


Tip – how to change embed code font color.

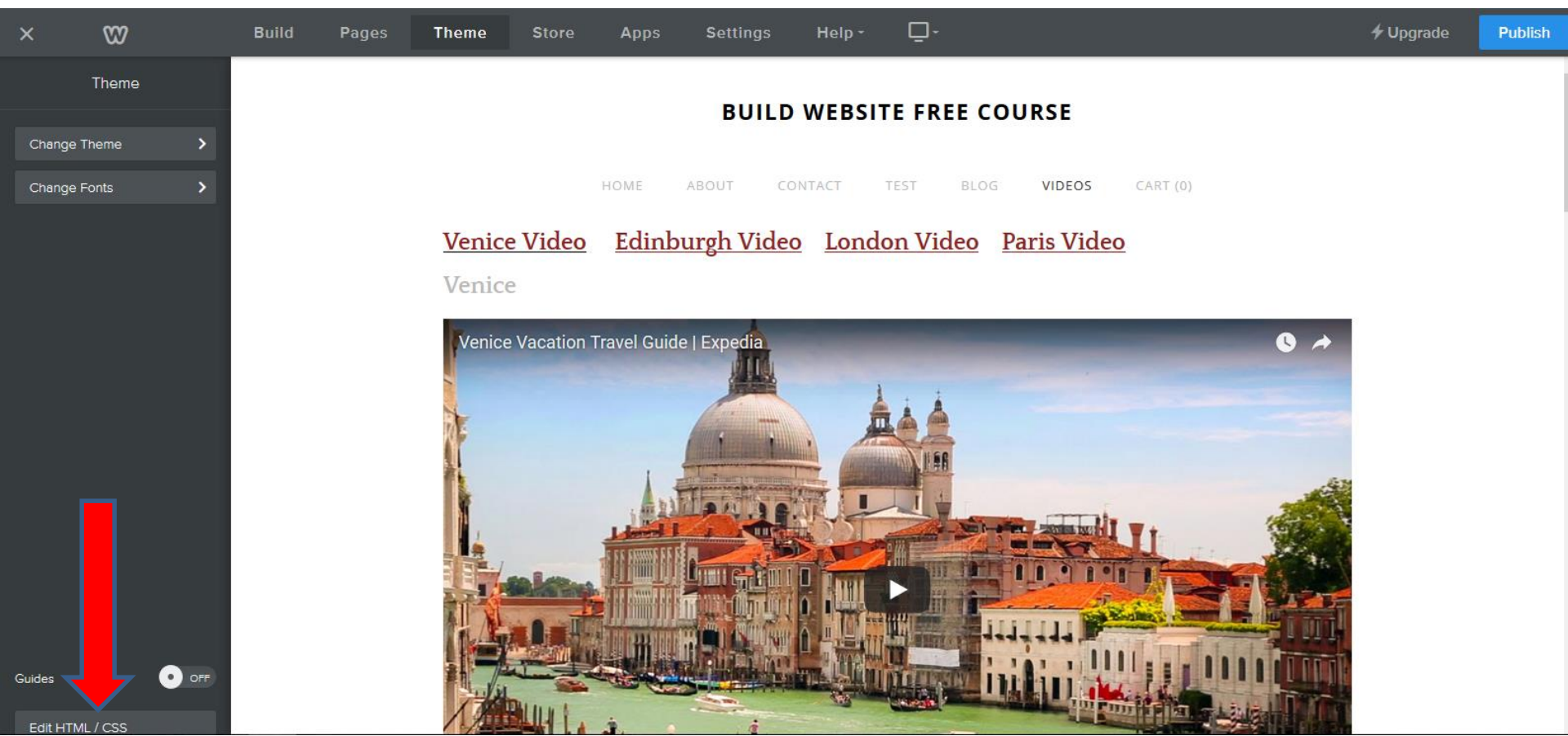
- In the other Tip – How to add links to different places on a page, we did the Embed Code Element and the font color was not black. When you hover over the font, it shows black.**
- I decided to try to change the color and it is not easy with EDIT HTML /CSS, but I will show how to do that.**
- Next is how to get to EDIT HTML /CSS.**

- To get to EDIT HTML /CSS, you click on Theme.
- Next is a sample.




- You then see Embed Code Element font color is black. Once complete, you click on SAVE in the upper right. Next is what happens.



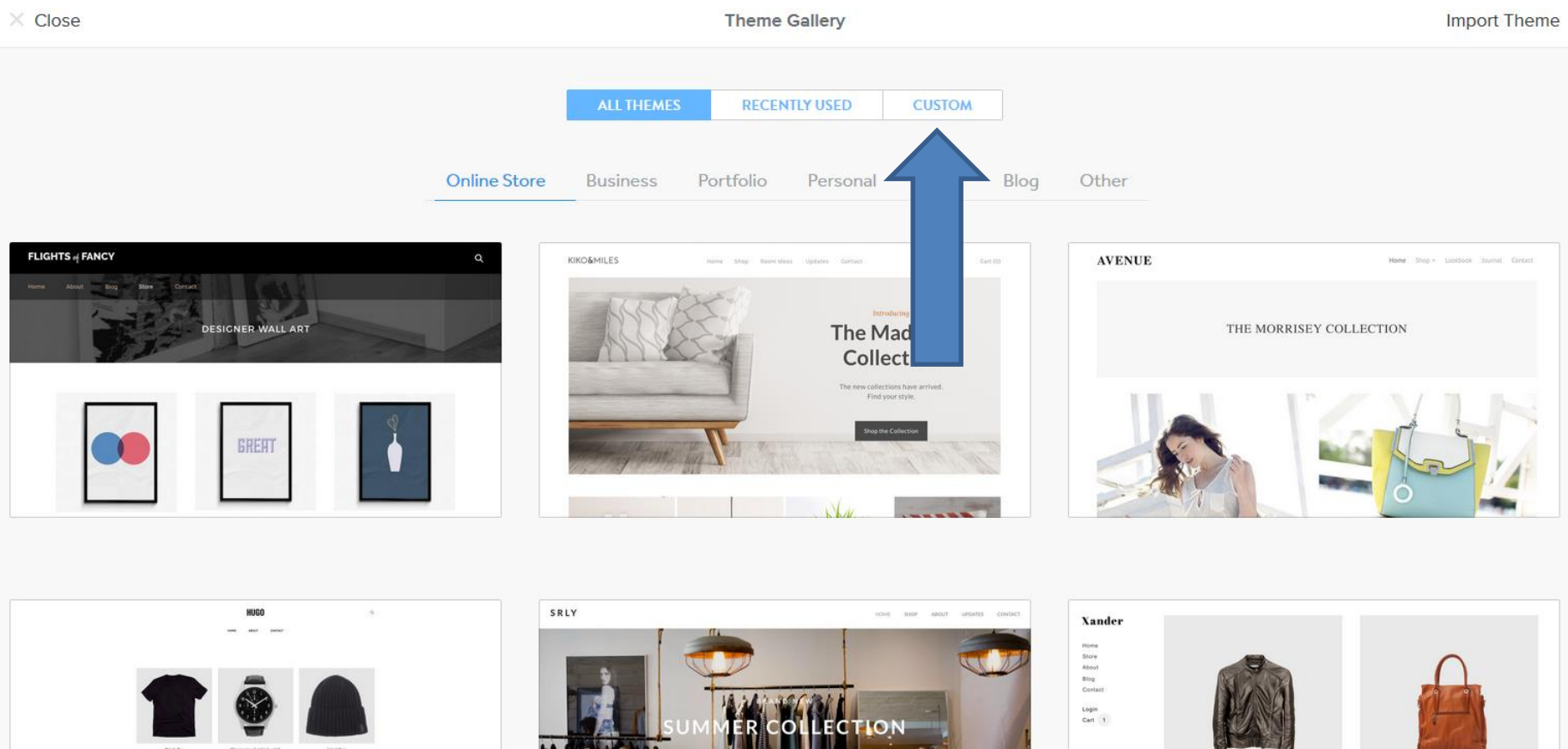
