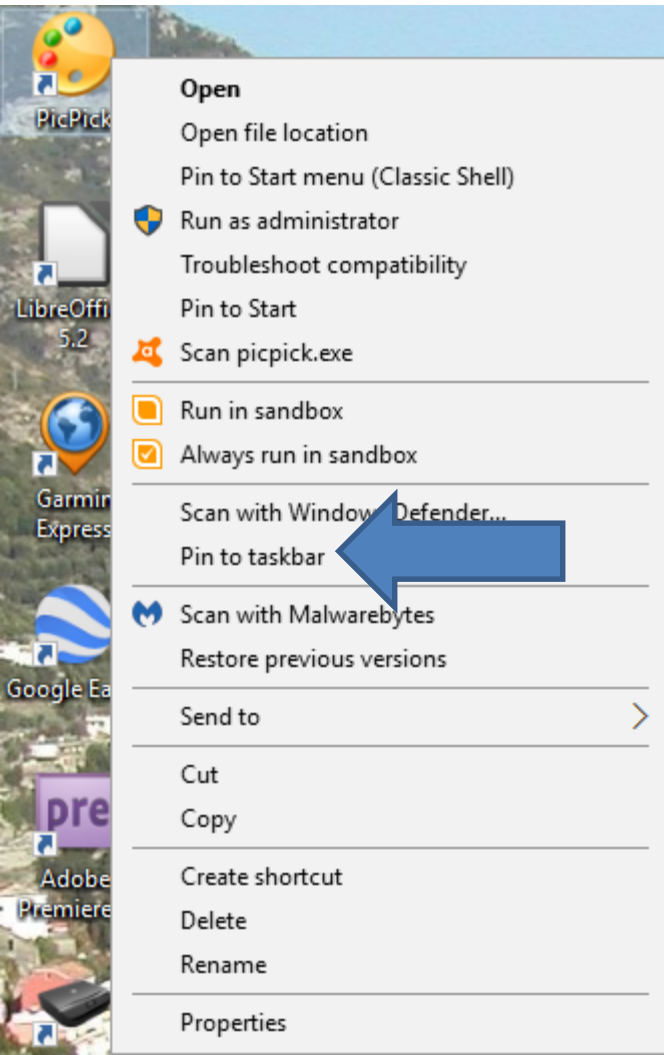
- Next is what happens when you download.

- **Once you download, you will see the Icon on your Desktop screen.**




- **I recommend you Pin to the Taskbar, because it is easier to Pick color when you are in your Weebly account.**
- **Next is how to Pin to the Taskbar.**

- **You right click on the Icon and you see a list and then click on Pin to taskbar. Once you do that, you will see the Icon on the taskbar.**

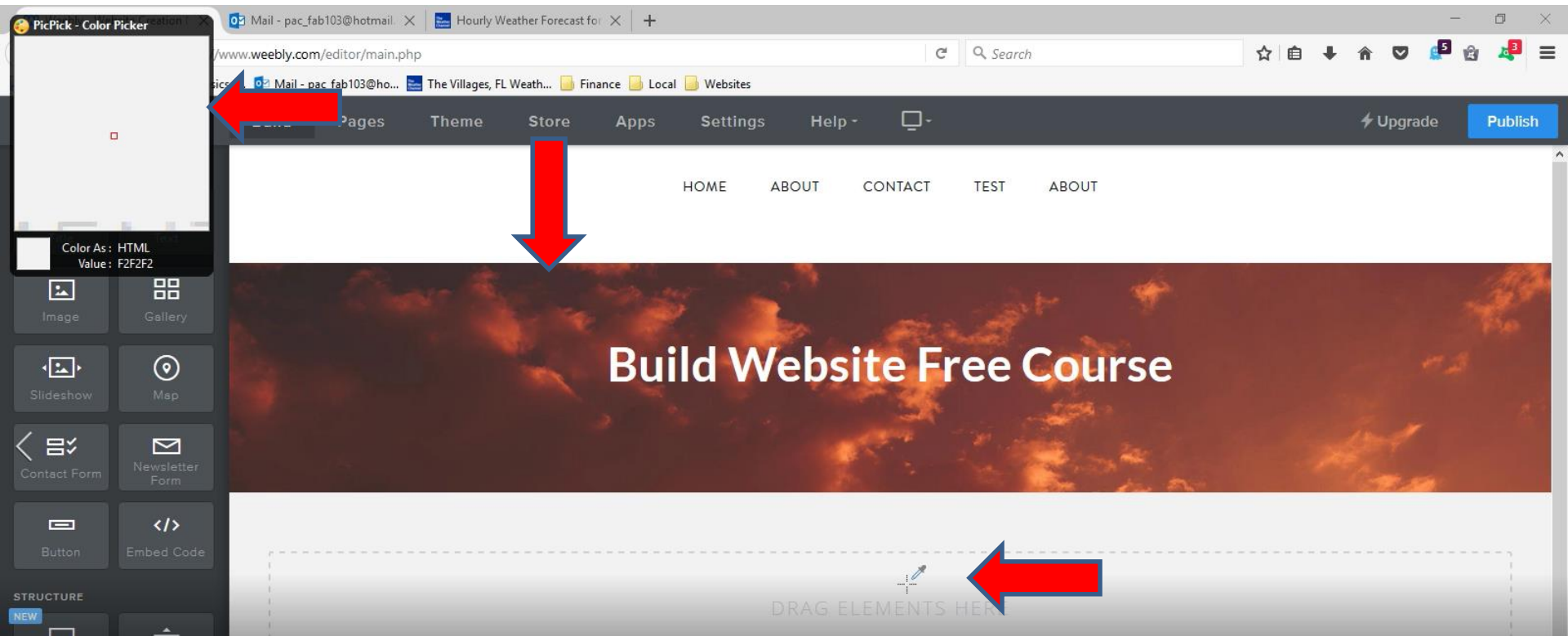

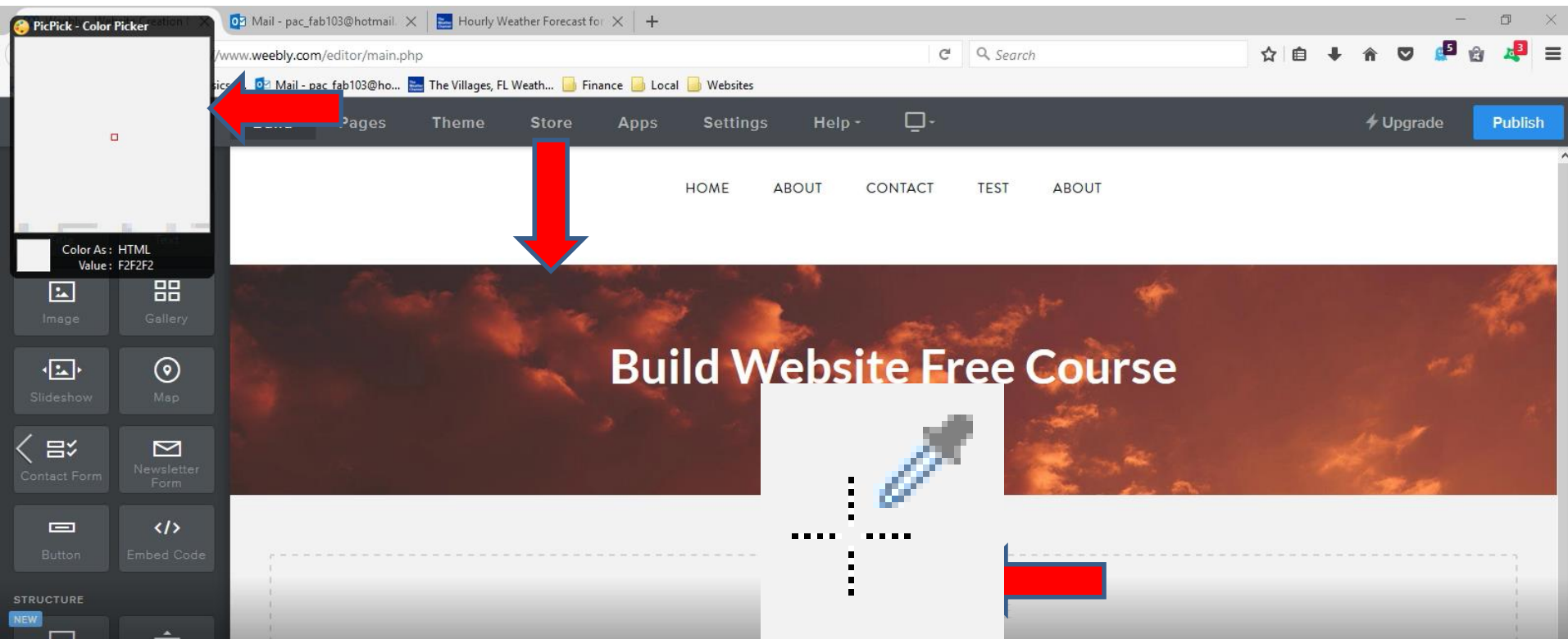


- You right click on the Icon the taskbar and you see a list.
- Then click on Color Picker.
- Next is what happens.

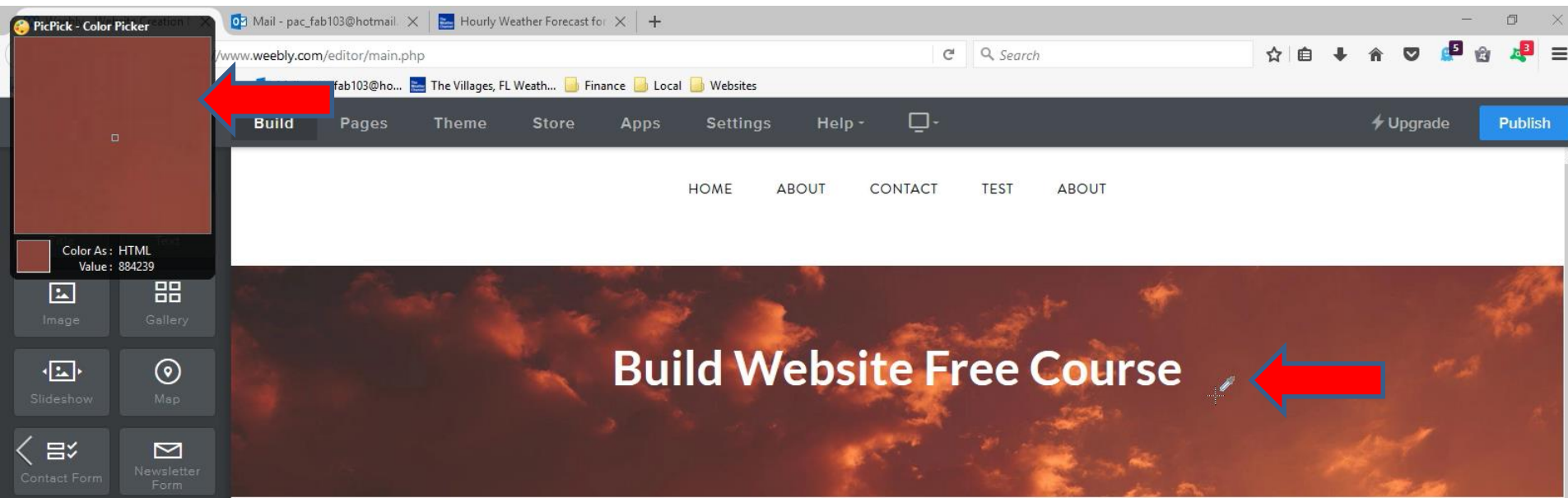
- A new window opens in the upper left on top of your Weebly account. You see the Header we created. It also changes the Cursor.
- Next, I will zoom in so you can see the Cursor.



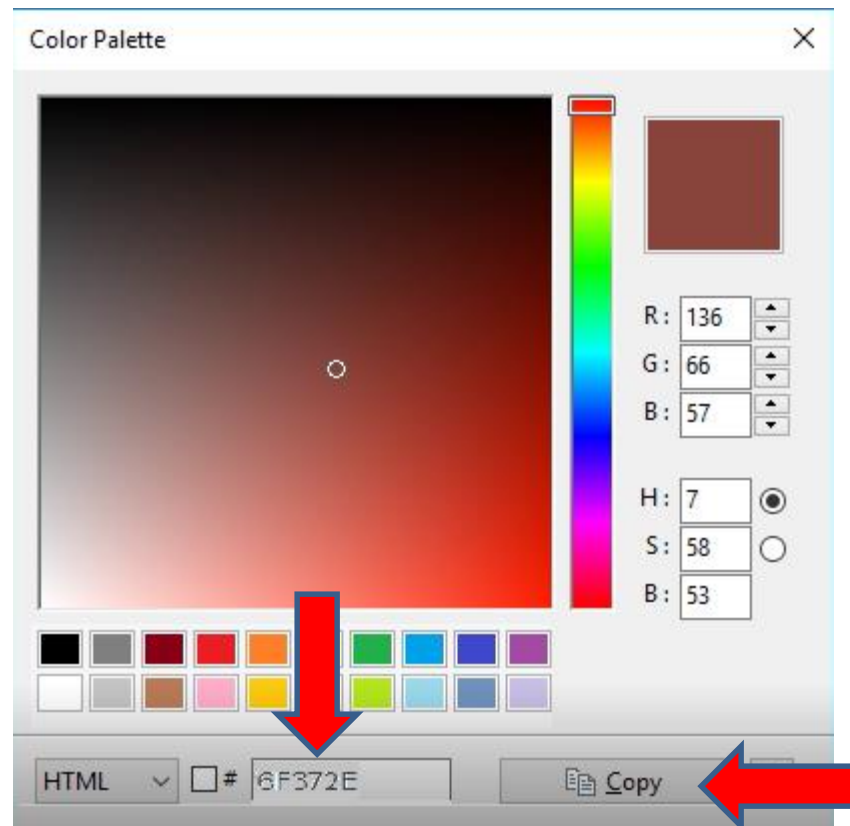
- I zoomed in so you can see the Cursor.
- You then move the Cursor to a place on the image you want to select the Color.
- Next is a sample.



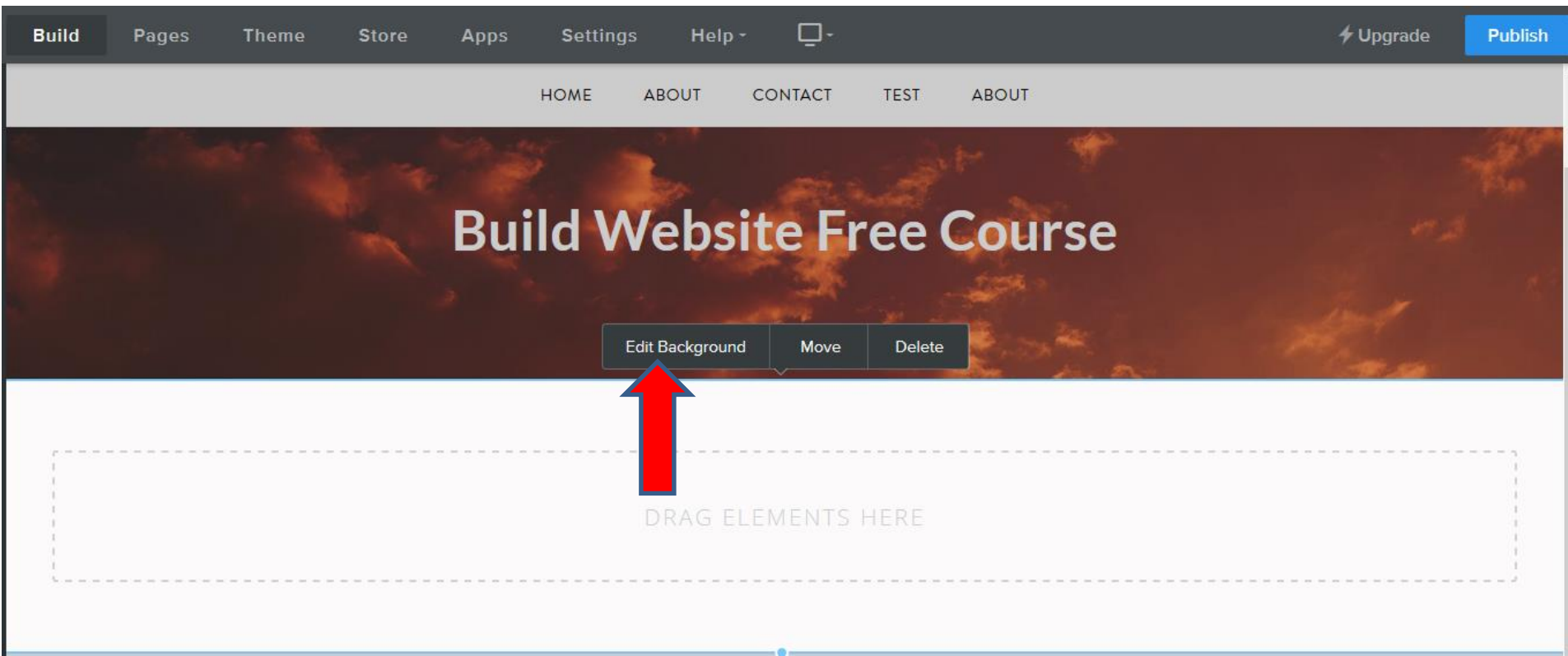
- **Once you move the Cursor to a place on the image, the window shows the color.**
- **Once you find it, click on the image and next is what happens.**



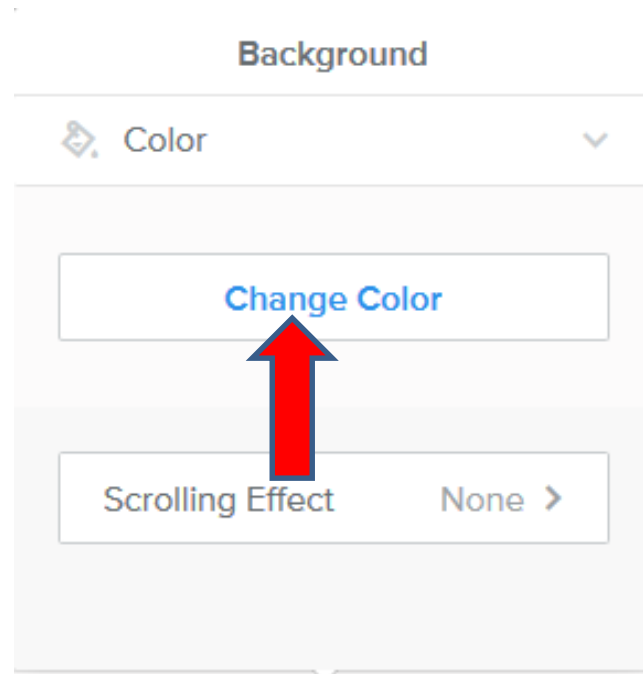
- **PicPick opens in a New Window and you see the Code of the Color and click on Copy.**
- **Later, I will show you how to Paste the Code in the Background Color.**
- **Next is click on the Section below the image, which is next.**



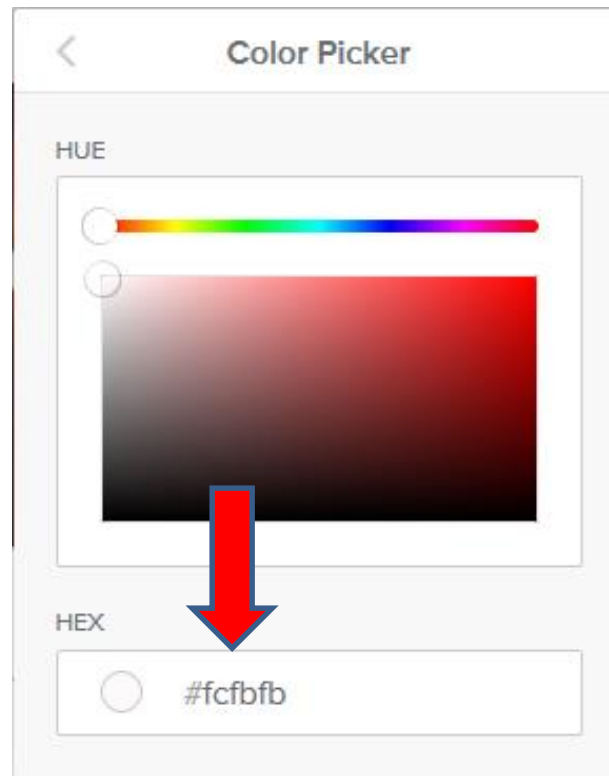
- **When you click on the Section below the image, you see Edit Background as I showed you in Step 2 – Part 2.**
- **Click on Edit Background again and next is what happens.**



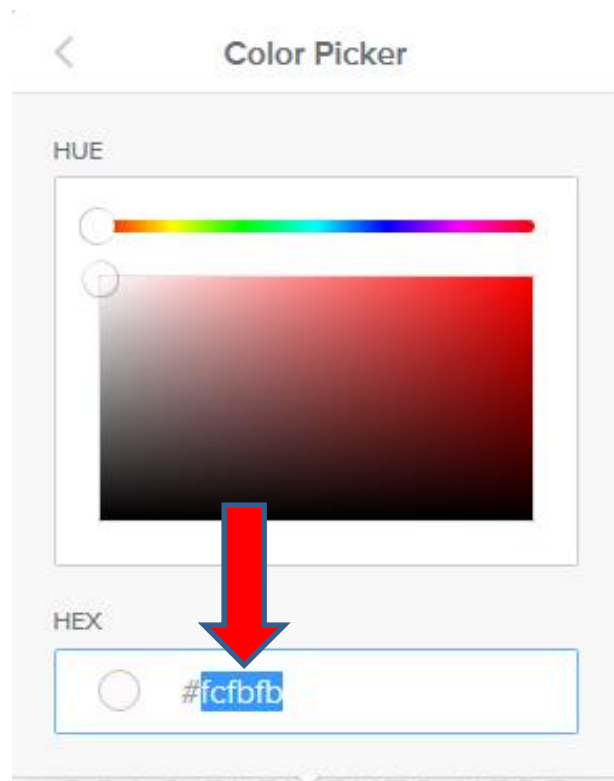
- **New window opens as I showed you in Step 2 – Part 2.**
- **Click on Change Color and next is what happens.**



- **Window changes as I showed you in Step 2 – Part 2.**
- **You see Code on the bottom. You then highlight it, which is next.**



- You see it highlight. You can right click on it and click on paste or just press and hold the Ctrl Key and click on the V Key to paste.
- Next is what happens when you paste.



- Once you paste, you see the Background Color changed.
- You can follow the same process to Pick another Color.
