

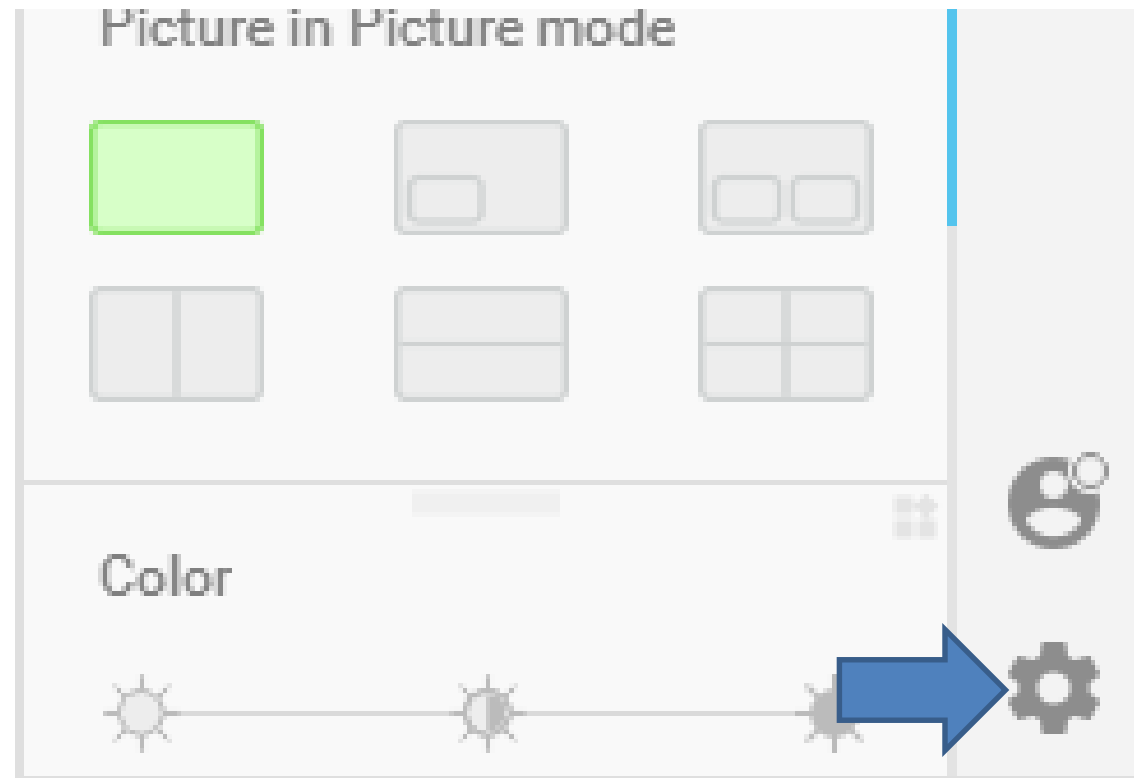
Step 6 – How to create a Video and Screenshot on ManyCam

- One reason for Manycam is you can create your own Christmas Movie, etc., with Effects.**
- You first open Manycam as I showed you in Step 1.**
- Next is a sample.**

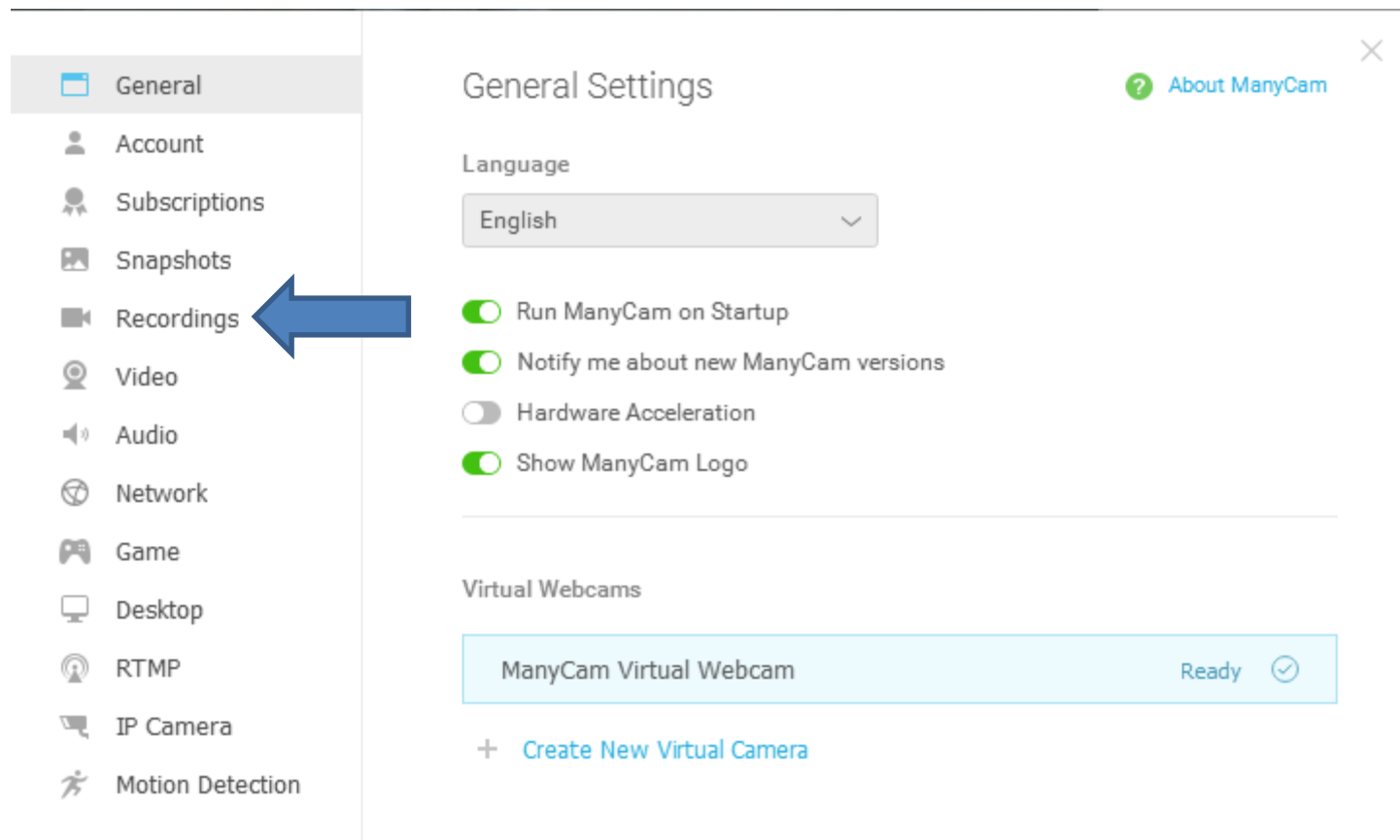
- You first click on the Settings Icon in the lower right.



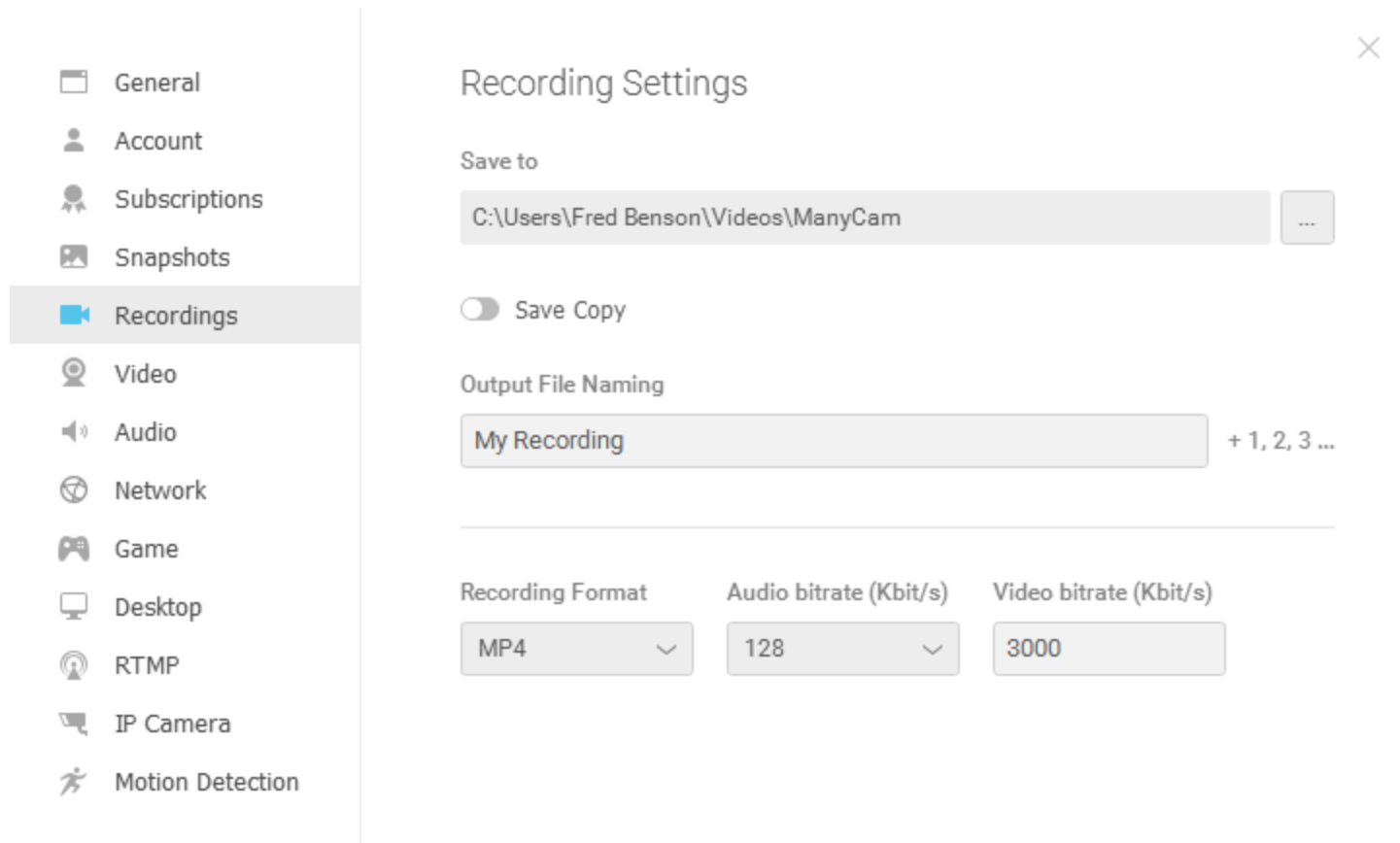
- First you have to click on the Settings  Icon in the lower right.
- Next is what happens.



- A new window opens and you click on Recordings in the left.
- Next is what happens.



- **Window changes to Recording Settings. You can change the folder to Save to. Note – I did it before, but I will show you how to change it next.**
- **You can make other changes that I will show you latter.**



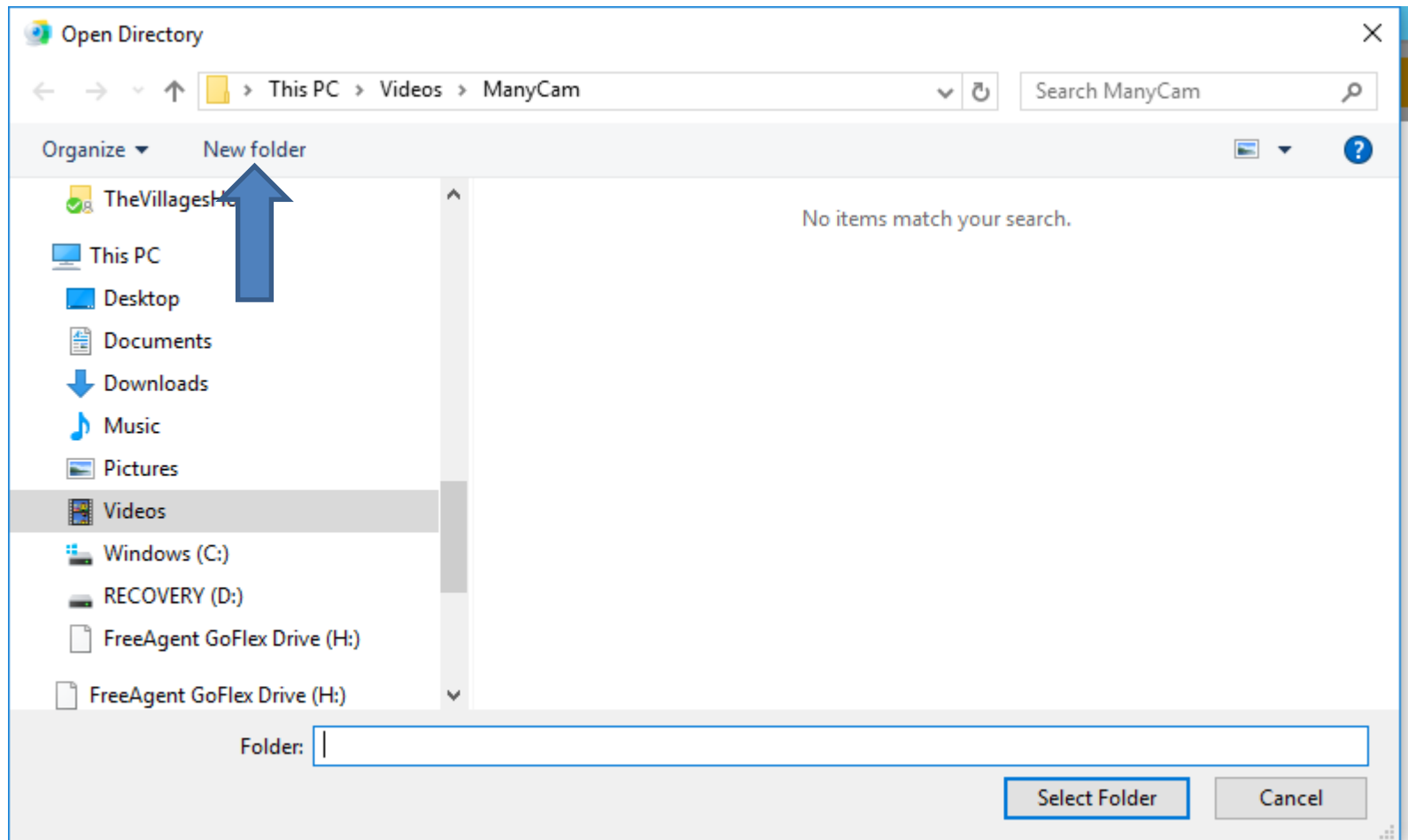


- To change the folder to Save to. Click on the Icon on the right and next is what happens.

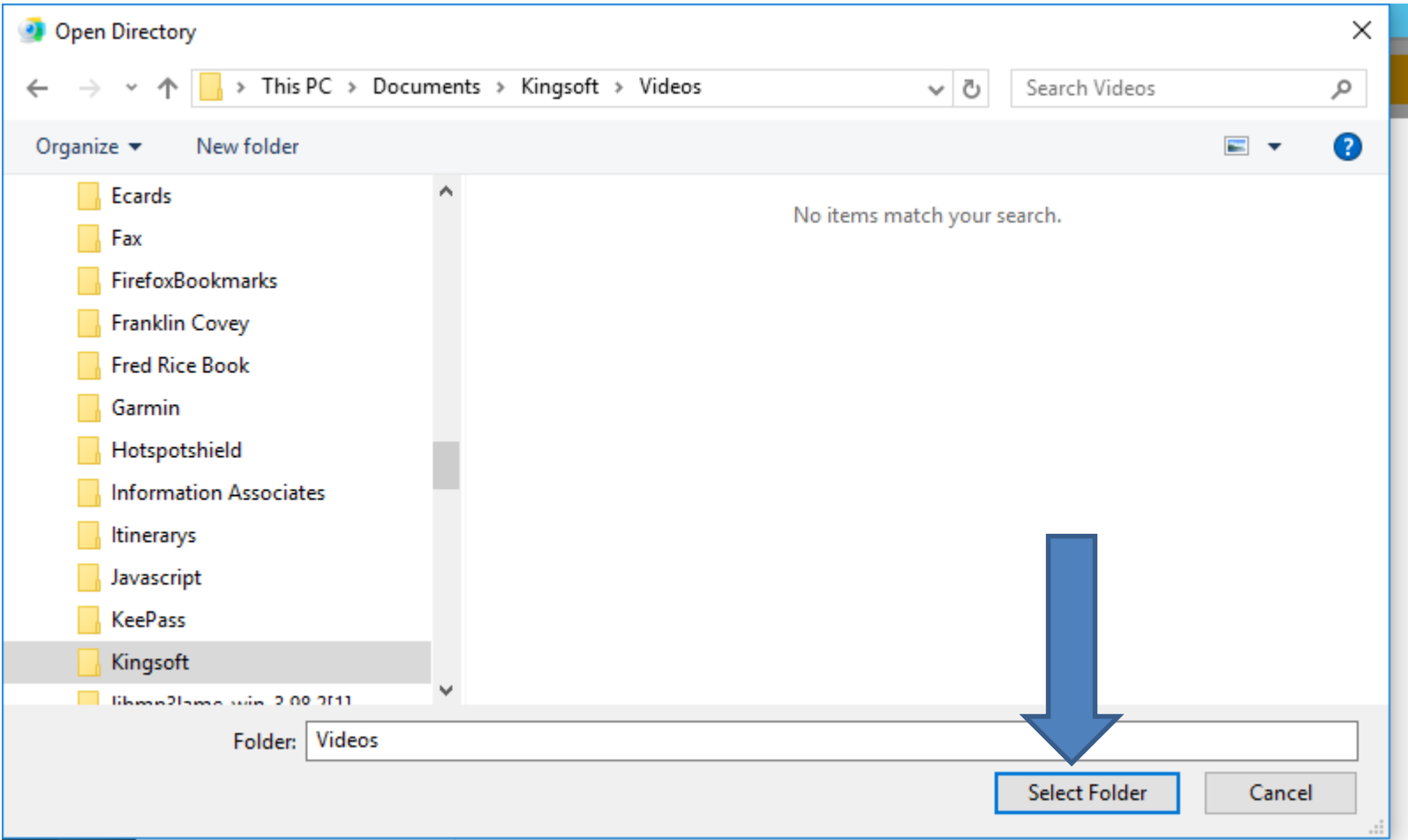

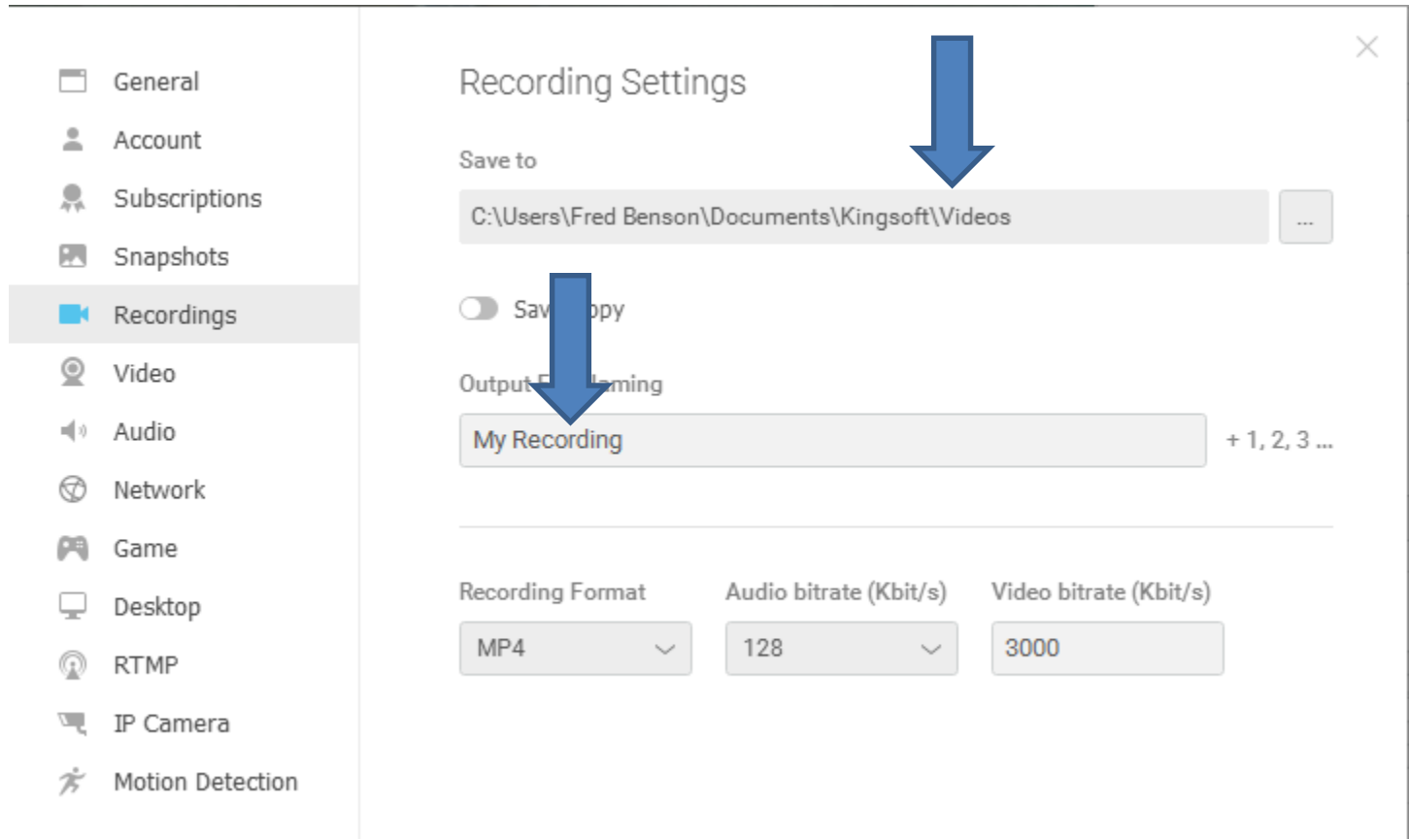
- **A new window opens, like File Explorer and you find the folder you want or add a New folder. Next is a sample of finding Kingsoft folder and Videos under it.**



- Here is a sample of finding Kingsoft folder and Videos under it. Once complete, click on Select Folder and next is what happens.



- **Window closes and you then see the new folder in Save to.**
- **You can change the Output File Naming. You highlight it and type in another name, like Christmas. Next is a sample.**



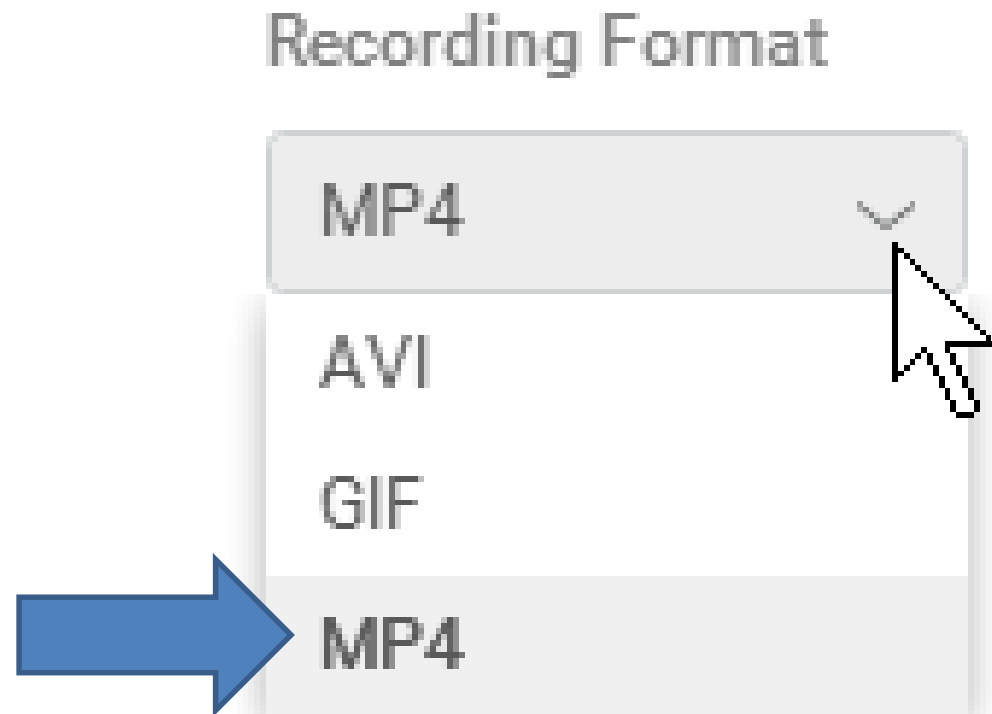
- Here is a sample.
- If the Recording Format shows MP4, I recommend you keep it. If it shows something else, you click on the dropdown and next is what happens.

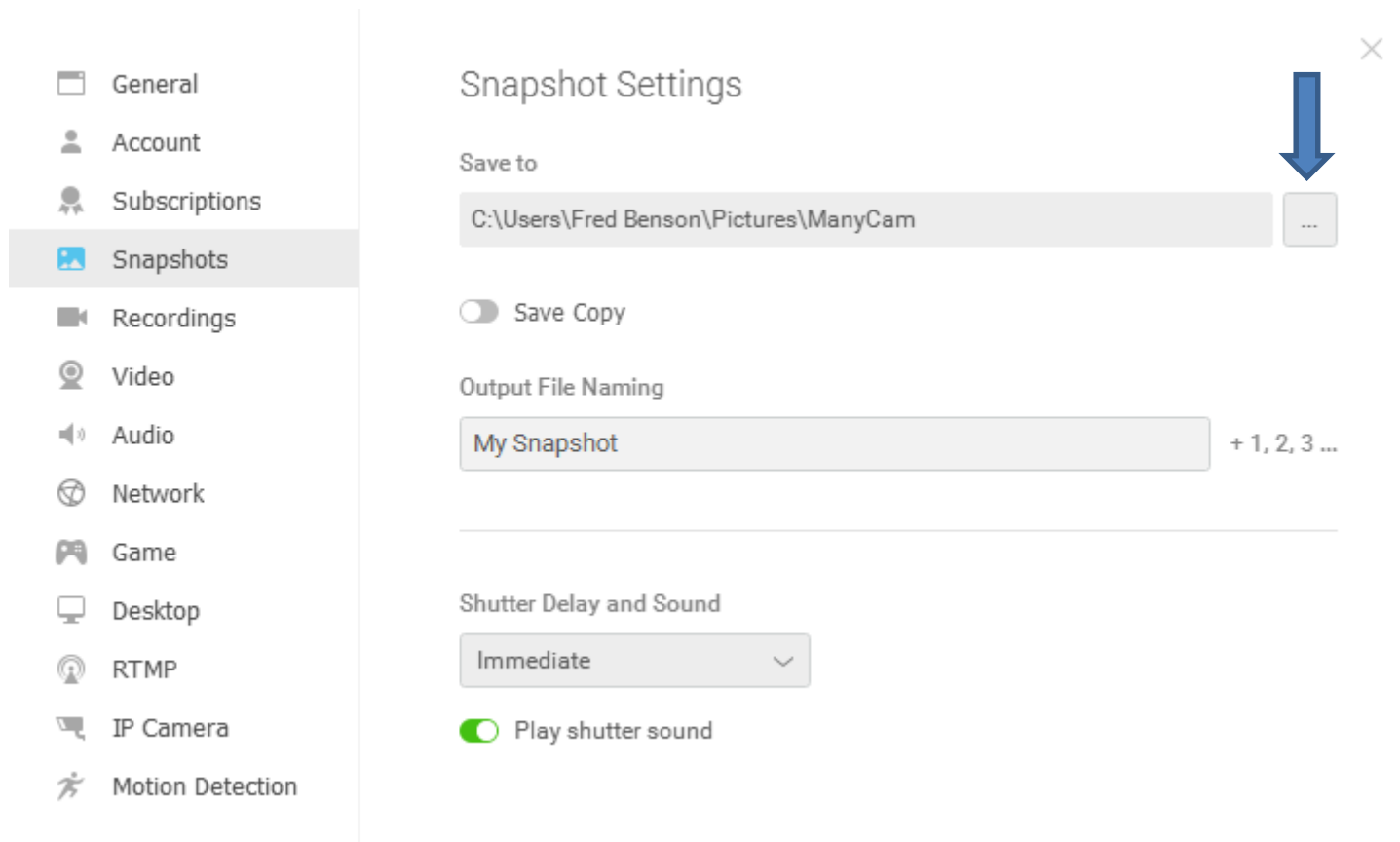

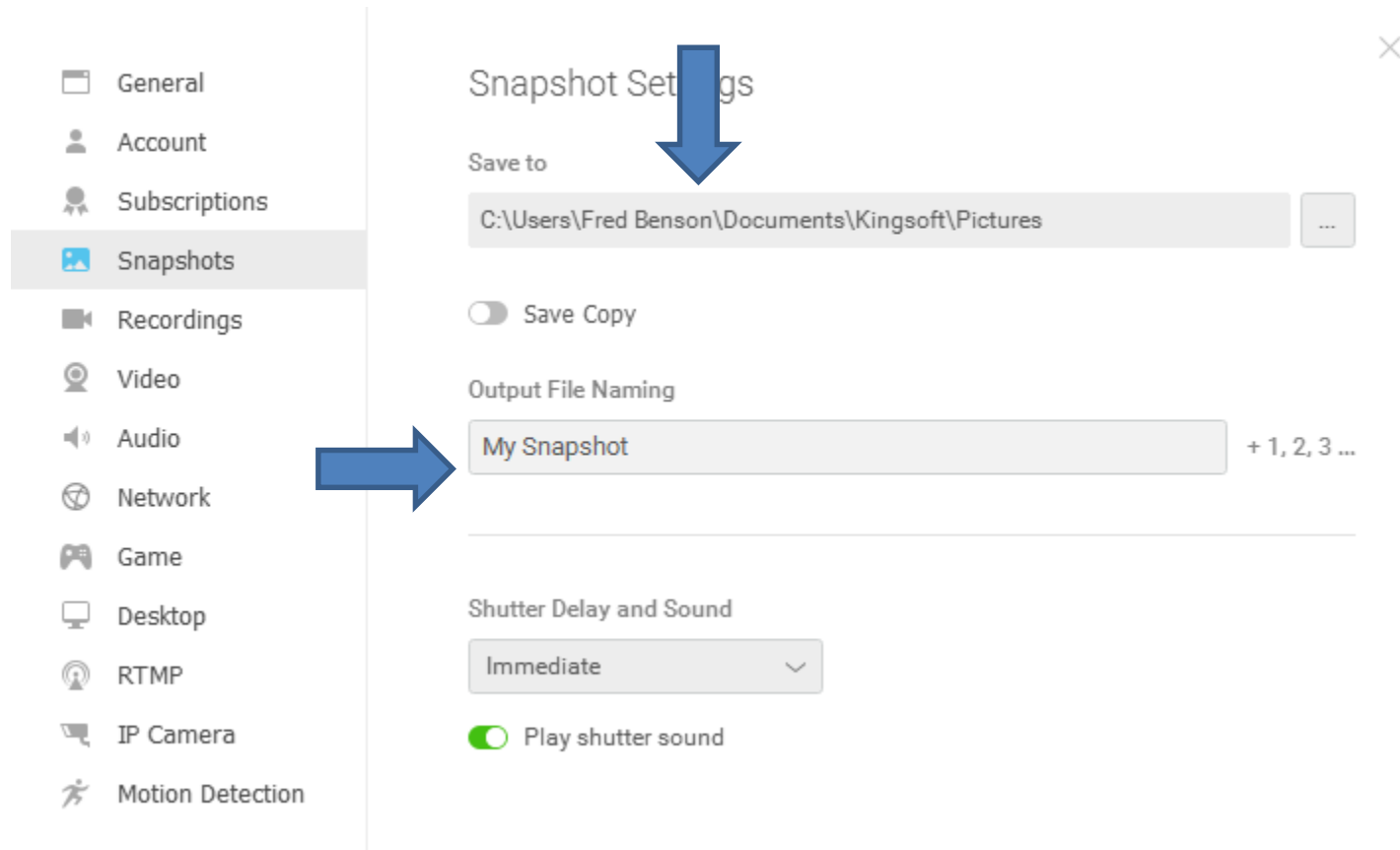

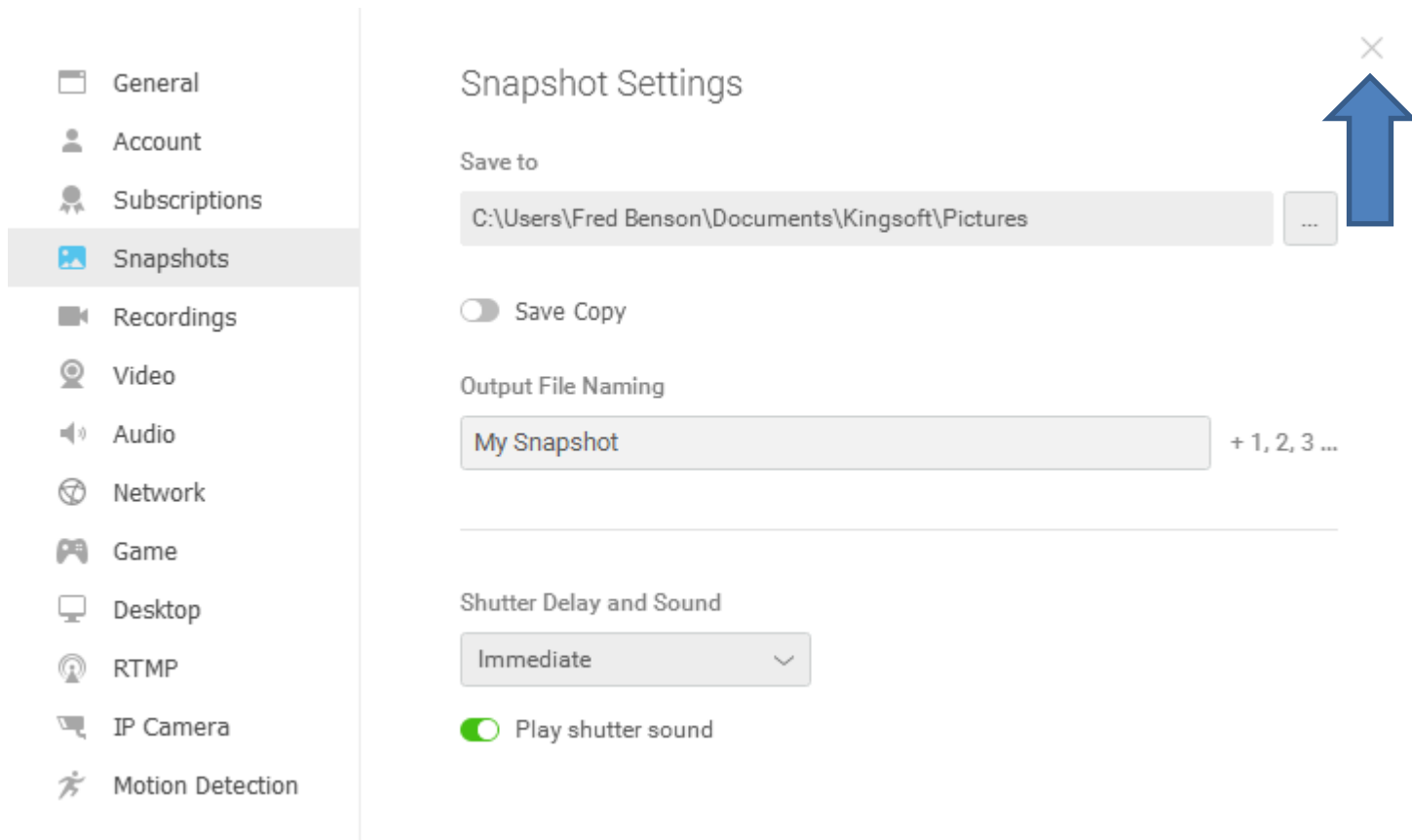
- It changes to Snapshot Settings.
- You follow the same process to Save to a different folder. Next is a sample of changing Save to folder.




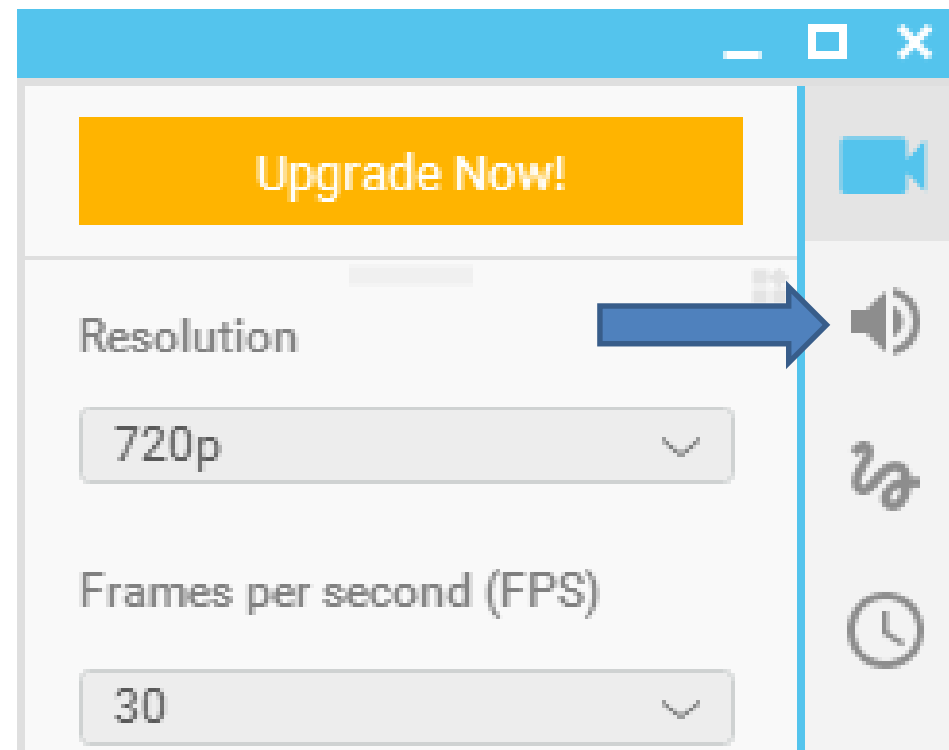
- Here is a sample of changing the Save to folder.
- You can also change the Output File Naming and follow the same process. I decided to just keep My Snapshot.
- Next is how to close and go Audio.



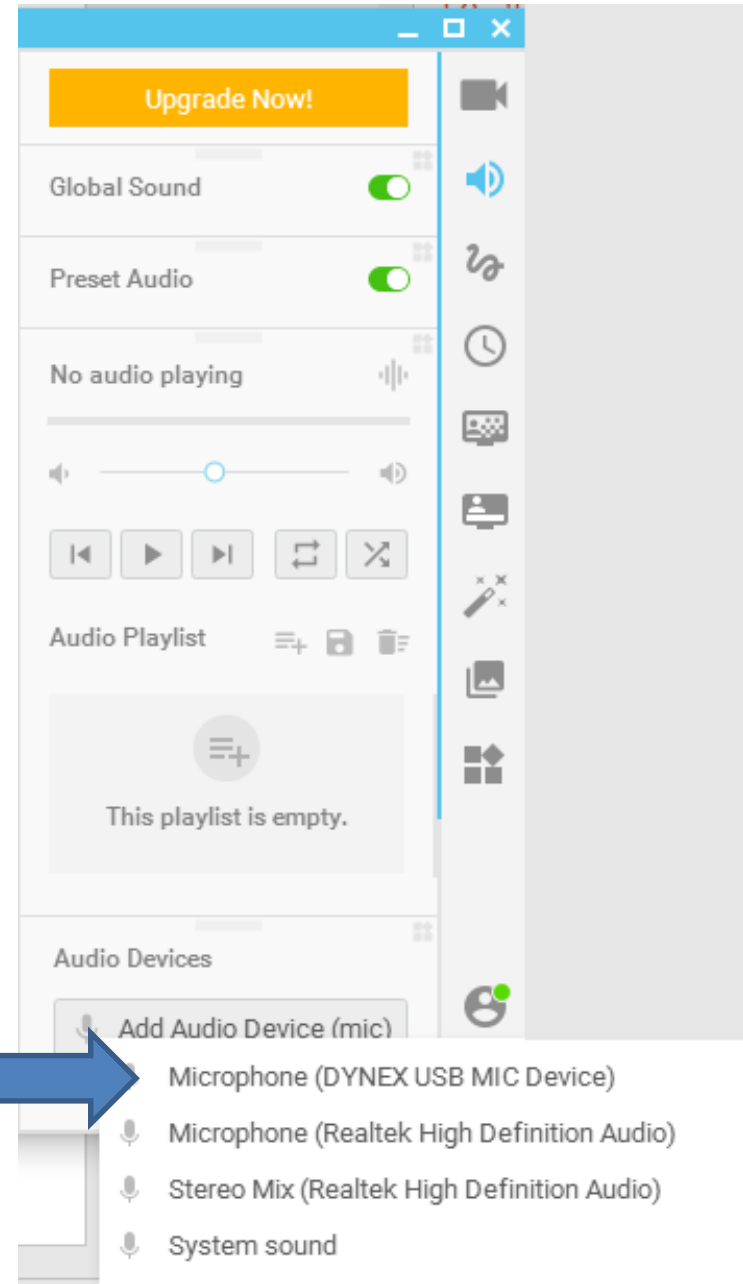
- Once complete, click on X in the upper right to close the Settings window.
- Next is Audio.



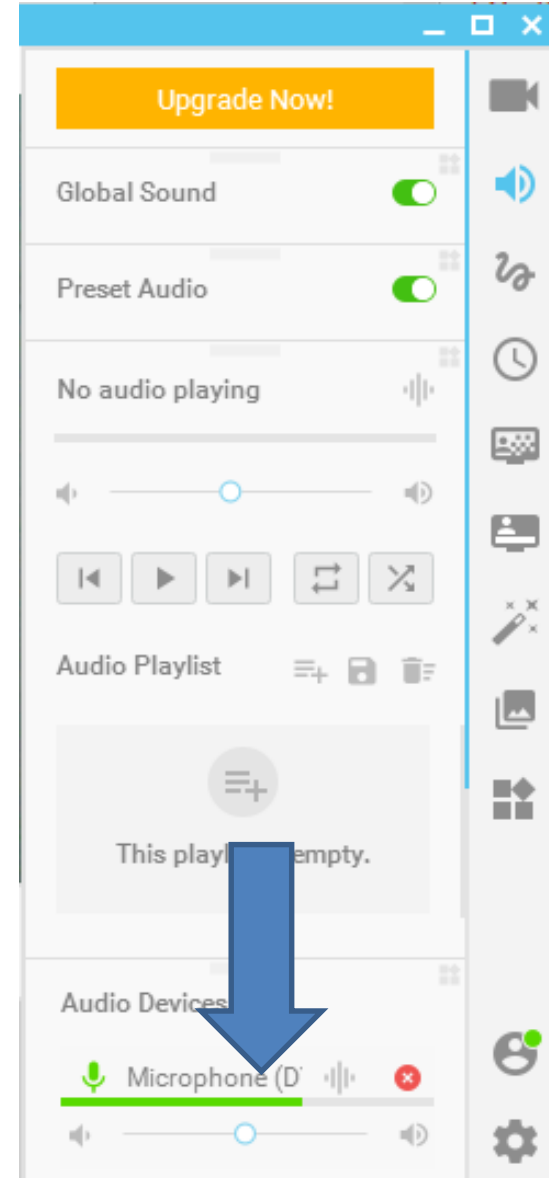
- When you click on X in the upper right the Settings window closes.
- In the upper right, click on the Audio Icon  .
- Next is what happens.




- You then see a list.
- You then click on below the Audio Devices and you see a list.
- If you have Microphone plugged in to your computer, you see it and click on it.
- If you don't have Microphone, I recommended you buy one, because it is better to record.
- Once you do that, next is how to practice voice.



- Once you click on one and the start practice your voice, you will see it working. If it does not work, you have to select another one and practice again.
- Once it works, you then can record the video with your voice/song.
- Next is how to record.



- **I recommend you add some effects or Text before you record as I showed you in Step 2 – Part A and Part B. The reason is that it is not easy to add other effects from a different type when you record. I decided to add Text.**
- **Next is how to record with you voice/song and how to stop when you are finished.**

You click on the Record Icon  on below to start recording. Once you are complete, click on the Record Icon again to stop recording. Next explains what happens.

- **Once you stop recording it saves the video to the folder in the Settings Save to as I showed you before.**
- **You then open the video on your computer or you can add the video to Kingsoft Presentation and/or Movie Maker as I did.**
- **Next is how to Screenshot.**

- To do a Screenshot, you click on  Screenshot Icon and next is what happens.



- **It saves it as a Picture in the folder in the Settings Save to as I showed you in Snapshots Settings.**
- **You then can print the Picture or add the Picture to Kingsoft Presentation and/or Movie Maker as I did.**
- **This is the End of Step 6.**
