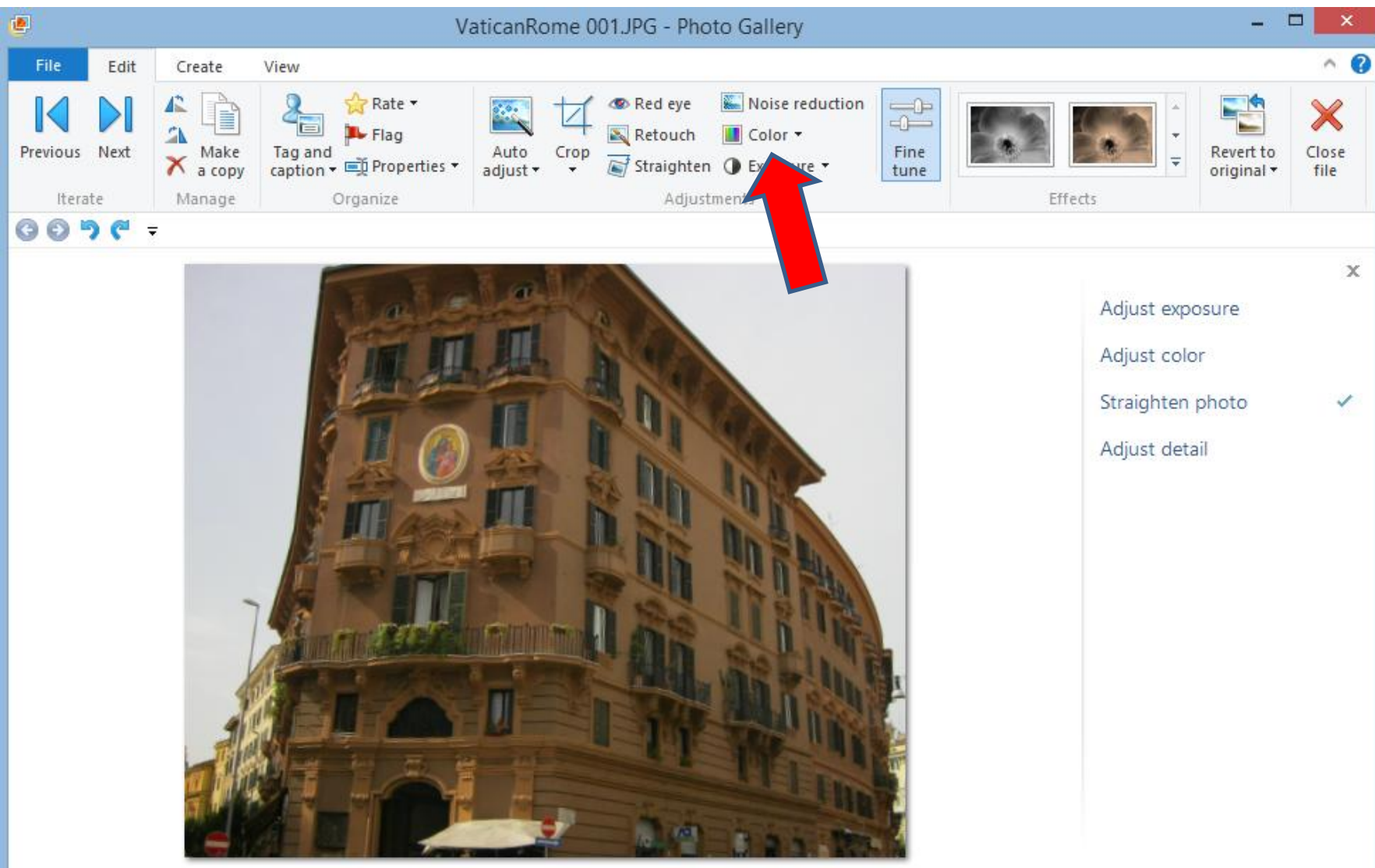


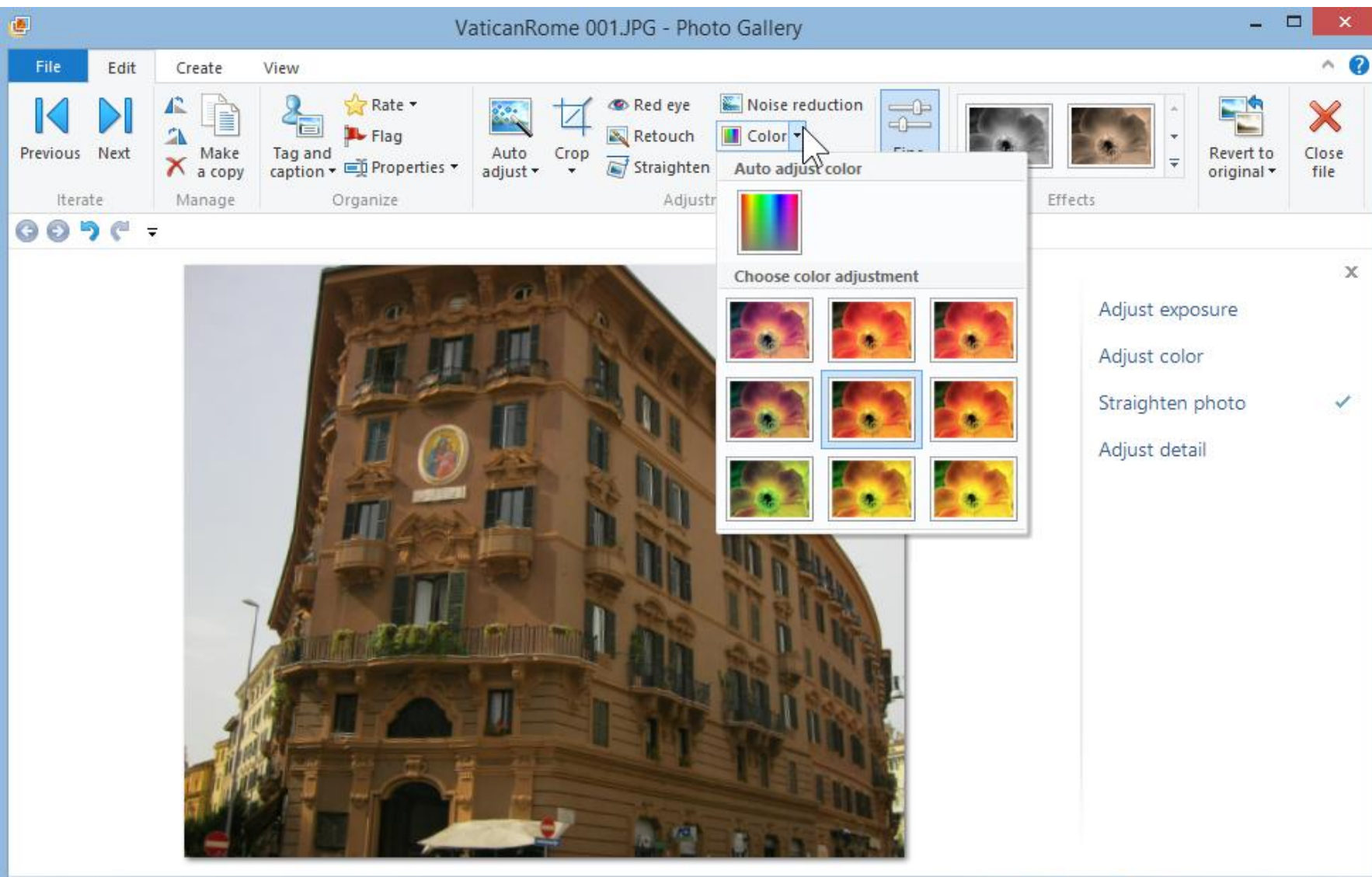
Step 7 - Part D – Color.

- If you fixing the color, you don't need a copy.**
- You have some options to change the color.**
- I will be showing you the options.**
- First find a Photo you want to change the Color and double click on it to go to the Edit page.**
- Next is a sample of a photo, I showed you before.**

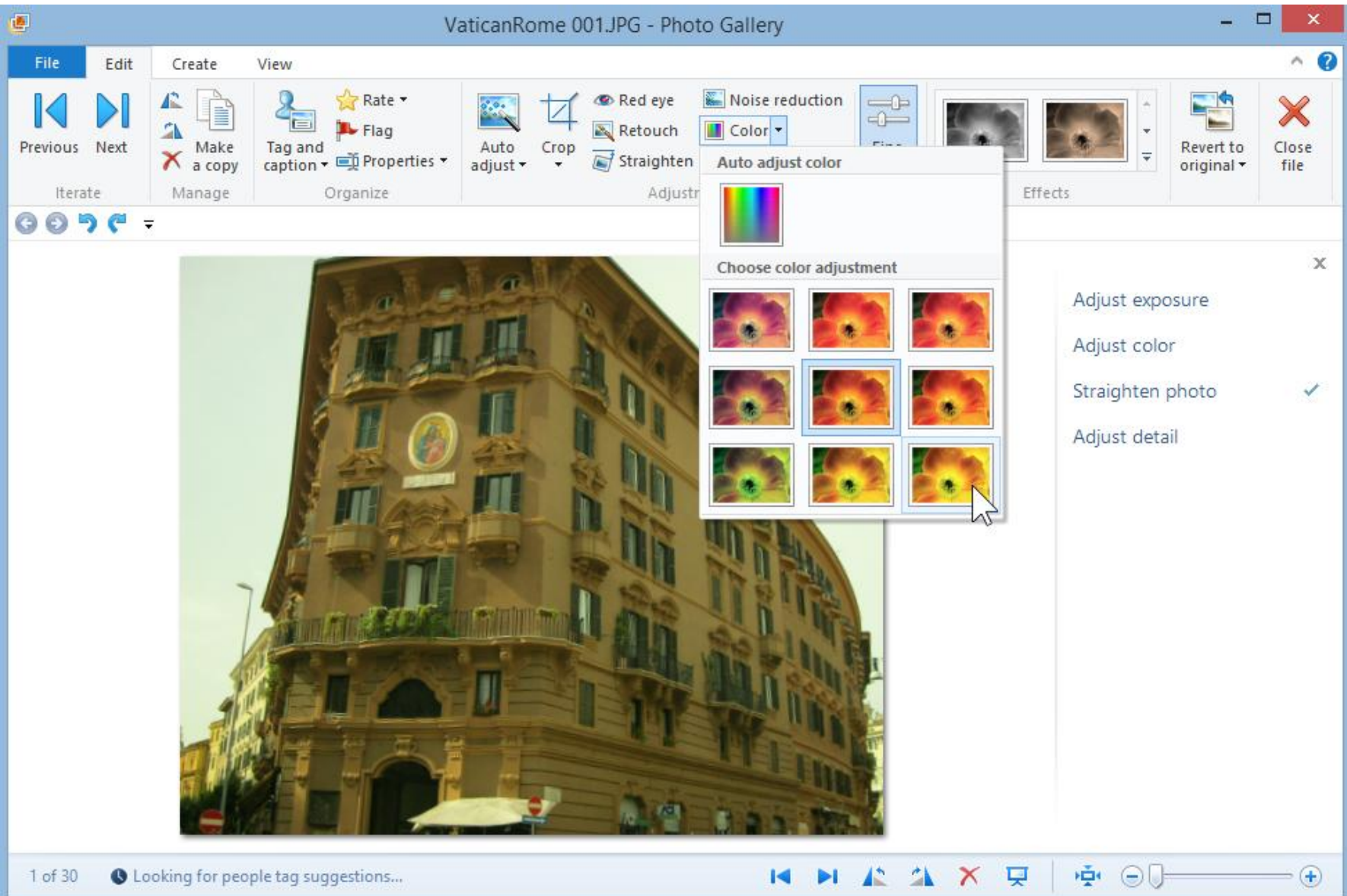
- If you click on Color, it Auto adjusts the Color, like Auto adjust. I recommend clicking on dropdown, which I will show you next.



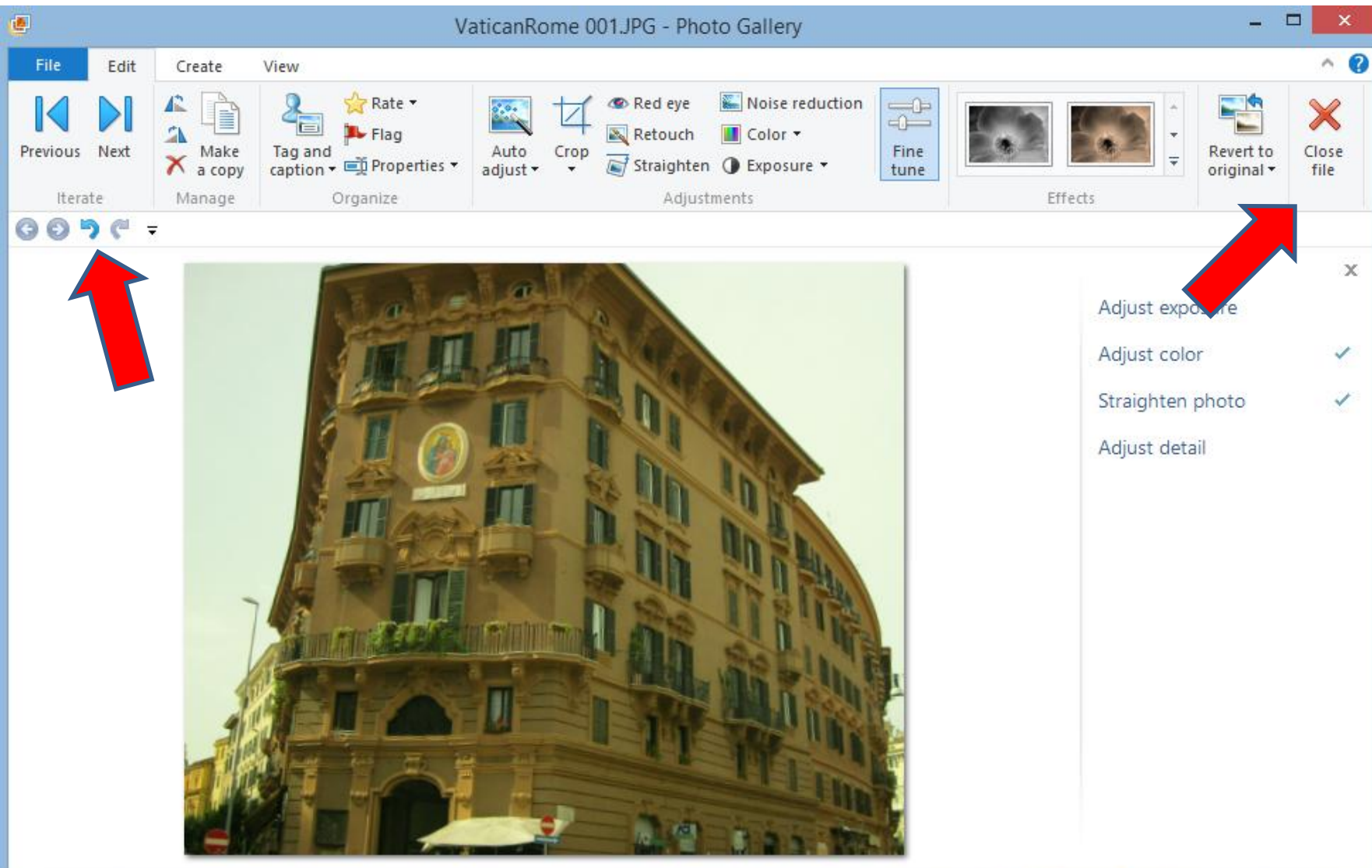
- You then see Auto adjust color and Choose color adjustment. You hover over each one to see the difference. Next is a sample.



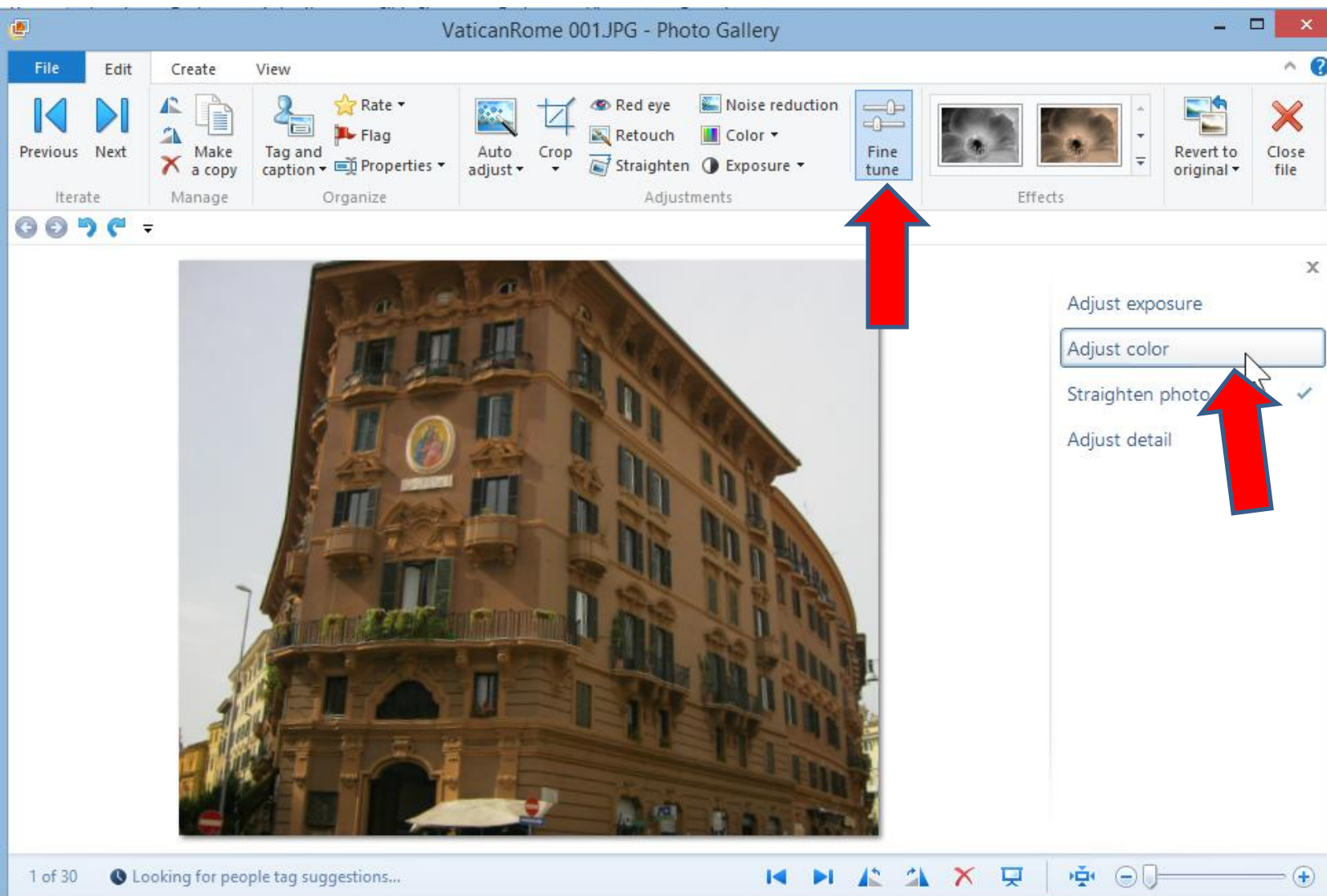
- You see the difference. Once you find one that you like, click on it vs. hover.



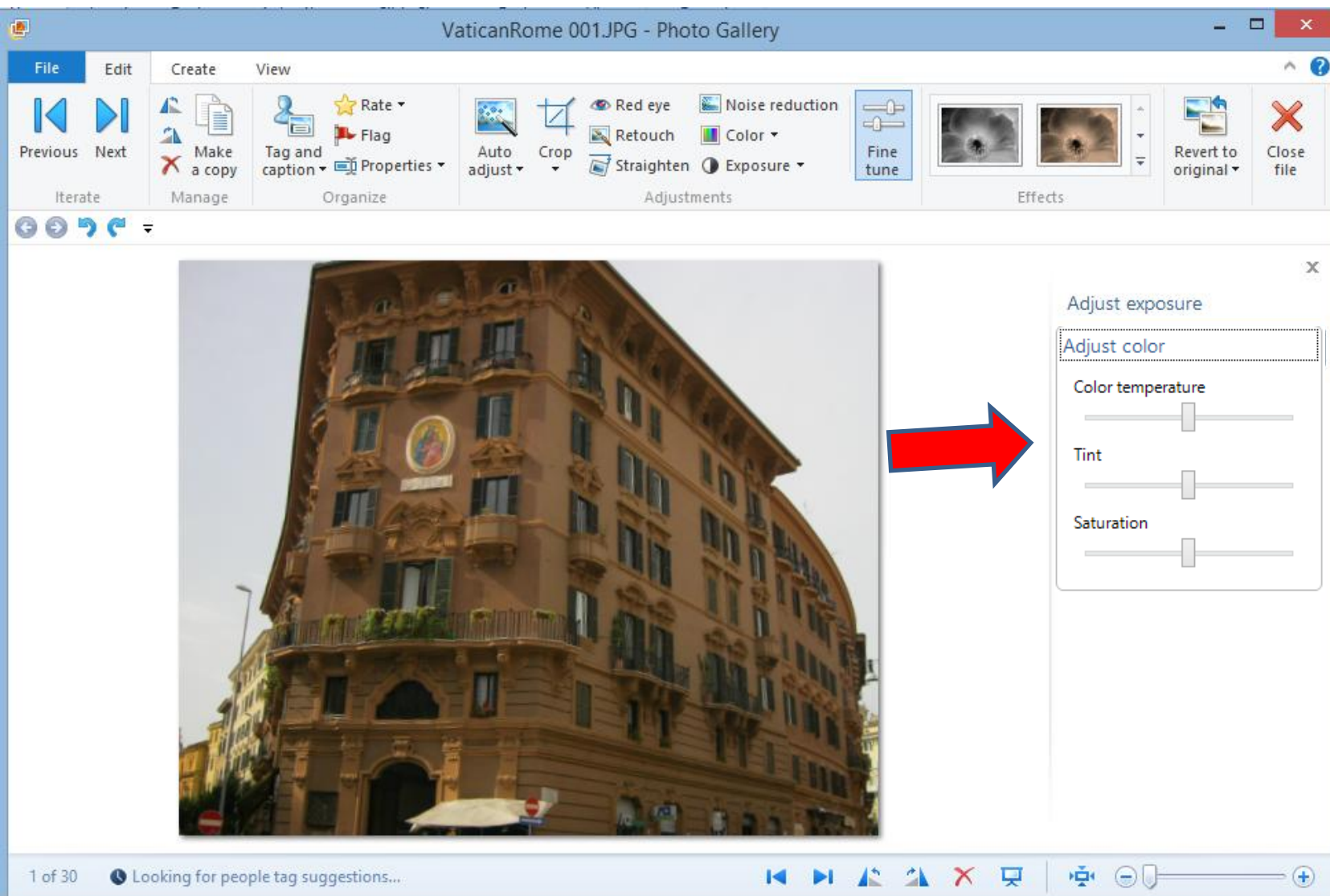
- You then can click on Close file to save it, or click on undo to do another option that I will show you.



- I did undo. Other option is to click on Adjust color on the right. If you don't see it, click on Fine tune to see it.



- You then see options to manually change it, like Color temperature, Tint, Saturation. I will show each one of them.



- You left click on the icon and hold it down and drag it to the right and it brightens the color.

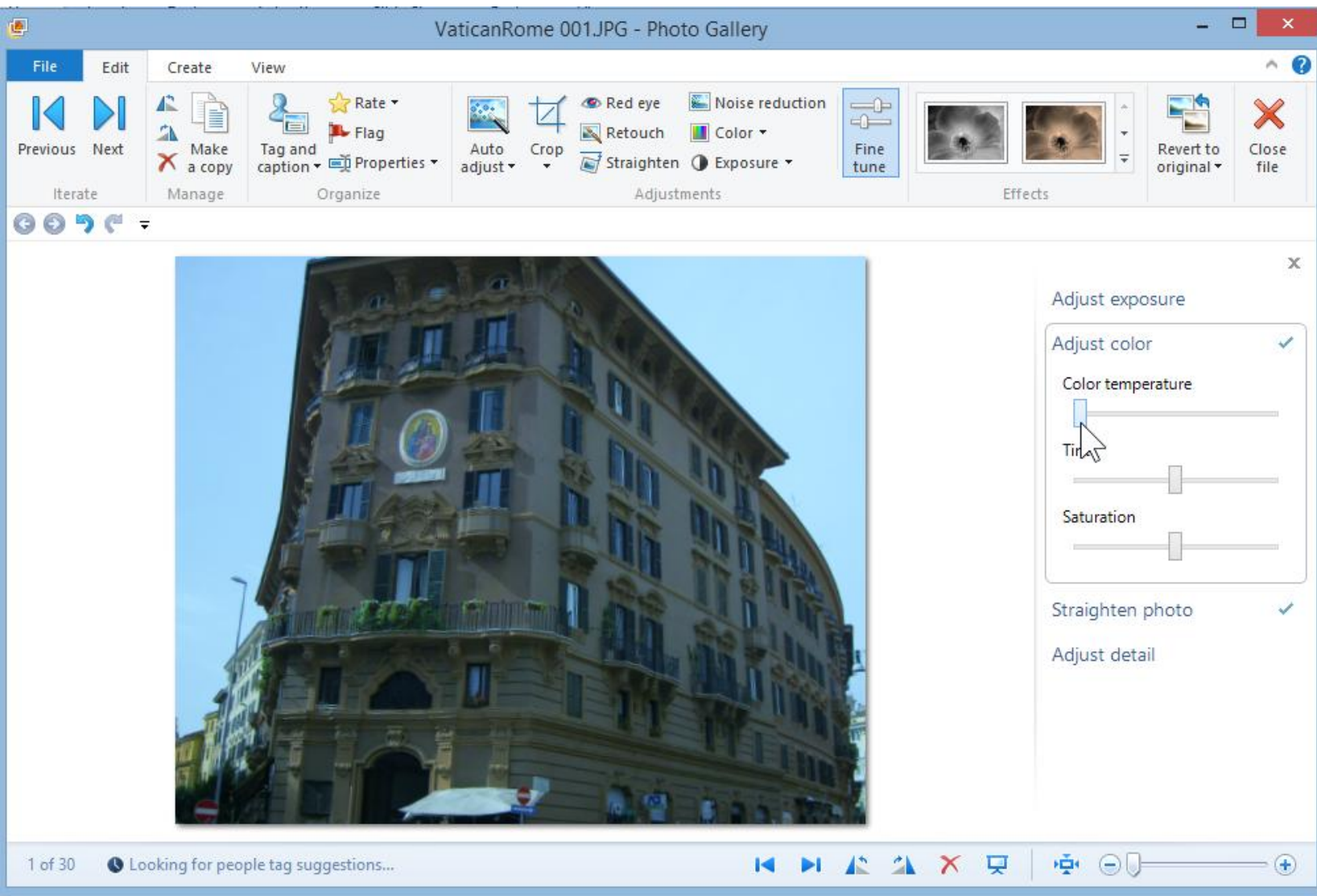

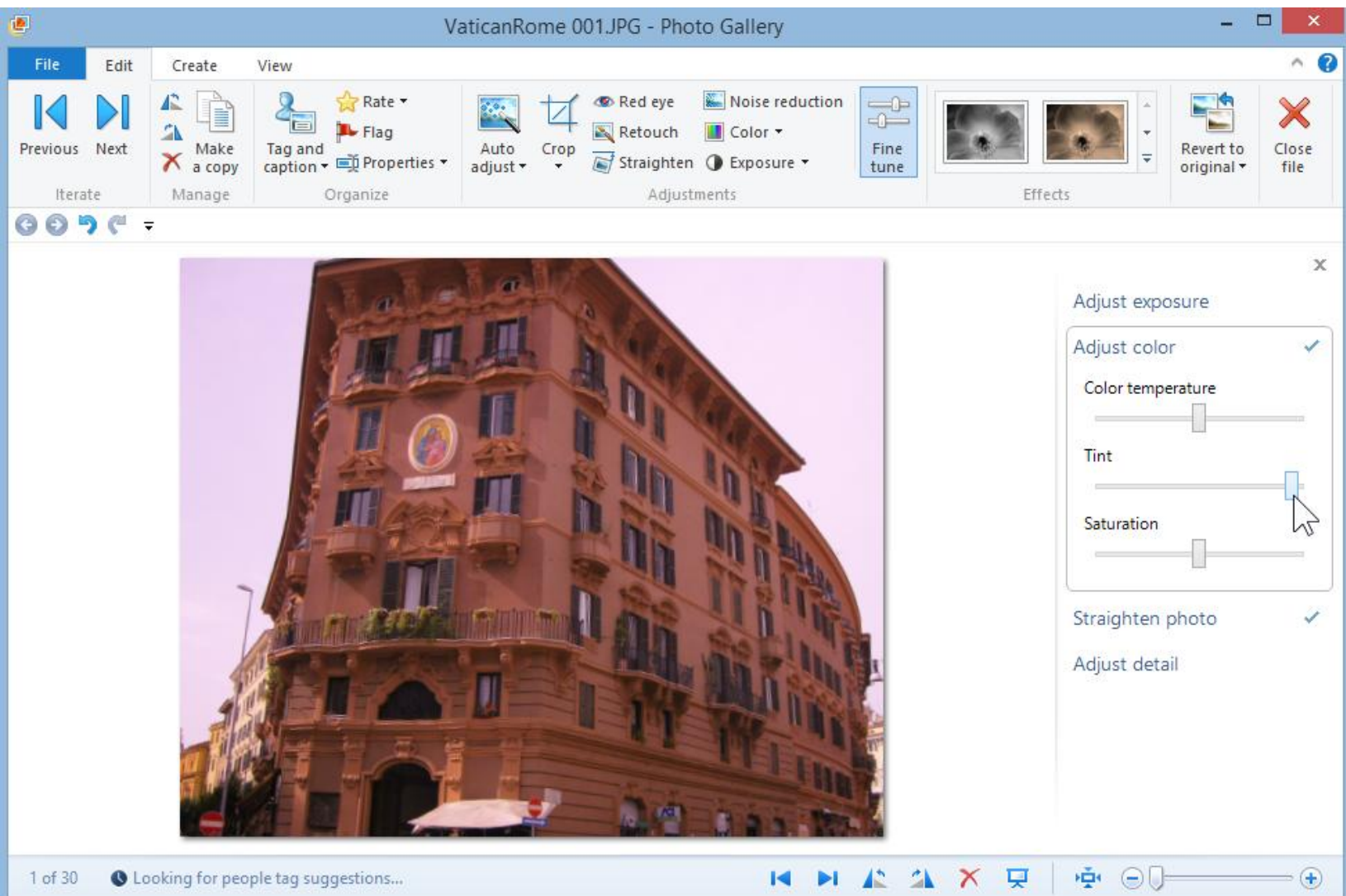

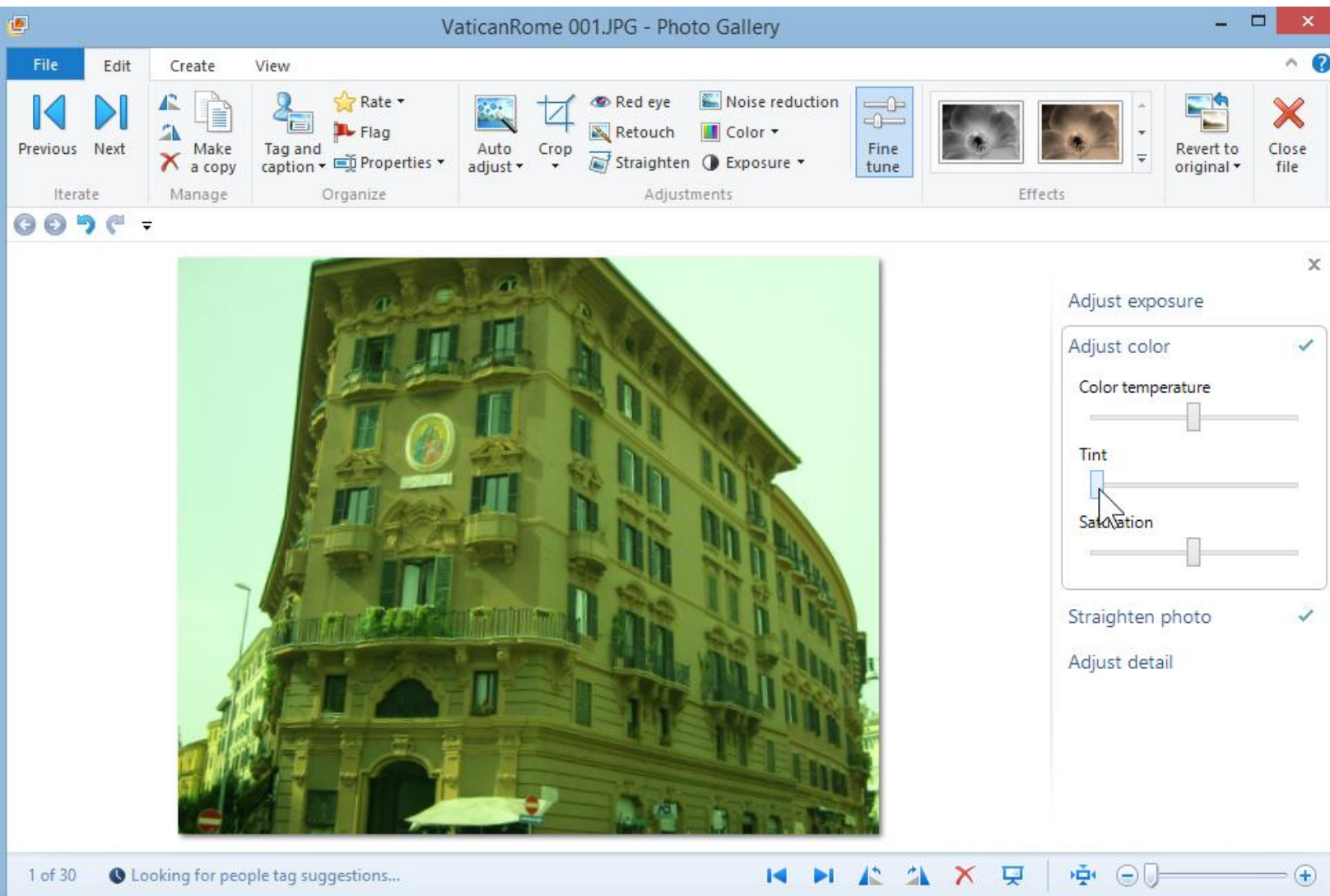
- If you drag it to the left, it darkens it and changes the background color. Next, is Tint.



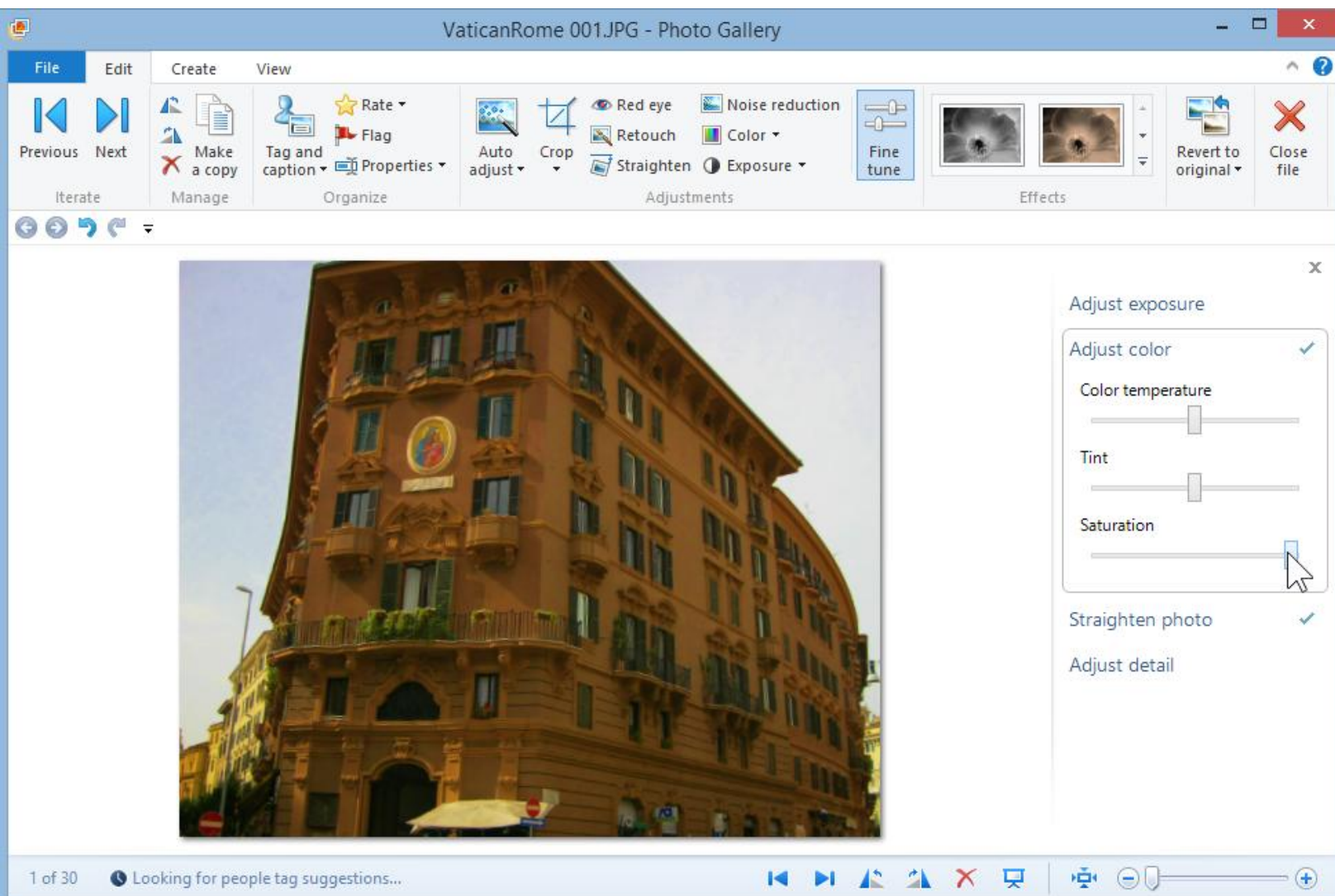
- I did undo and then dragged the icon to the right on Tint. You see it brighter and the background color changes.



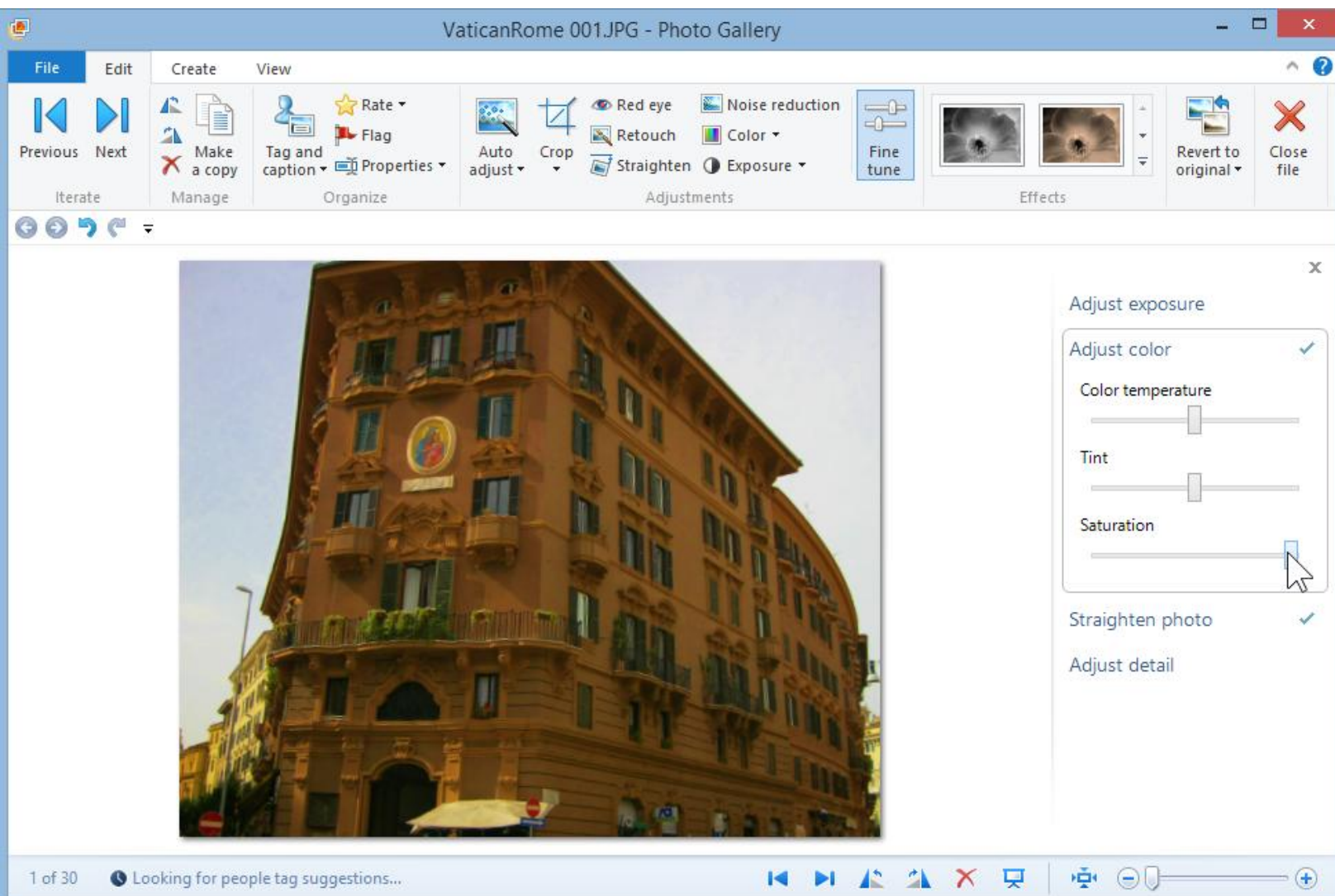
- When you drag it to the left, it also brightens it and the background color changes. Next is Saturation.



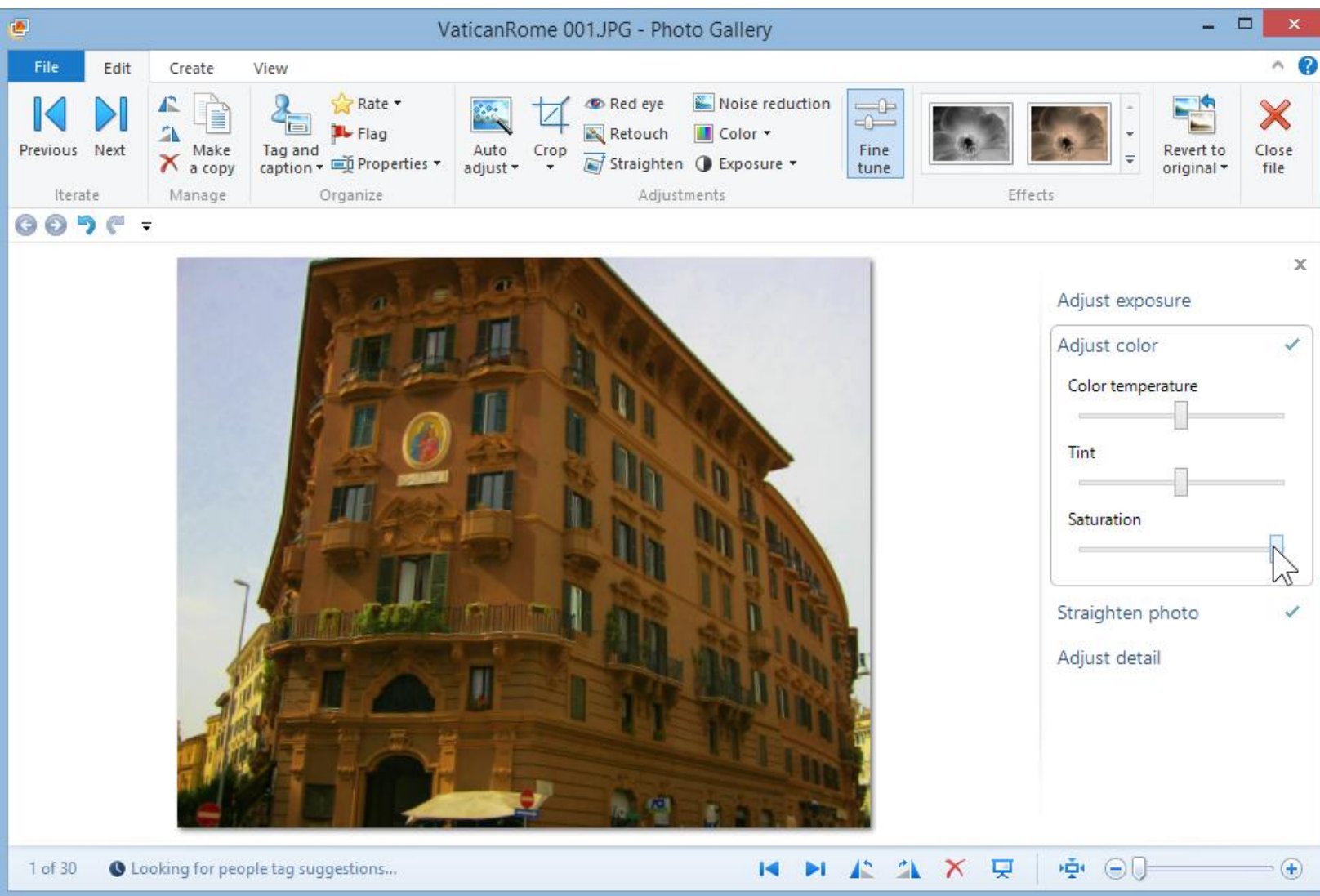
- I did undo and then dragged the icon to the right on Saturation. You see the building color better.
