

Step 6 - Part C – Retouch

What is Retouch?

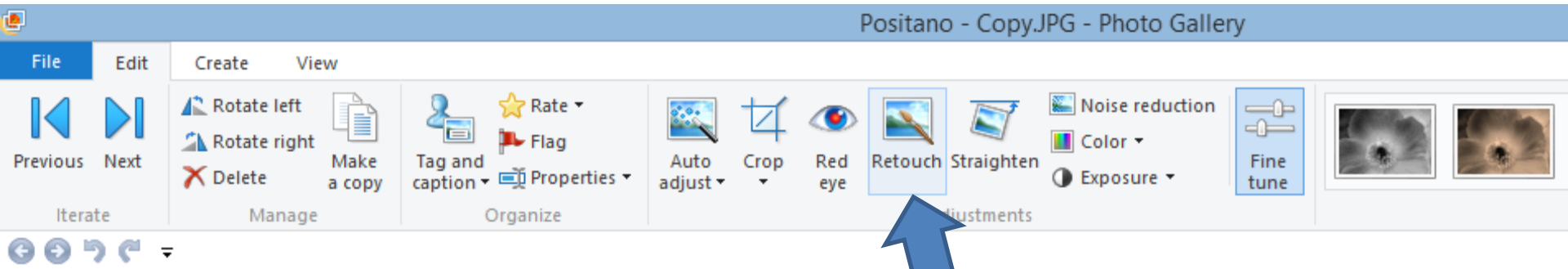
- Retouch can remove a small portion of a photo.
- It all depends on the background of the portion you want to remove.
- For example, if the background is lake/ocean, and you want to remove boat, it works. I will be showing you that.
- Also, you have something on you face you want to remove, it can work, depending on where it is. I will be showing you that also.

Step 6 - Part C – Retouch

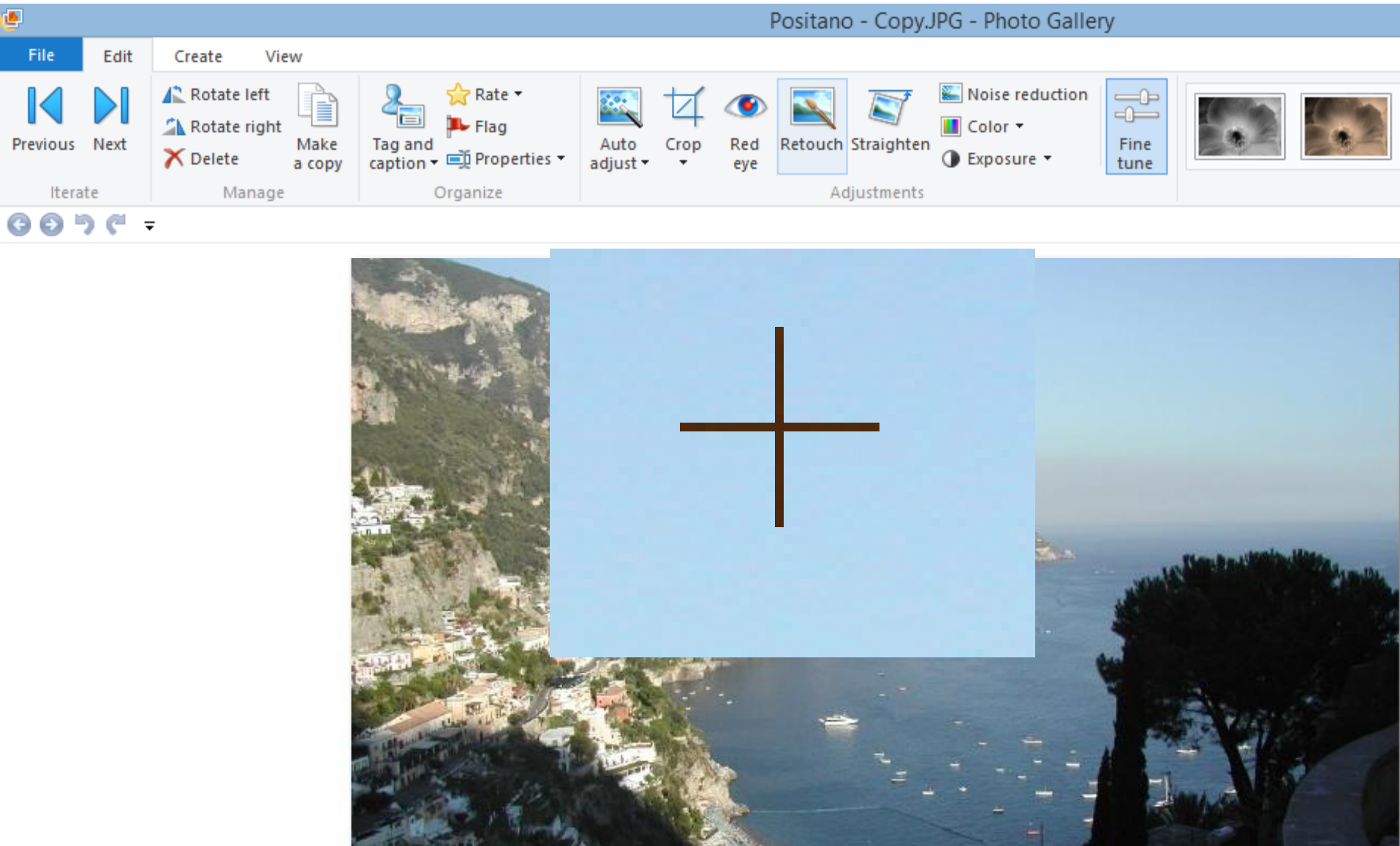
What does not work?

- As I mentioned, it depends on the background and the size. As the end, I will show you a sample of what does not work.
- If you are fixing a photo, you do not need to make a copy.
- Note – some details are in Part A. If you have not watched Part A, I recommend you do that first.
- Next, double click a Photo you want to **Retouch.**

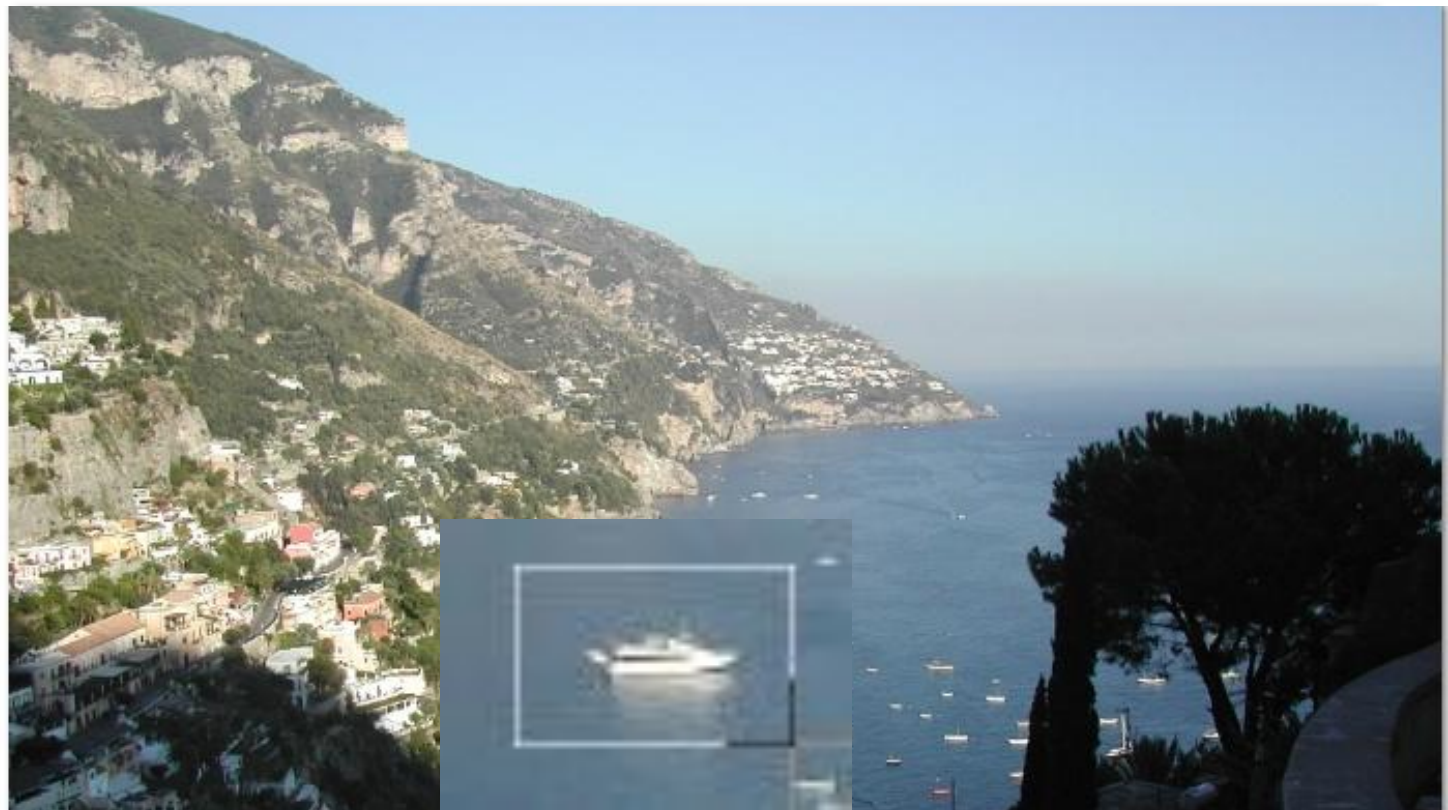
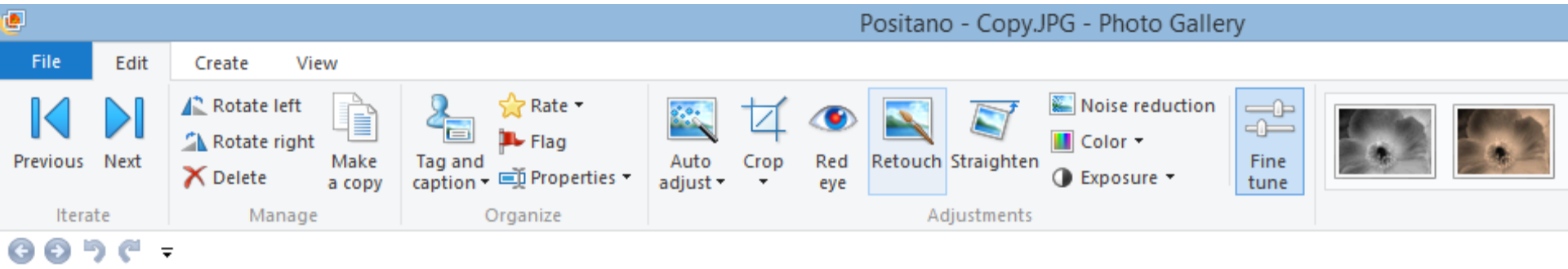
- Then, you click on Retouch.



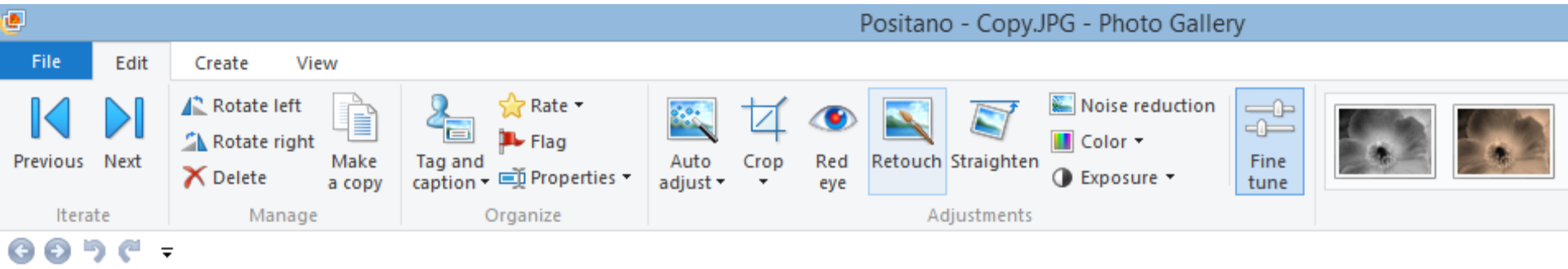
- It is the same process as fix Redeye, I have zoomed in, so you can see it.



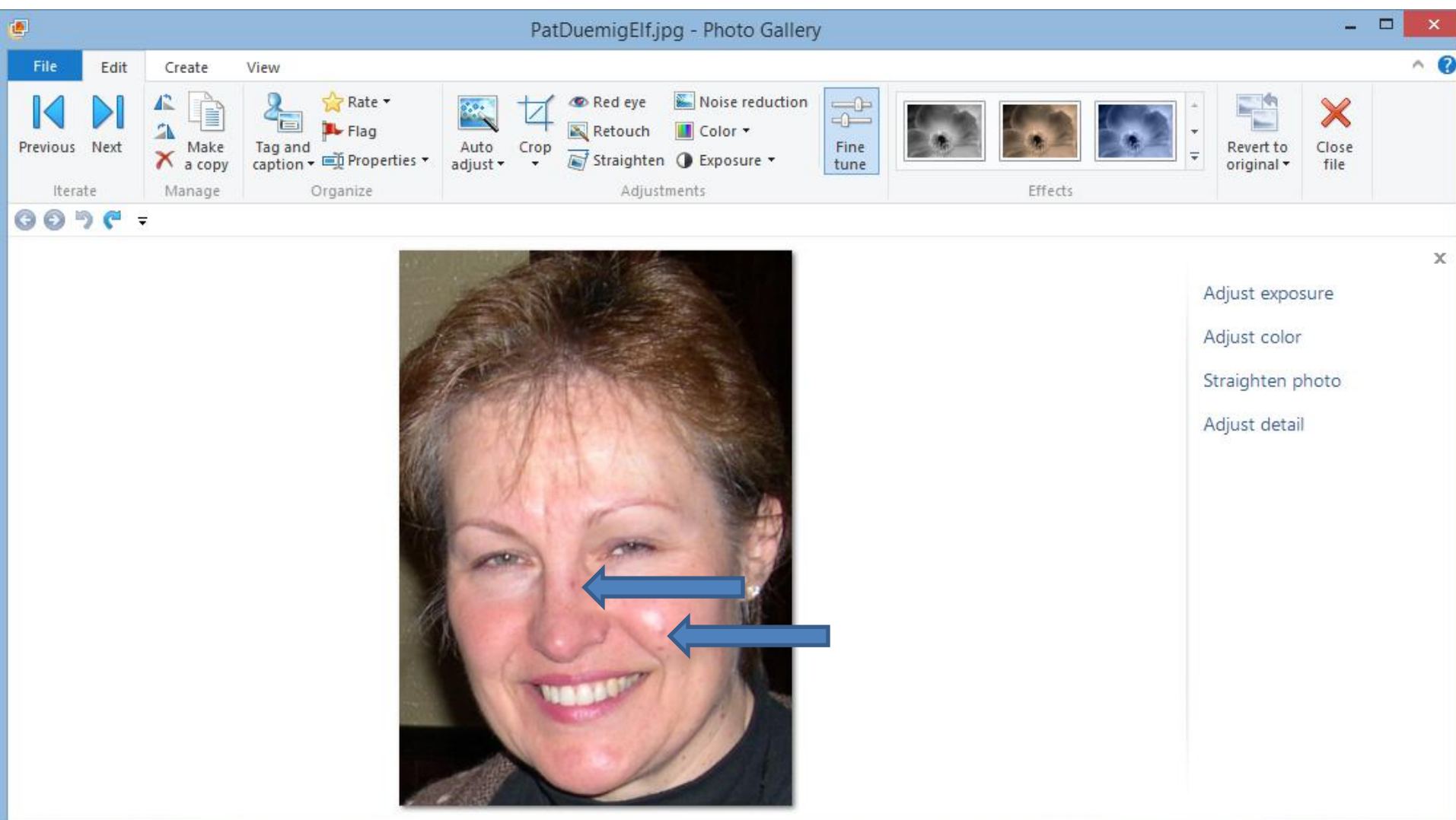
- You highlight a small area to remove, which is the same process as Crop. I have zoomed in.



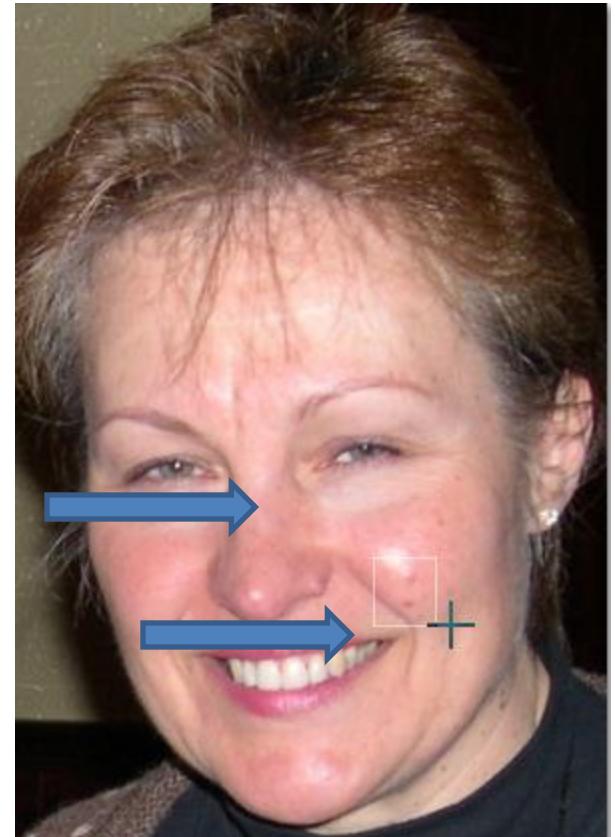
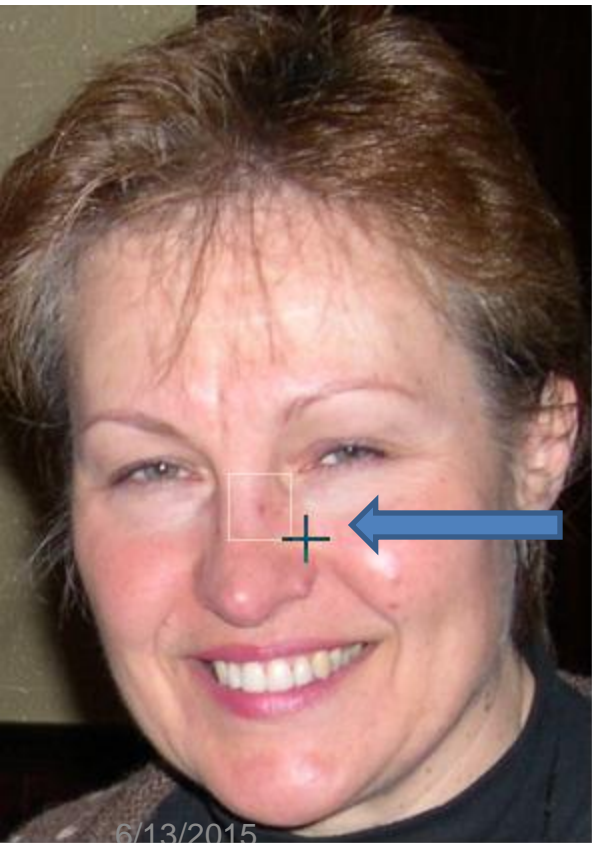
- You let go and it is removed. I zoomed in again.
- Next is Retouch a part of a face.



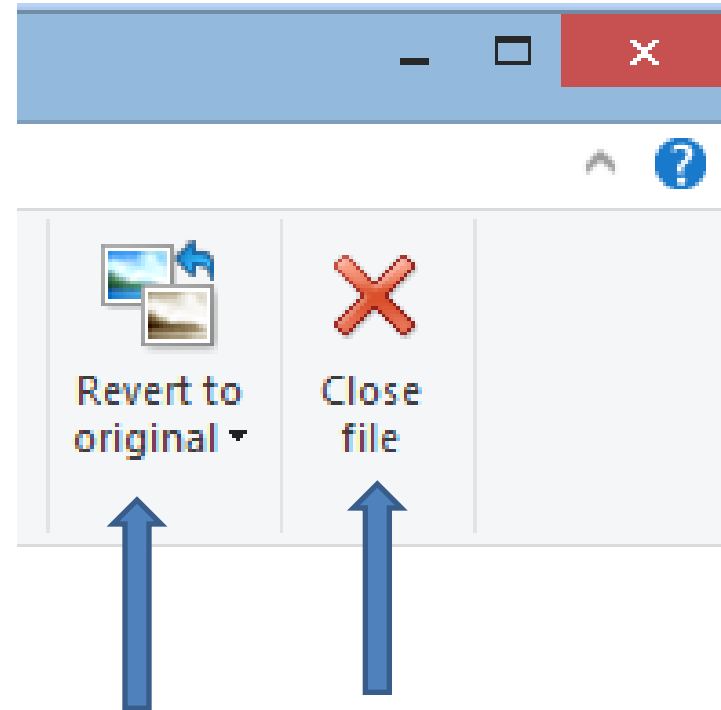
- You want to remove a couple of items on the face.
- You follow the same process. I will show you samples.



- You highlight one portion.
- You let it go and you see it fixed.
- You then highlight the second portion.
- Next is a sample when it is fixed.



- You then see them both fixed. Once you are complete, you click on Close File in the upper right or Revert to original, which I showed you in Part A.
- Next is one that does not work.



- Here is a sample of a photo, that you want to remove the item below.
- Next is a Retouch highlight.



- Once you highlighted and let it go, you see the results on the right and it doesn't work.
- This is the end of Part C.
