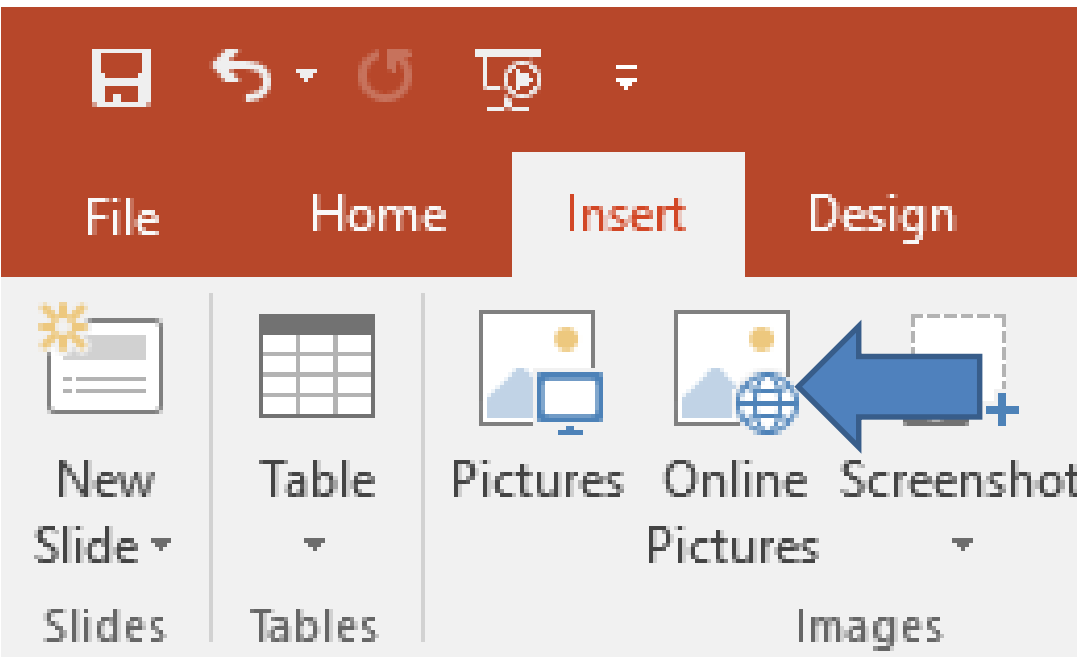
- You can add a new slide to add a GIF image on it. First click on Slide, like the first one and then click on New Slide in the upper left.
- Next is what happens.



- You see the New Slide. Click on Insert again like I showed you before.
- Next is how to find GIF image on-line.



- **Once you click on Insert, click on Online Pictures.**
- **Next is what happens and how to find GIF image on-line.**

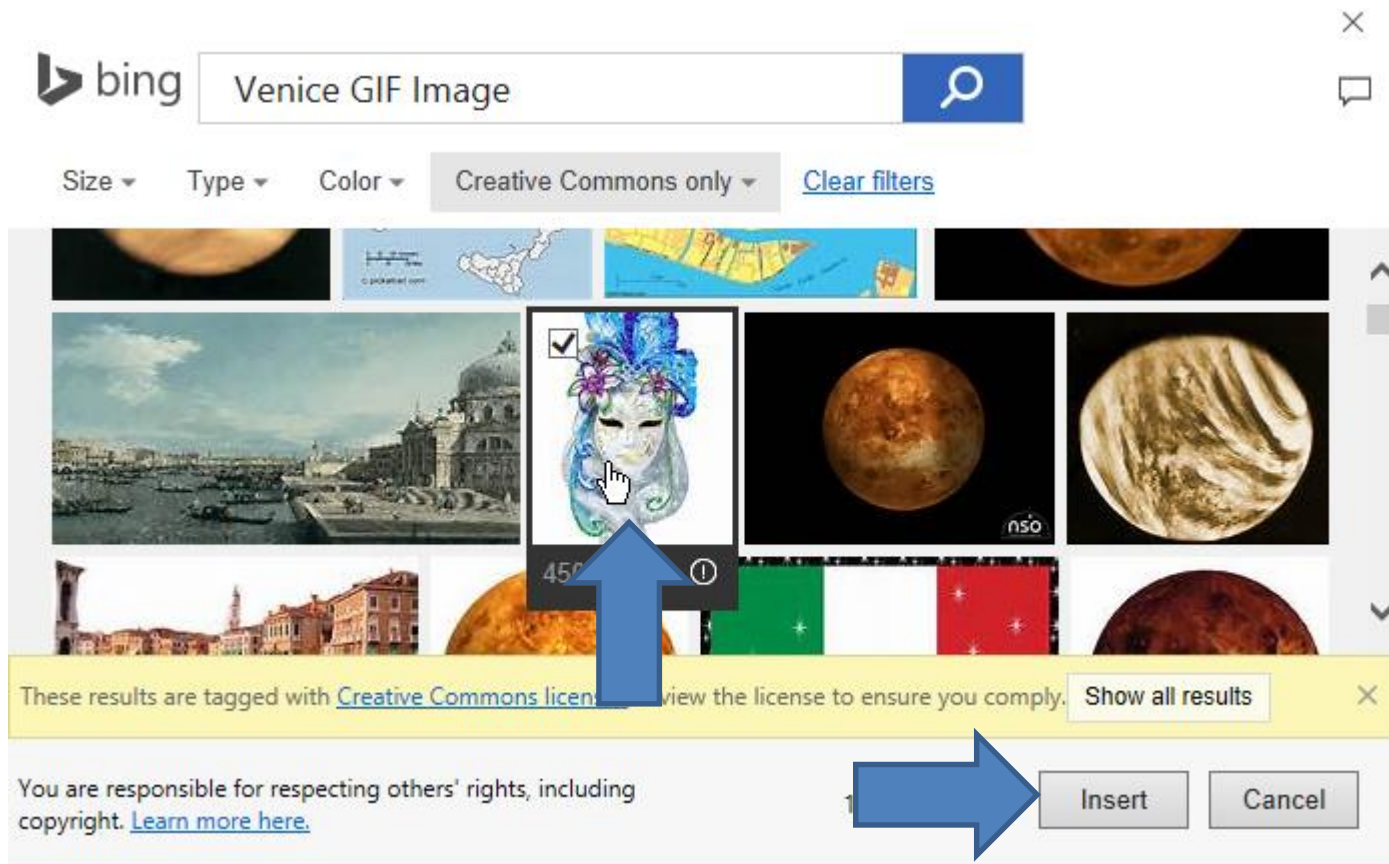


- A new window opens and you type in what you are looking for and then click on Enter Key and next is what happens.

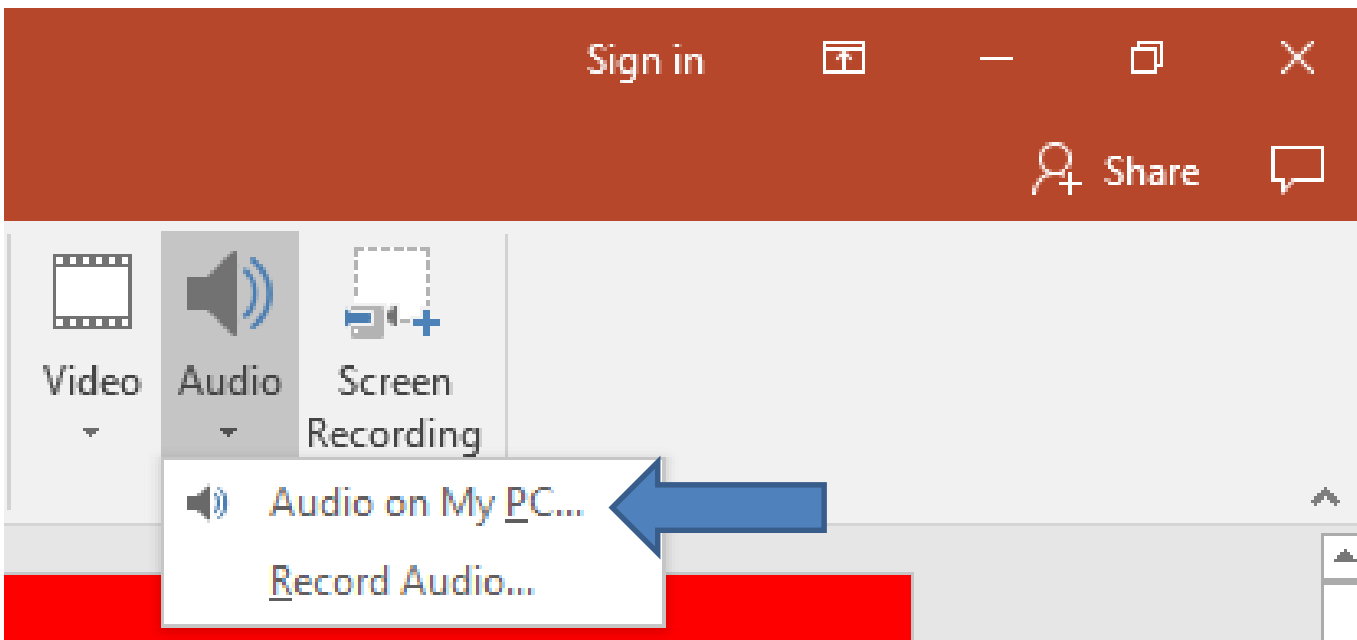

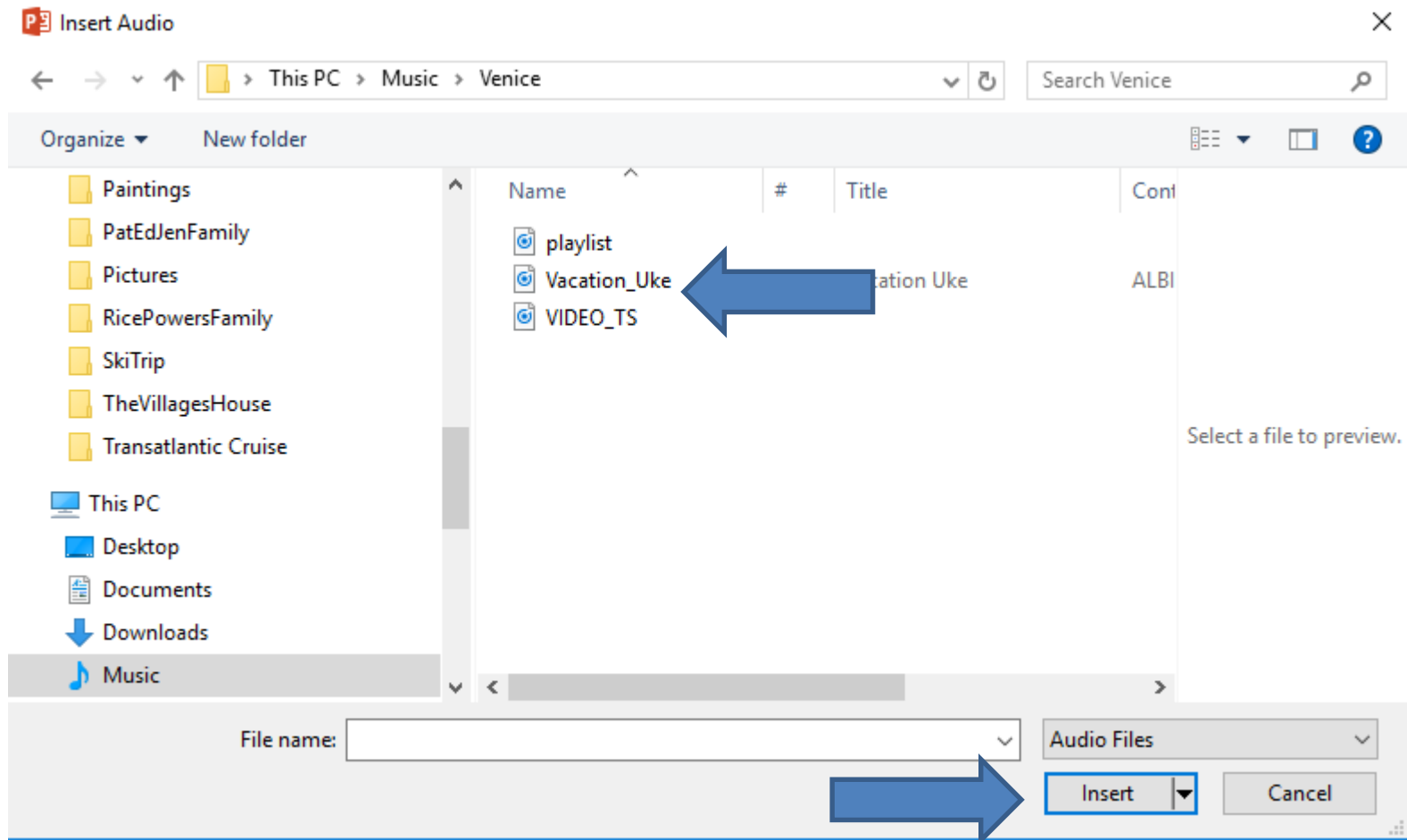
- **You then see it flashing, but not on this PDF file.**
- **Next is how to add Music. First click on the slide you want to add, like the first or second. The reason for second is if you add your own voice to the first, like I did.**



- **When you are in the Insert Tab, you see Audio in the right. When you click on it, you see a list and click on Audio on My PC.**
- **Next is what happens.**



- File explorer opens and find a folder with the music and then click on it and click on Insert.
- Next is what happens.

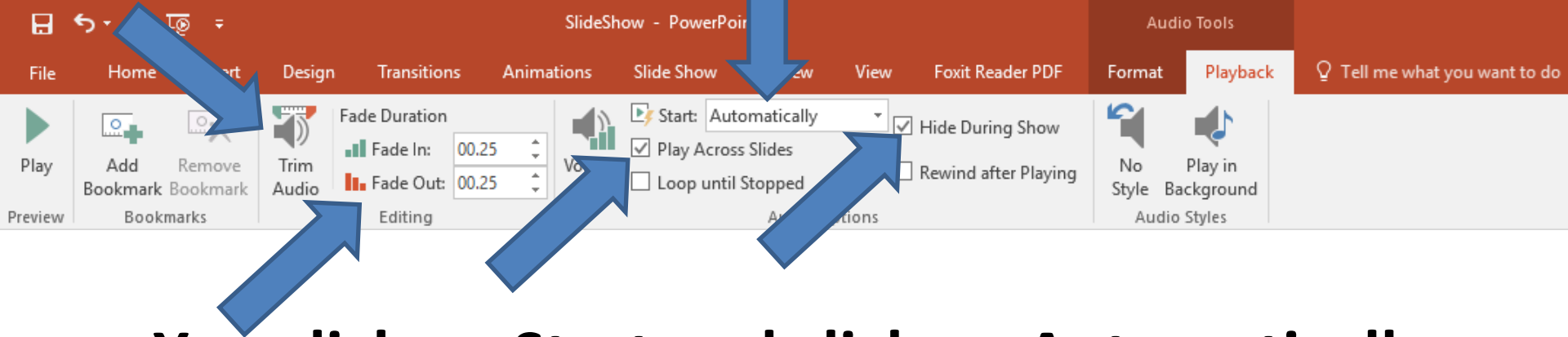


- You see it on the slide and you see Audio Tools.
- Next is changes to the Audio Tools.

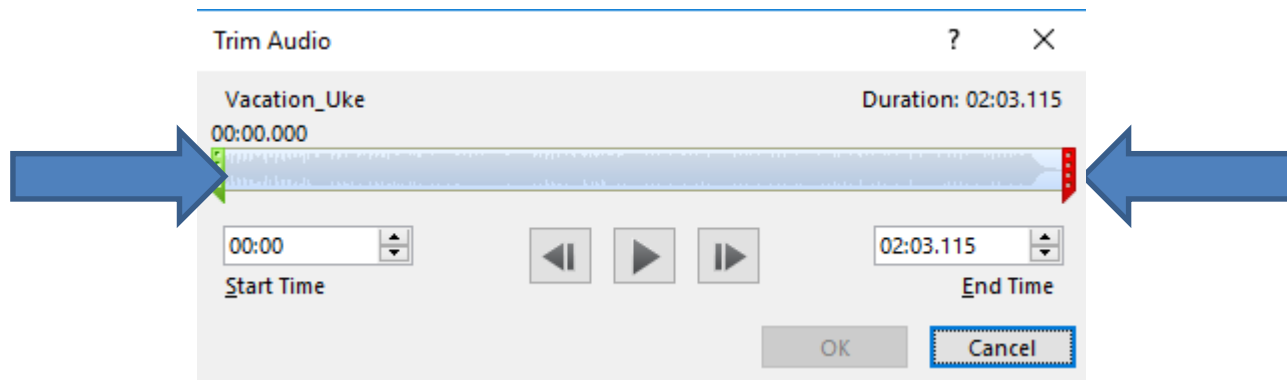
- Preview:** Play button.

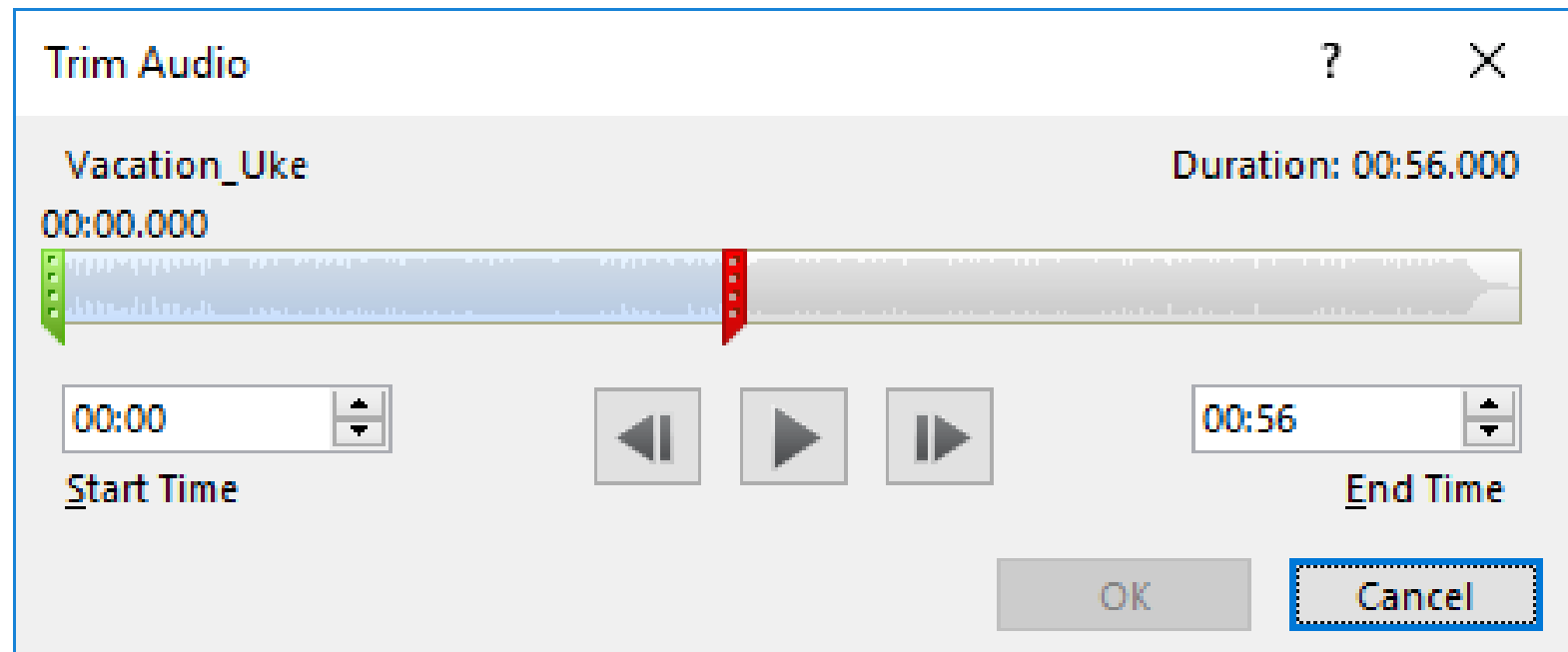
- **You click on Start and click on Automatically.**
- **Then check the box next to Play Across Slides.**
- **Then check the box next to Hide During Show, so the icon does not show.**
- **You then can do Fade In and Fade Out.**
- **You can also Trim Audio, which is next. The reason is that I added a Video at the end and it had Music.**

- **When you click on Trim Audio, a new window opens and you can click and hold the one on the right and drag it to the left. I did that, which is next.**
- **And/Or you can click and hold the one on the left and drag it to the right.**





- Here is a sample of just 56 seconds and then you click on OK. The reason is I added a video with Music at the end.
