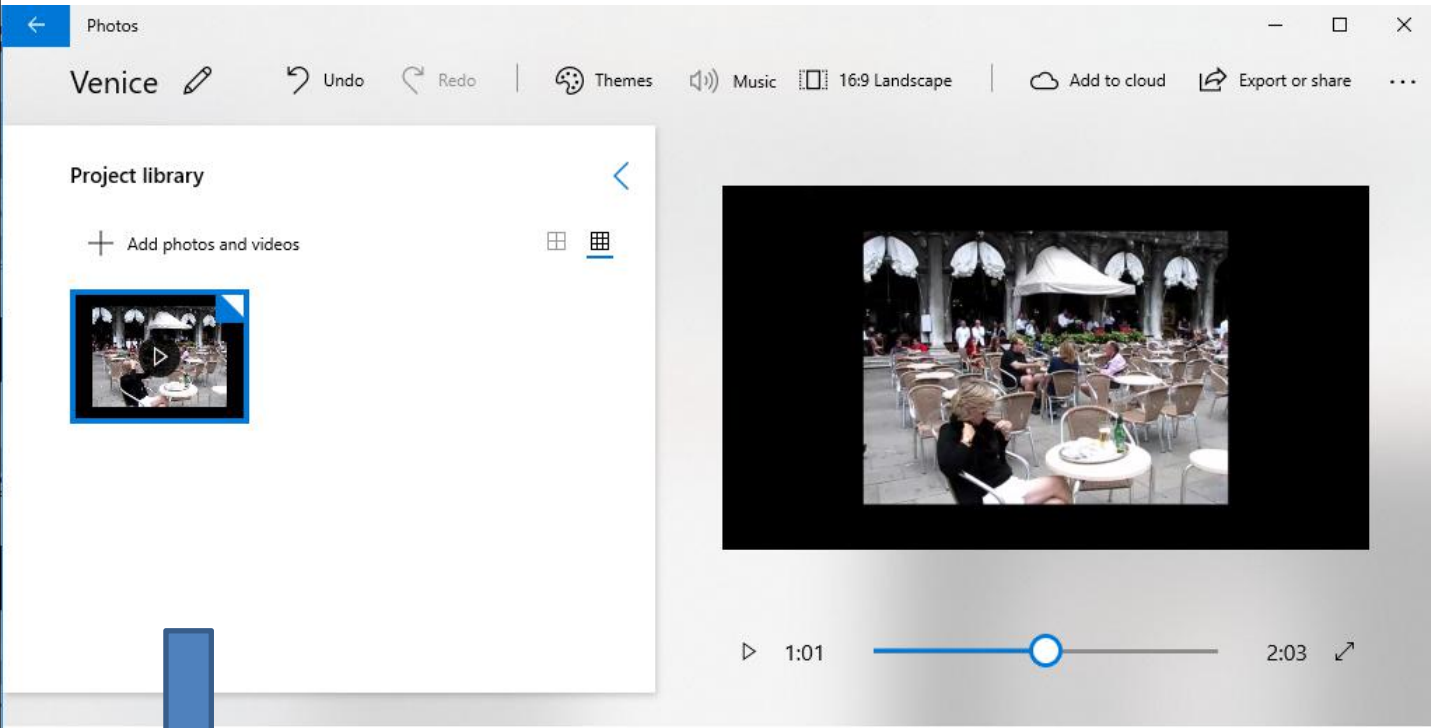


Step 8 – Part B – Trim Videos


- If you did Step 8 – Part A and still have Photos App open and you are the same page you adding Videos, next is how to Trim them.**
- If you did Step 8 – Part A and added Videos and for some reason you closed Photos App, open it again and click on Video projects again and click on the project.**
- Note - Trim is similar that I showed you in Step 7 - Part B.**

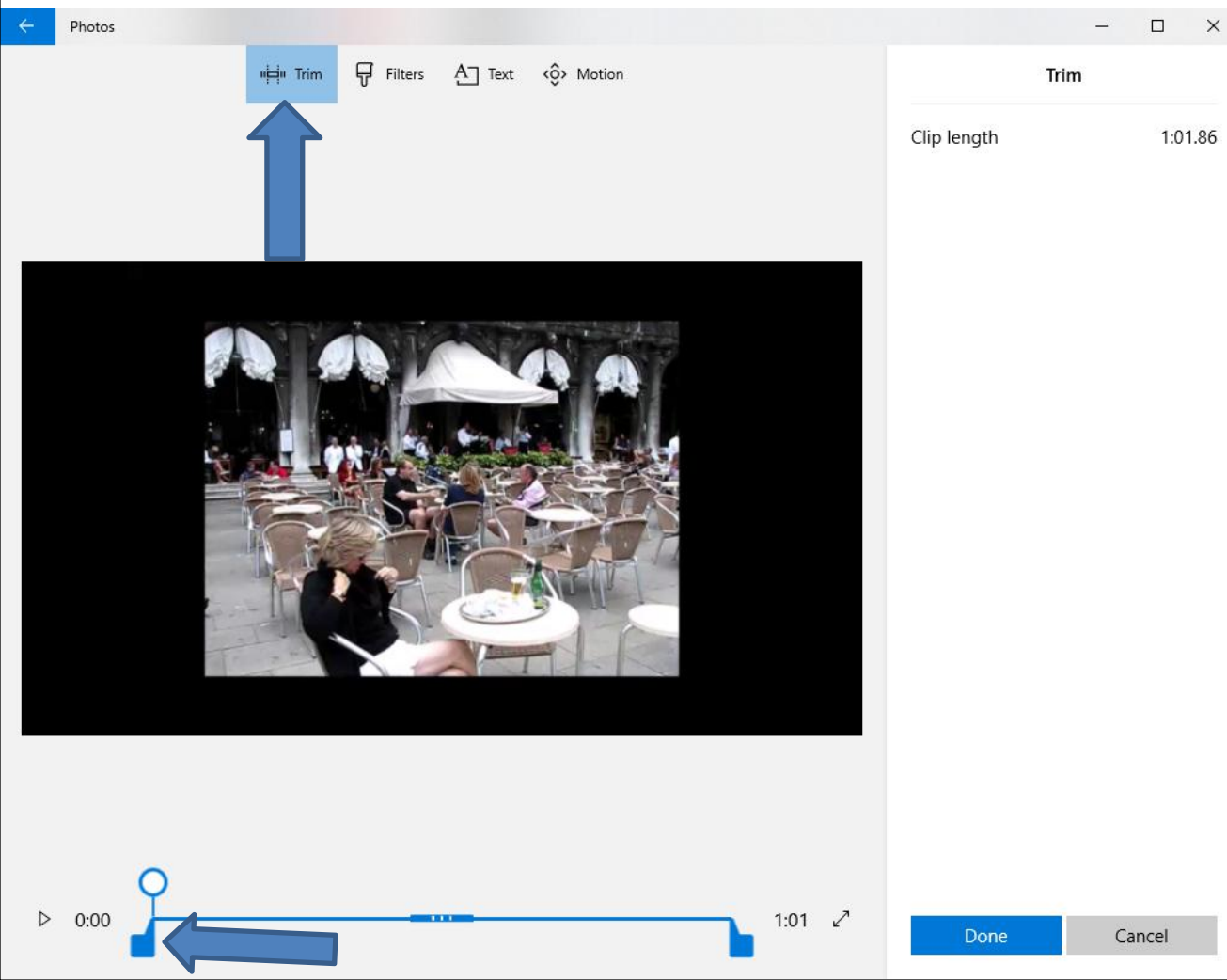
- You click on the first Video and then click on Trim and next is what happens.

- Page changes to Trim. You left click on the Icon  on the bottom of left and hold it down and drag to the right to the place you want to Trim. Next is a sample.




- Here is a sample. You then click on the Icon on the right and follow the same process and drag it to the left. Next is a sample.

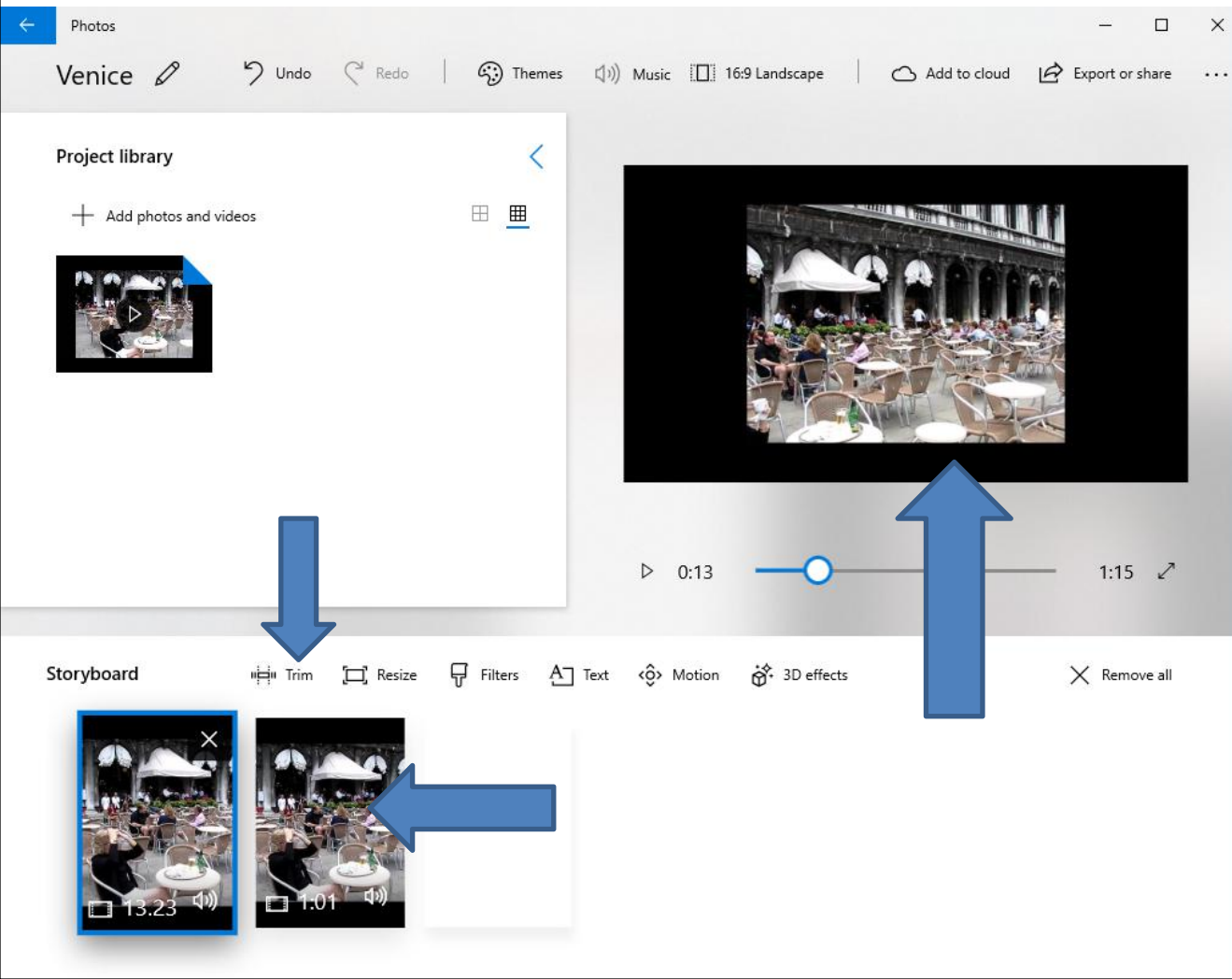
