

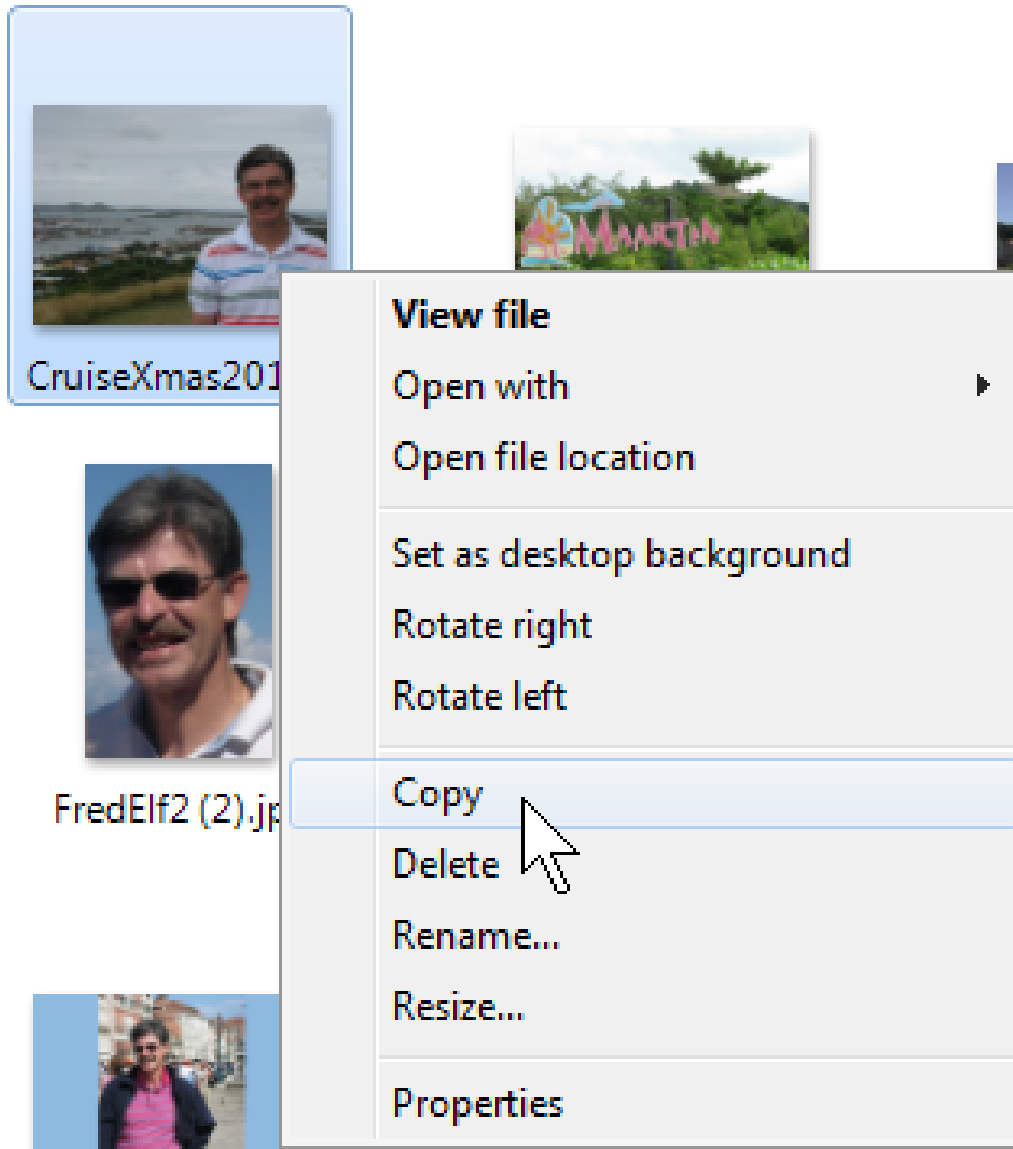
Step 6 – Part A – Fix Redeye

- **Note – you can't edit videos on Photo Gallery, but you can edit videos in Movie Maker.**

- **Before you Resize, Change Effect, Crop, I recommend you create a Copy of the photo.**

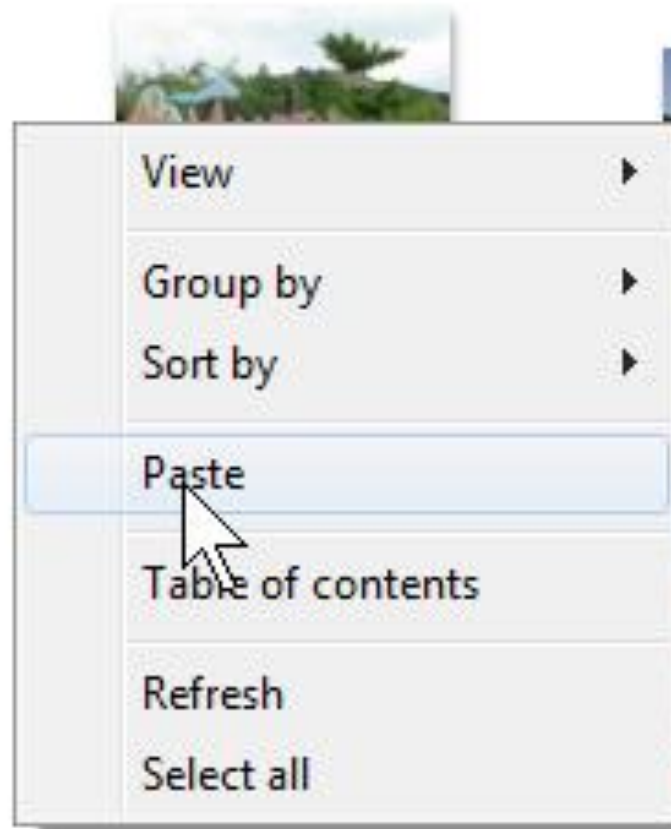


- Right Click on the Photo and then click on Copy.

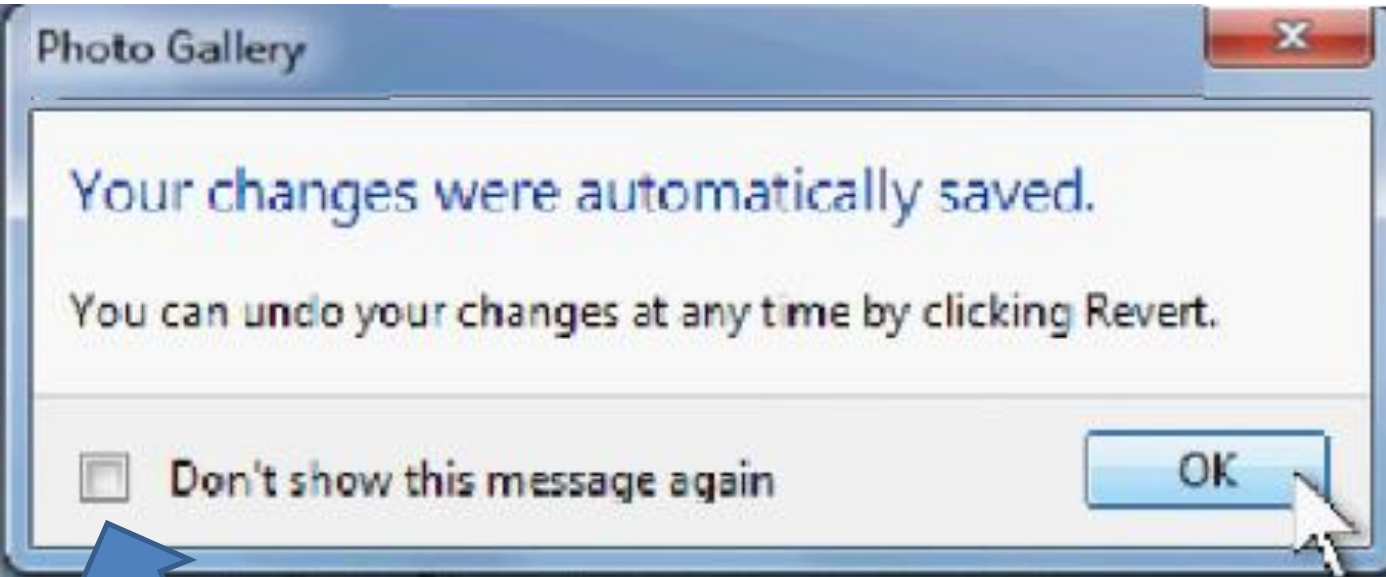
Is Blue correct?

- **Most often it does the correct color. It depends on how much Red is over the eye.**
- **Next is how to Close and save.**

Once fixed, click on Close file

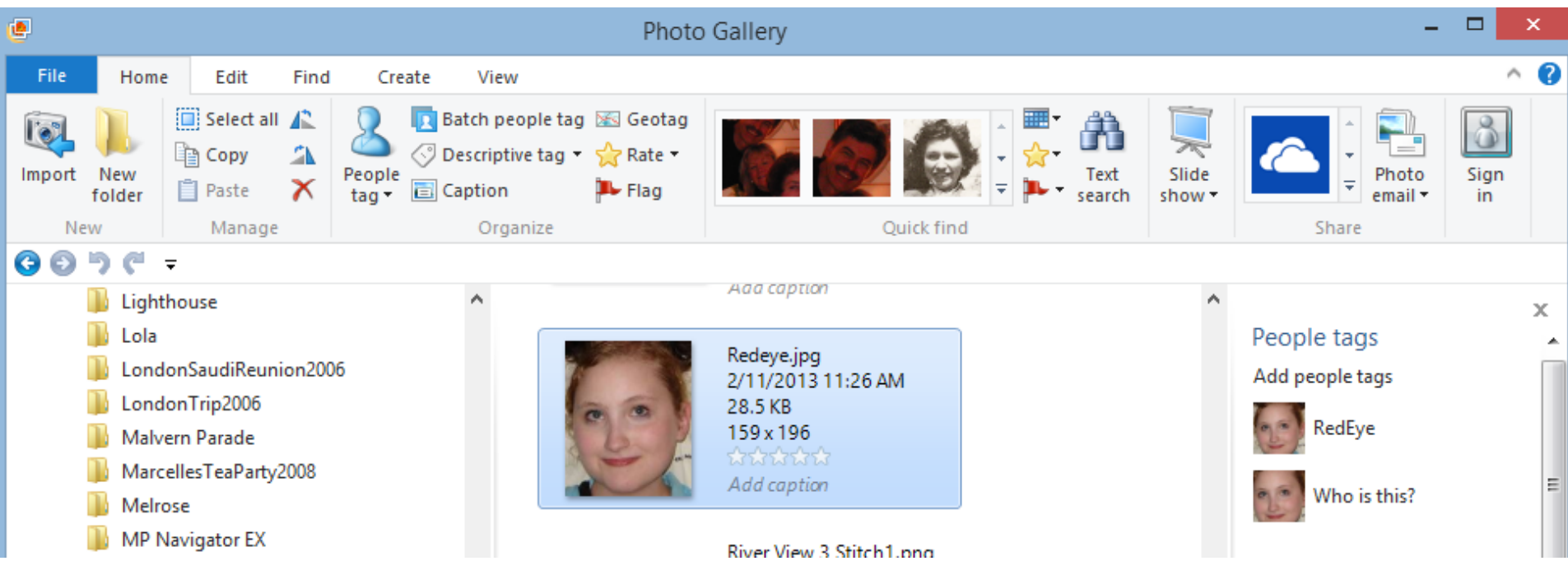
You see a new window



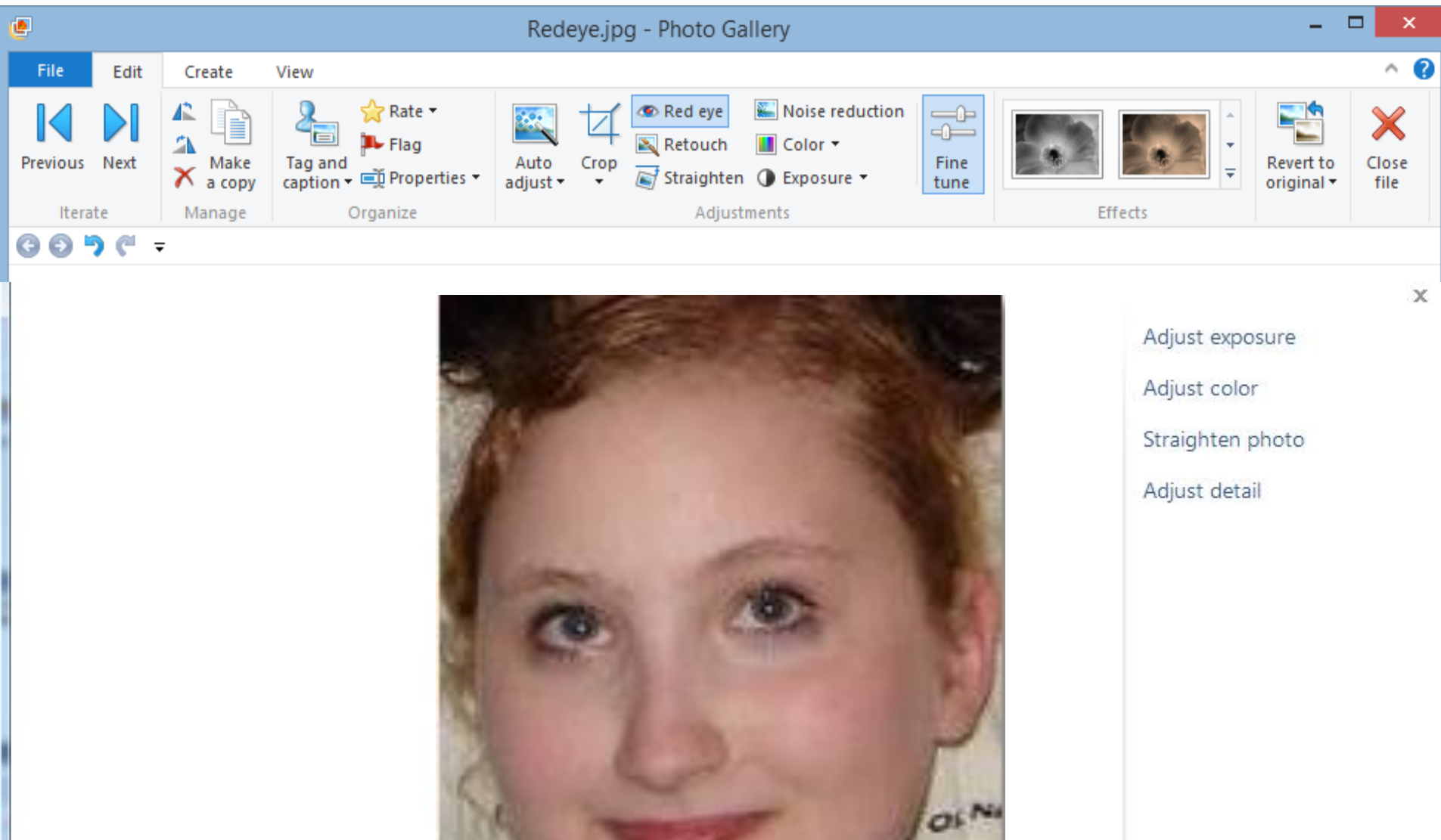
You can click on Don't show this message again. Then click OK.

It goes back to Home Page

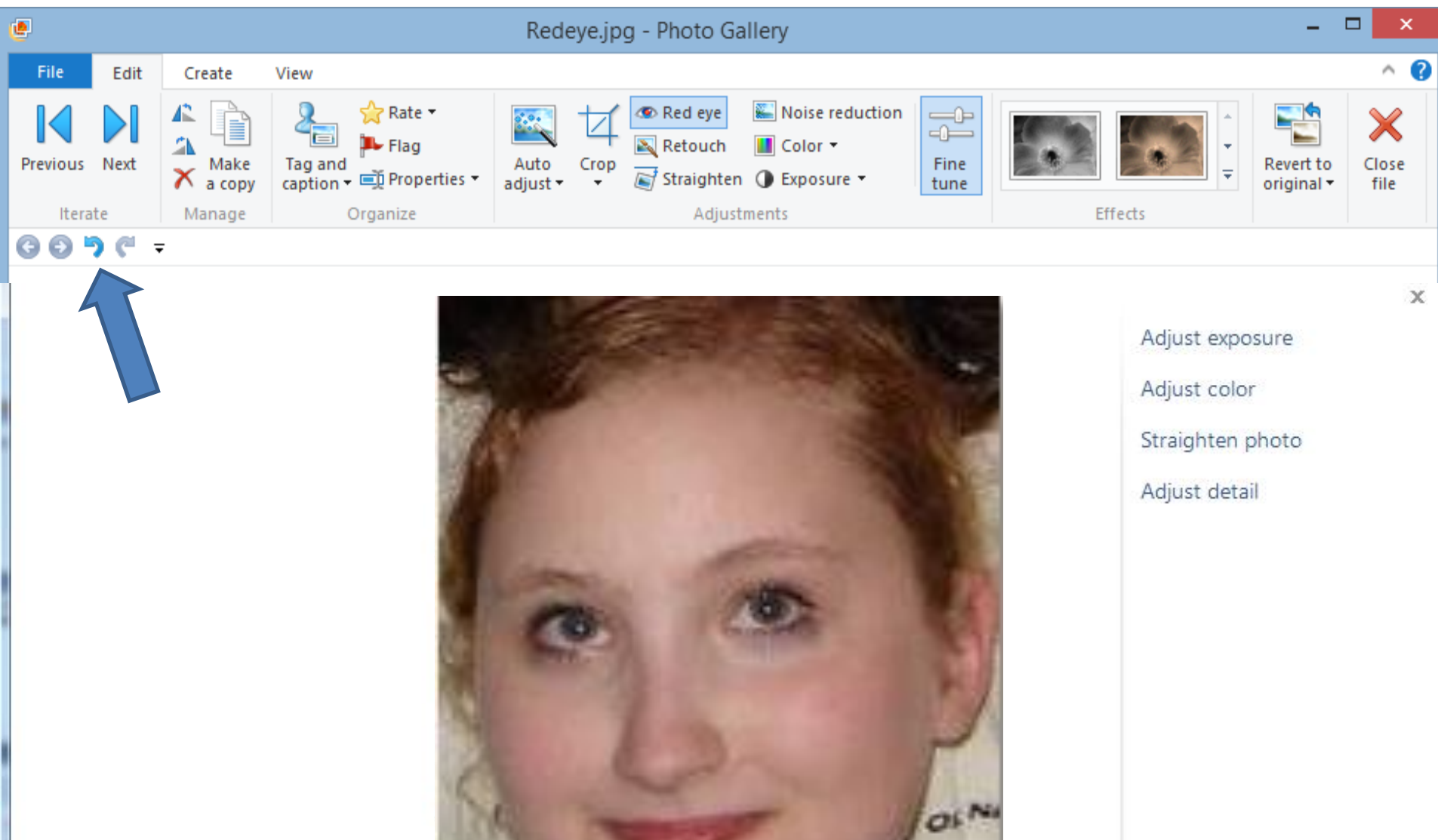
- Next, I am going to show you Undo, Redo, and Revert to Original.



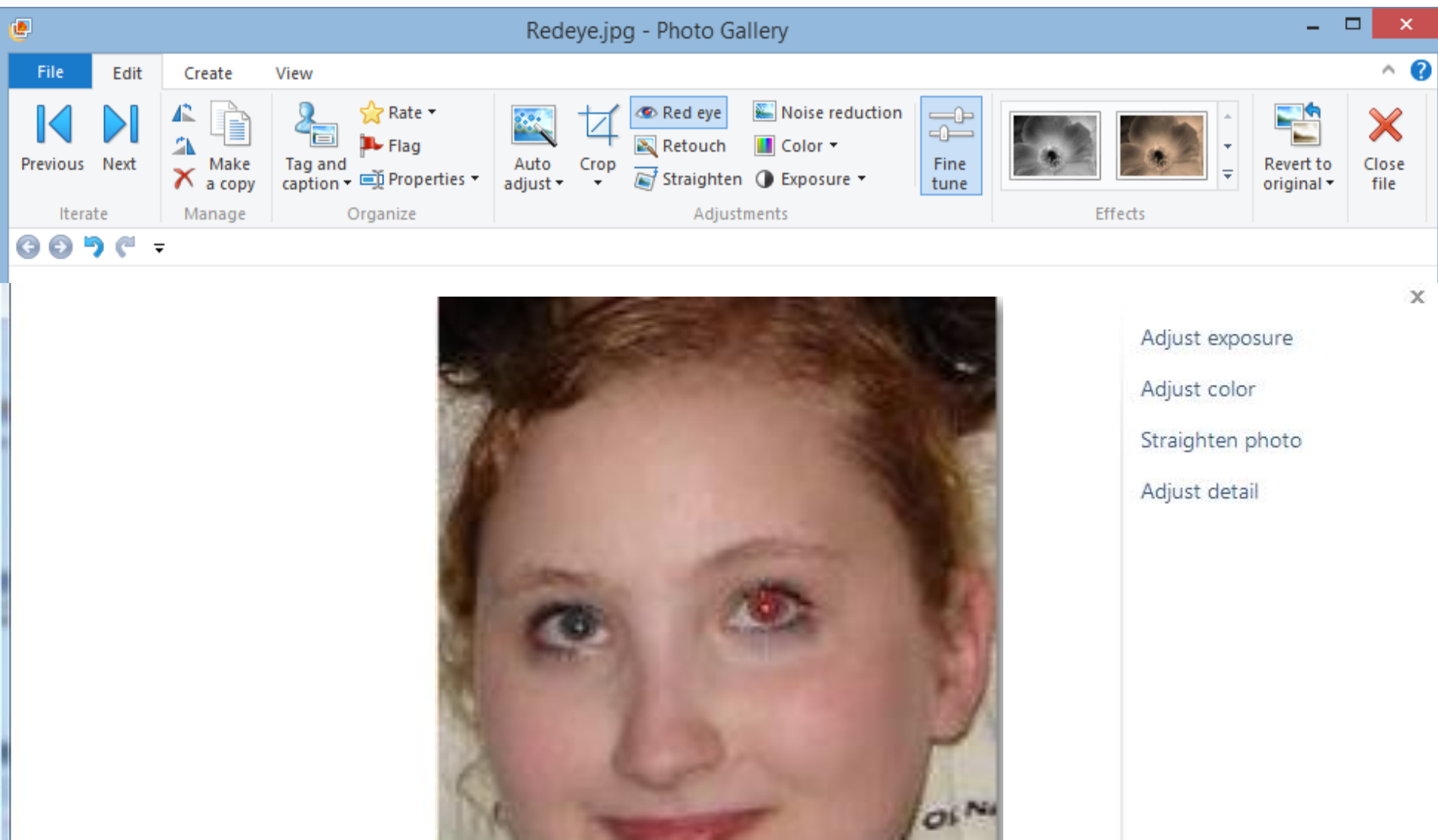
Undo, Redo, Revert to Original



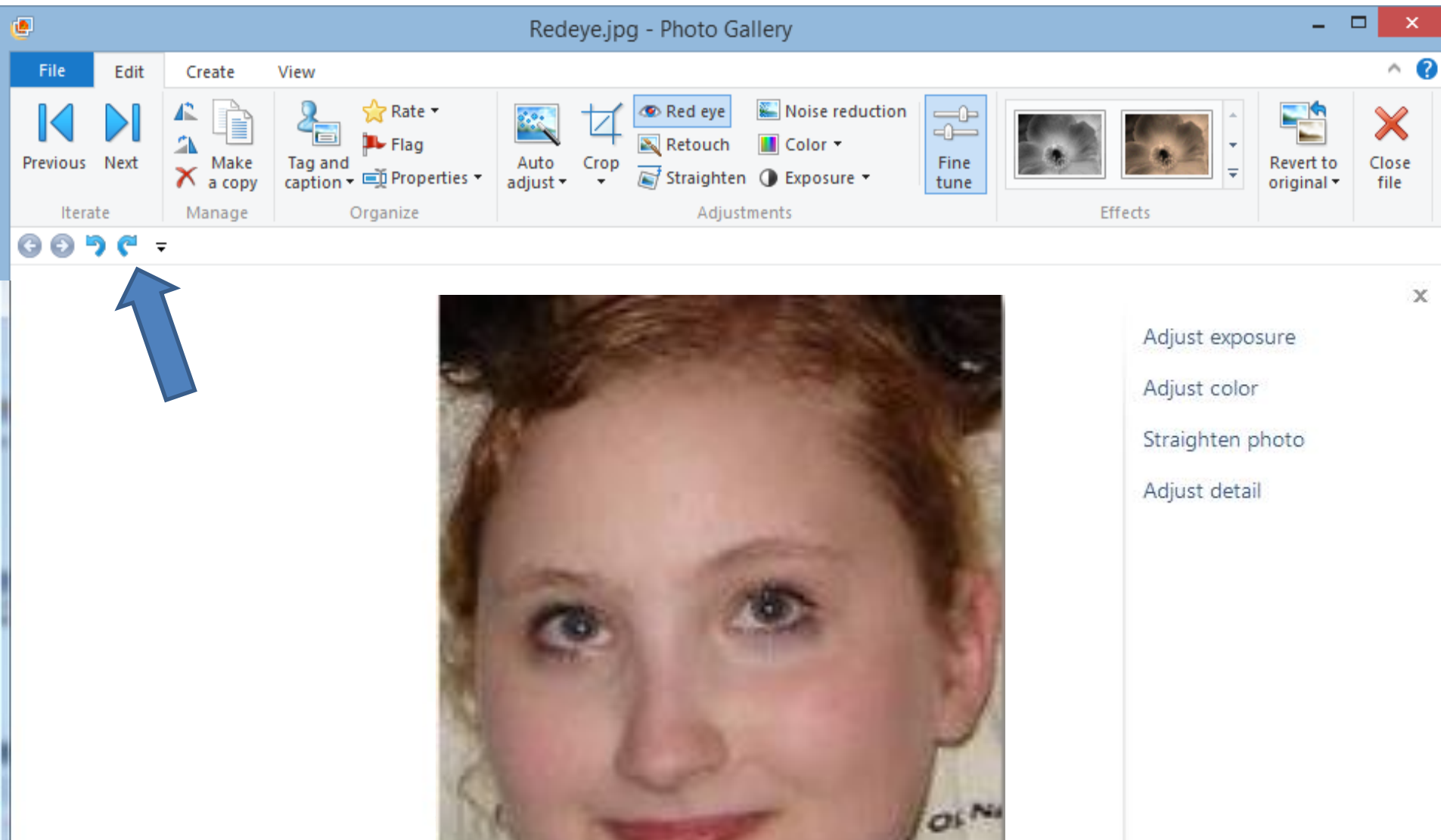
Click on Undo in the upper left



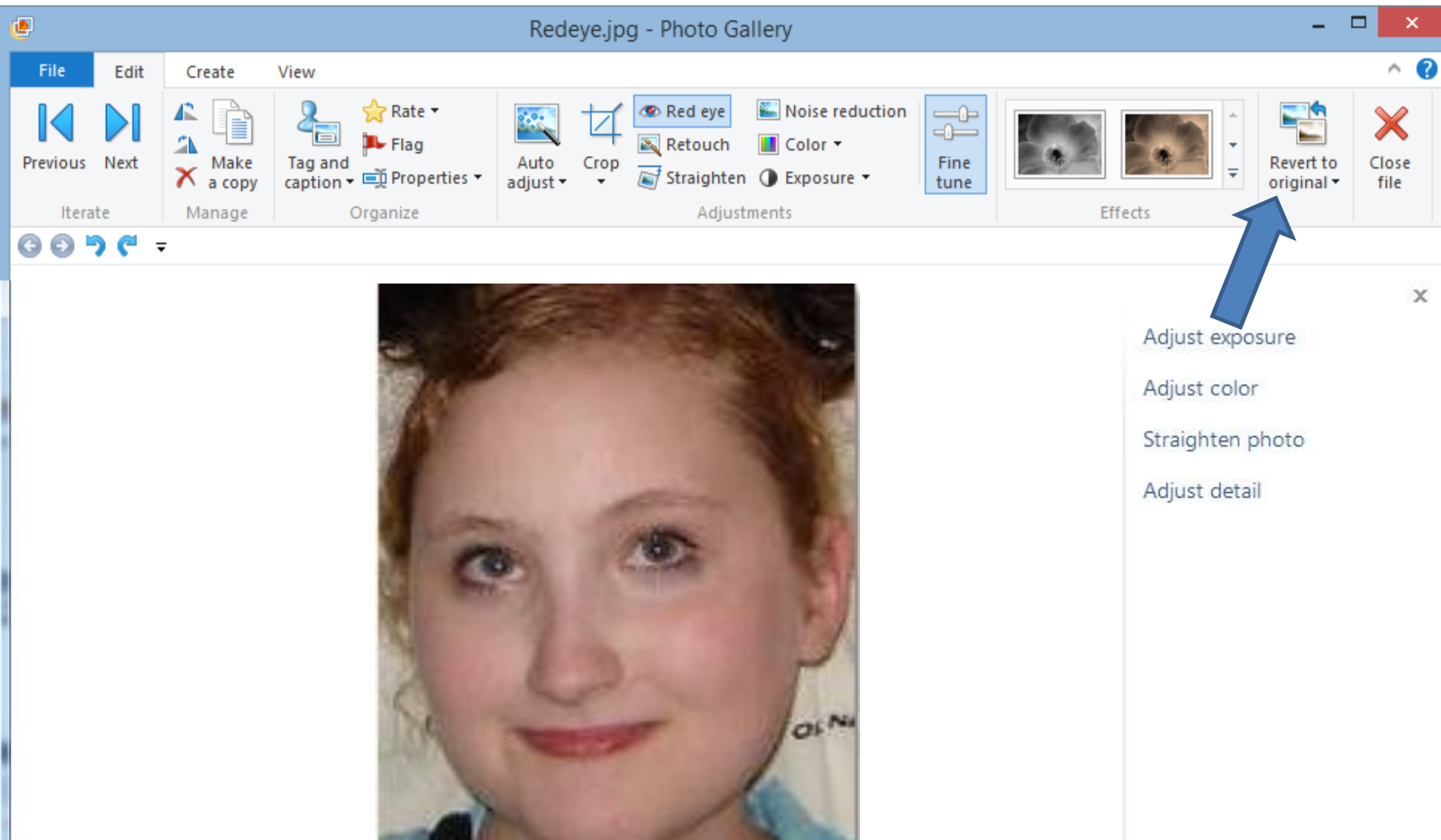
You see that one eye goes back to Red



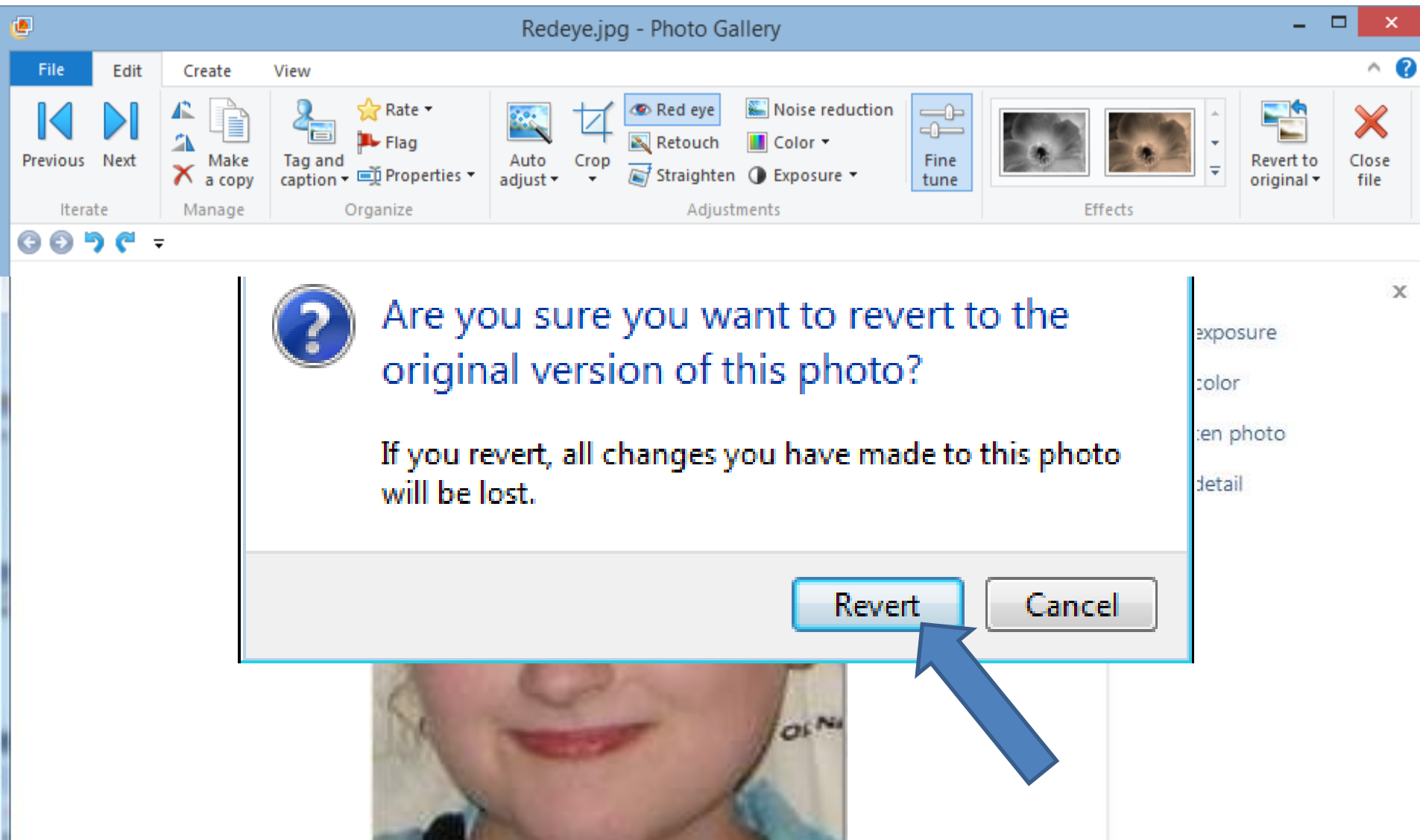
When you click on Redo, it goes back to blue.



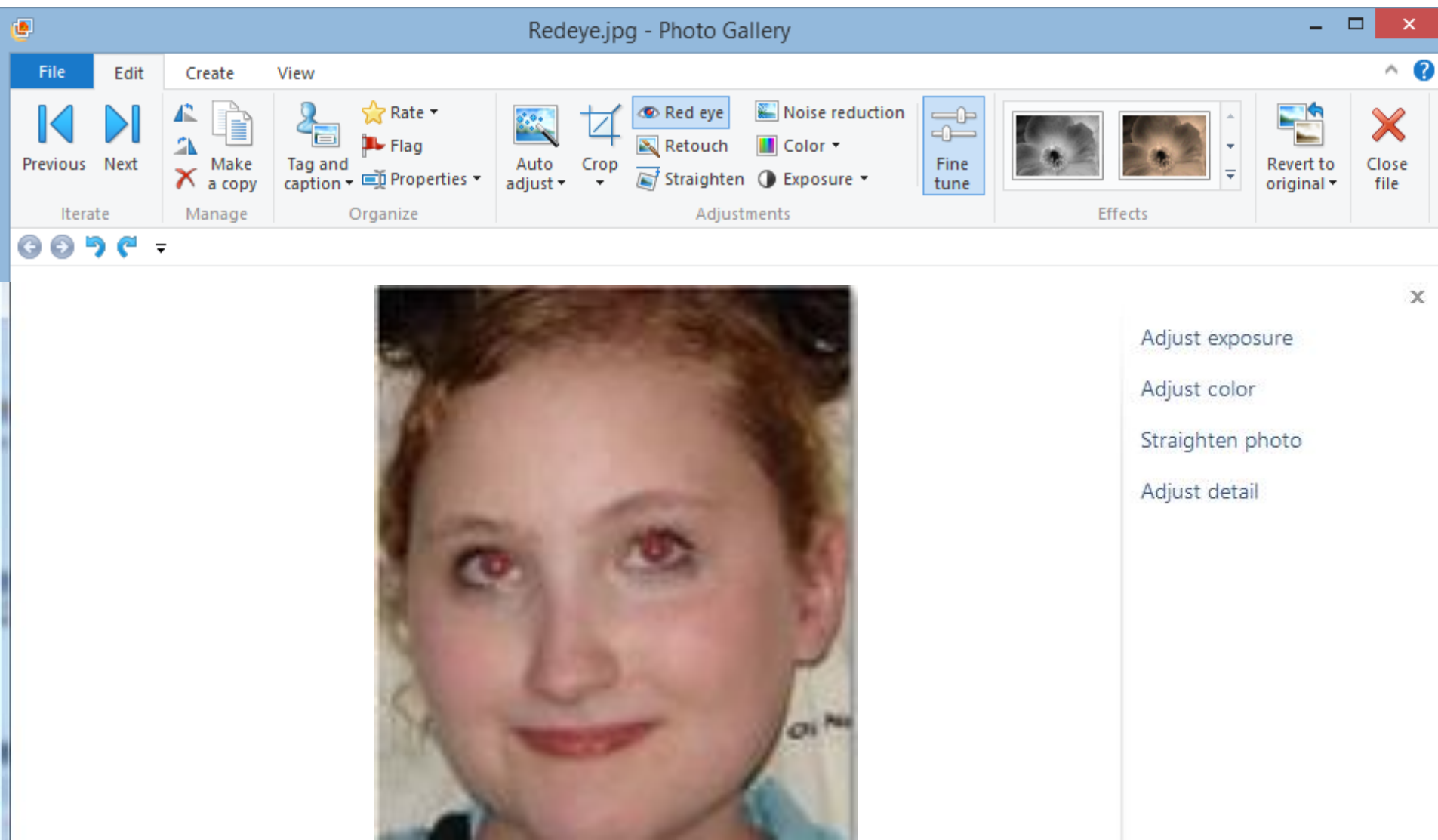
When you click Revert to Original in the upper Right



A new window opens and you click on Revert



It then goes back to original



Revert to Original on Home Page.

- If you are the home page, click on the Photo to highlight it.**
- Then press the Ctrl Key and click on R, the new window opens that I showed you and click on Revert.**
- Note – If you only make changes with Photo Gallery and do Revert to Original, it always go back to the Original. If you use another program to make a change, Revert to Original will not work.**
