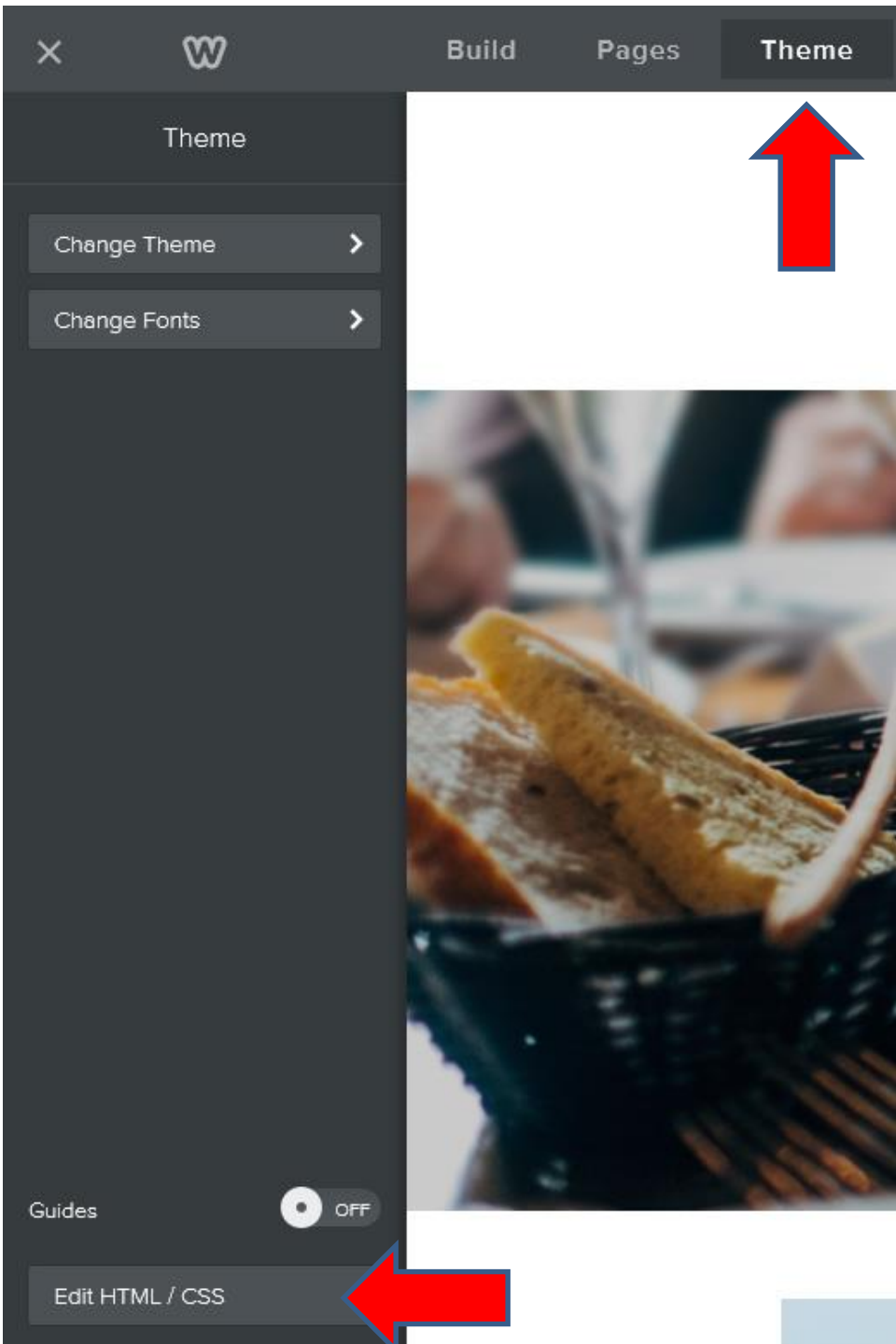



Tip – Customize Themes

- **This Tip is the same process as the other Tip – How to Change Background Color, except different location and different HTML / CSS.**
- **First is the first Theme we selected to change the width of the page to be close to the Header width. Also, how to change Button background color. After that I will show you the other Theme we did. As I mentioned in the First Course, you can't Customize the Second or Third Theme.**
- **Make sure you are on the first Theme.**
- **If not, click on Theme tap and then click on Change Theme. Then click on Recently Used and choose the first Theme we did.**
- **When it goes back to Build, click on Theme again, which is next.**




- **First Click on Theme again.**
- **At the bottom, you see Edit HTML/CSS.**
- **Click on it and next shows what happens.**

- A new page opens and you see black at the top. I recommend you click on White.
- Next shows what happens.





- Once you type it in, scroll down and you see the container page is about the same width as the Header.
- Next is to change Button background color.
- You scroll down to number 462, which is next.

- Once you scroll down to 462, you see `wsite-button` and you see on 466 `Background`.
- Next is how to change the `Background`.
- Note – you have to have code to do that. You can copy code when you change color on the `background color page` or `header`.



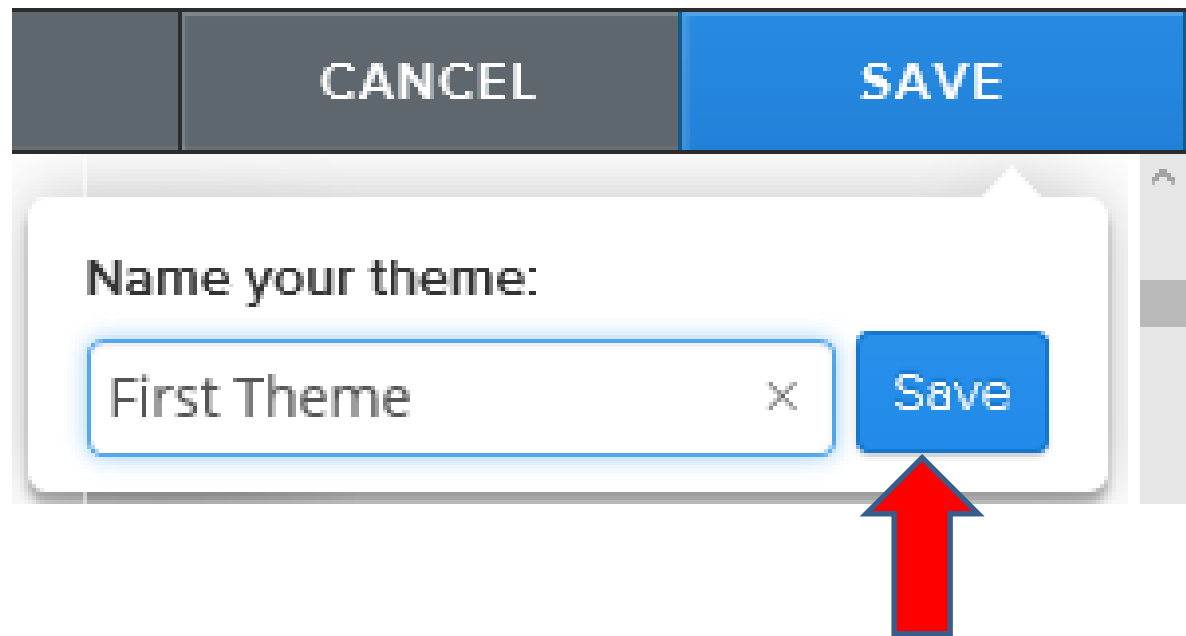


- **Once you click on Save a new window opens and you have to type in the Name of your theme.**

- **Next is what happens.**

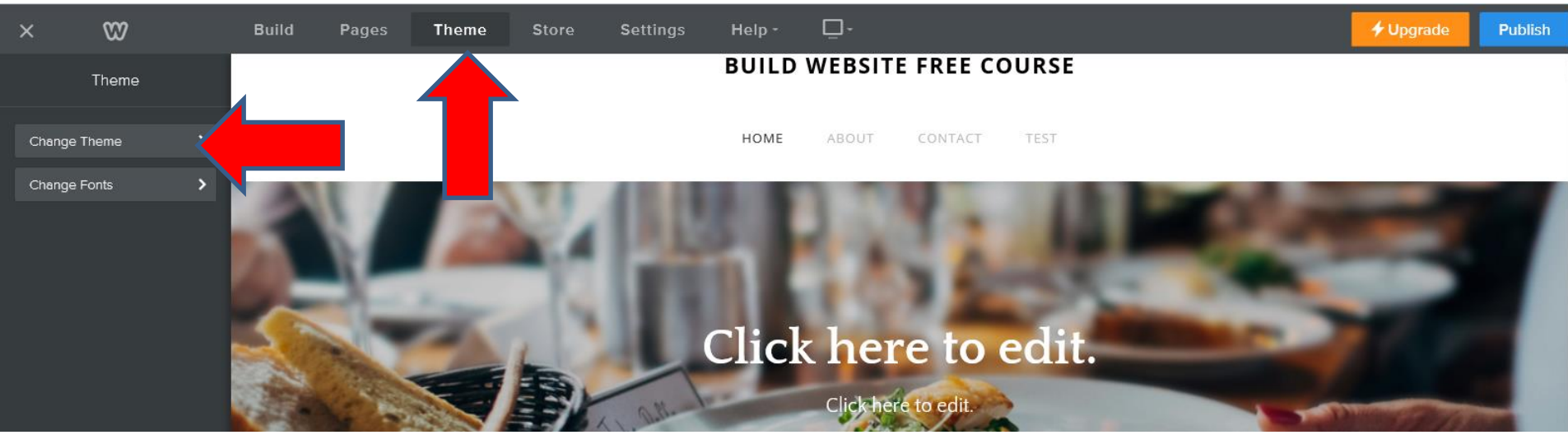

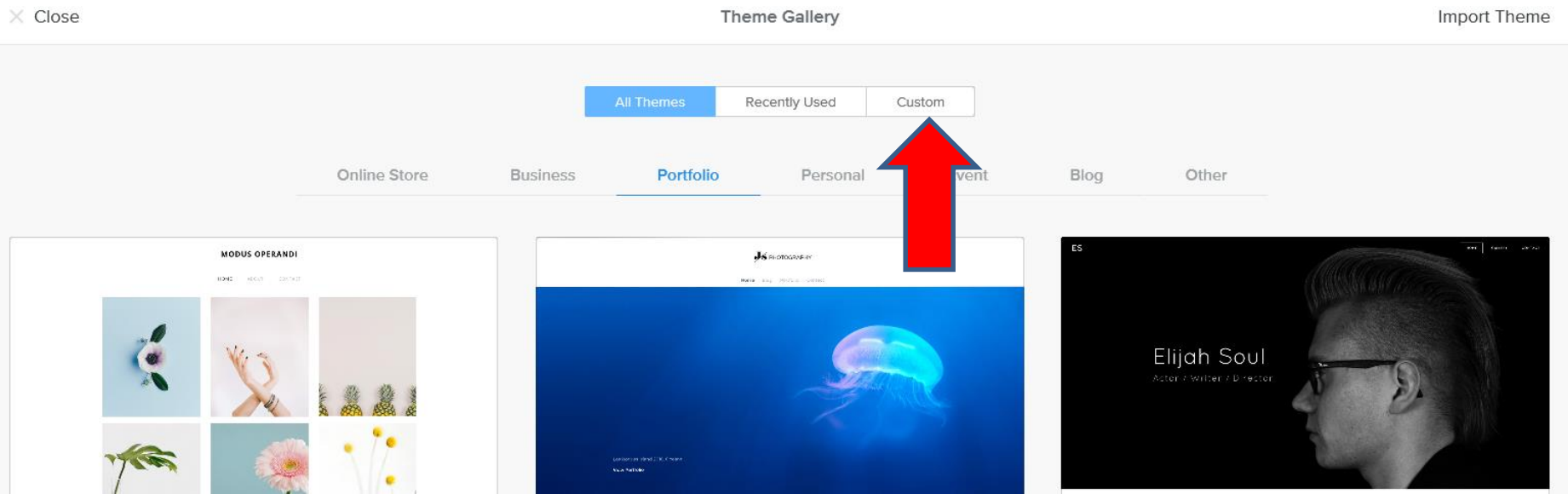
- **Once you type in the Name of your theme, click on Save.**

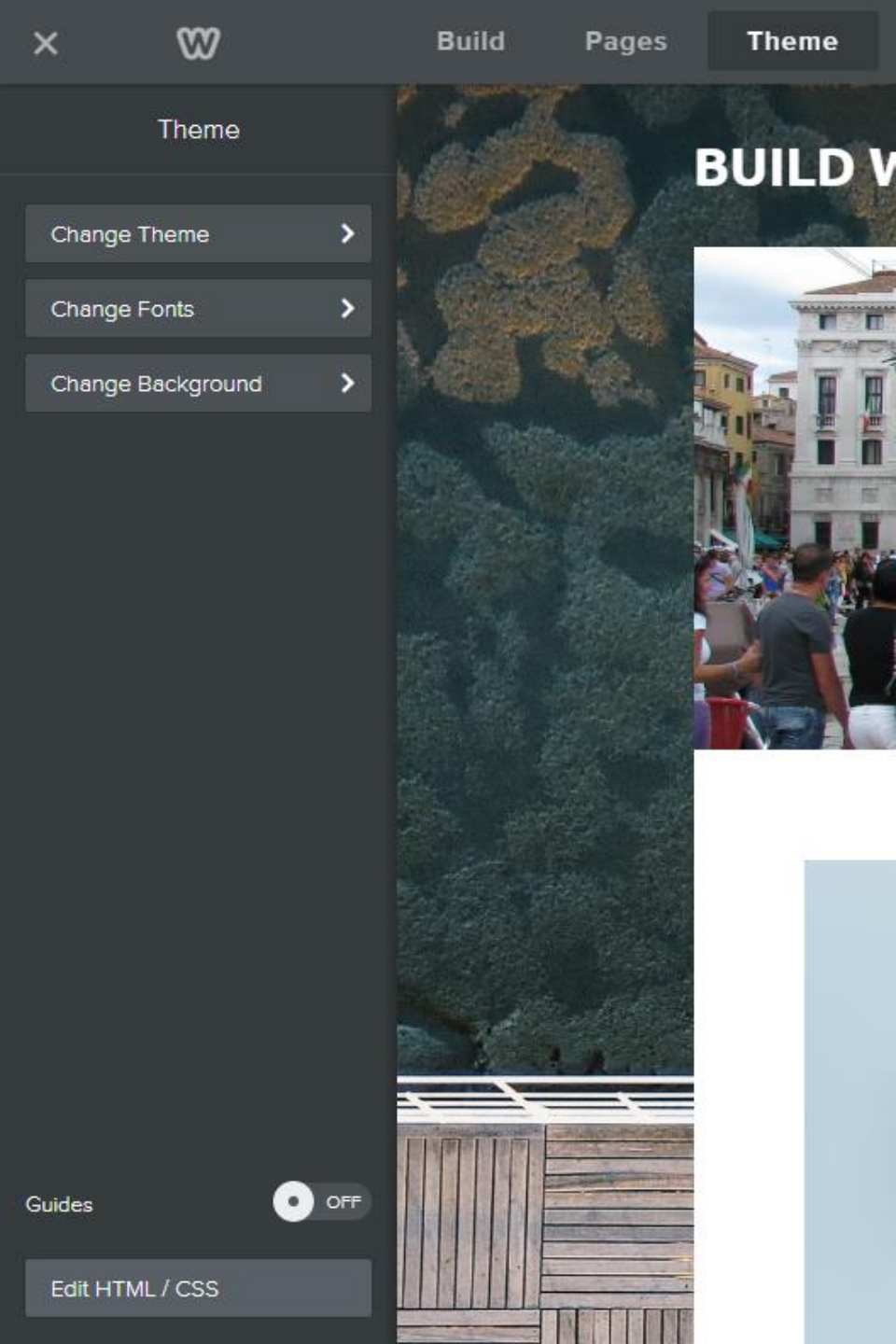

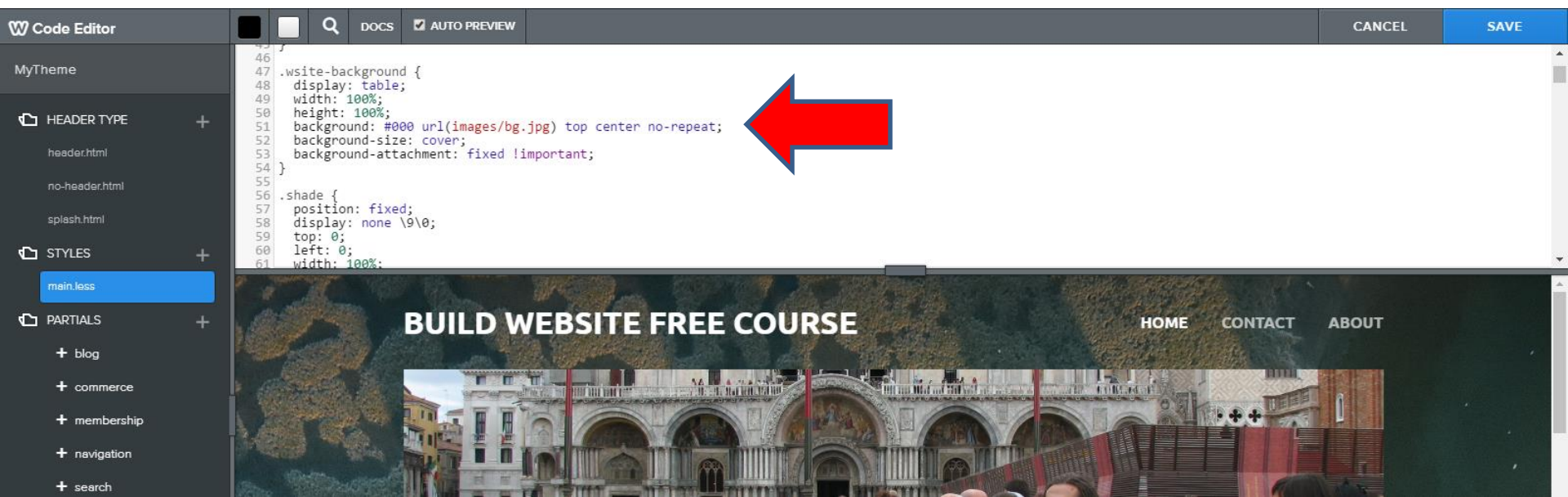
- Follow same process and click on Theme and then click on Edit HTML/CSS.

- Next is what happens and how to change image to color.



- Next I will show you highlight and after that what happens when you type in.




- When you put # in frond of fff, it makes changes that I like. Next is change Width.

- Scroll down a little to 79 which is next and I will zoom in so you can see it.



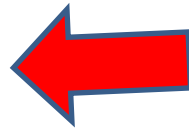






