

# Step 12 – Edit Video

## Part A - Trim Video

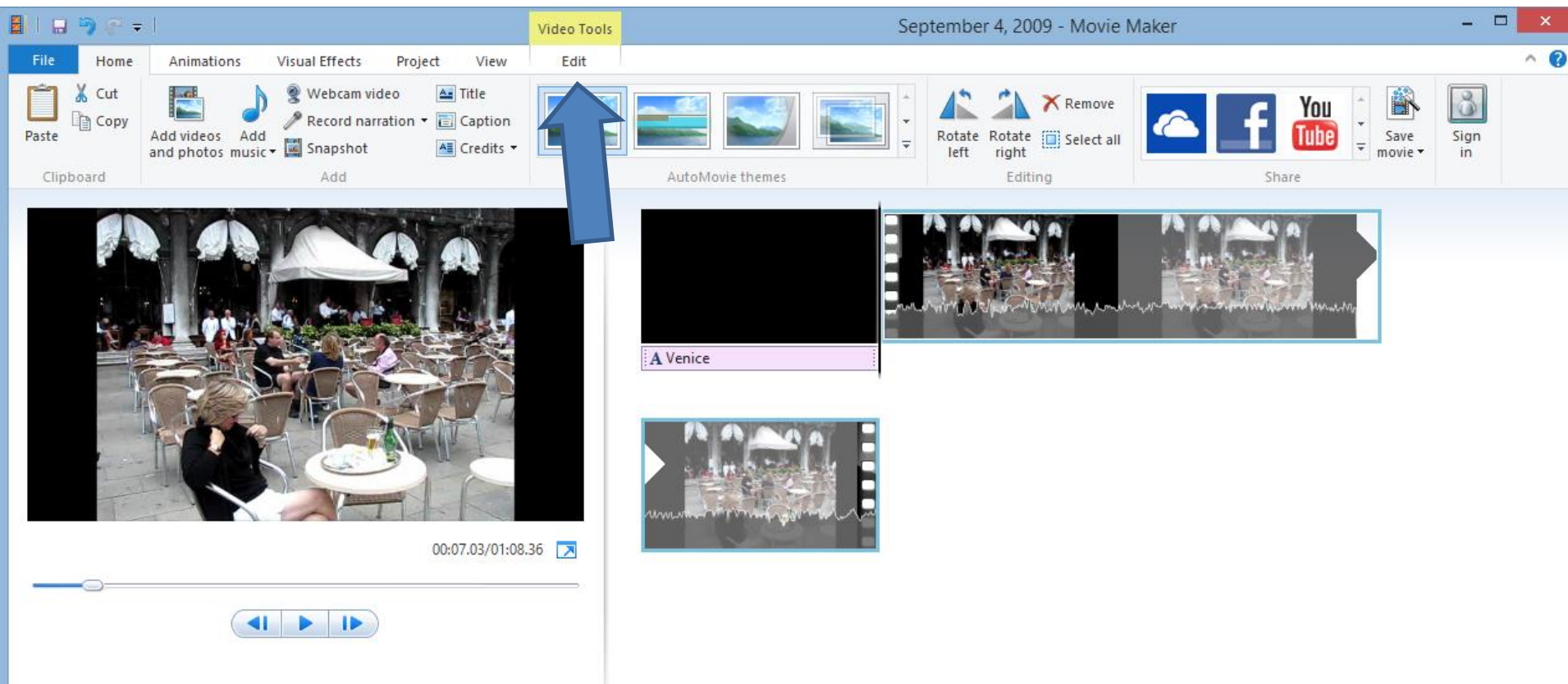
- Trim Video changes the starting point and ending point. Two options to start. One – double click on the video. Next is the Second option.

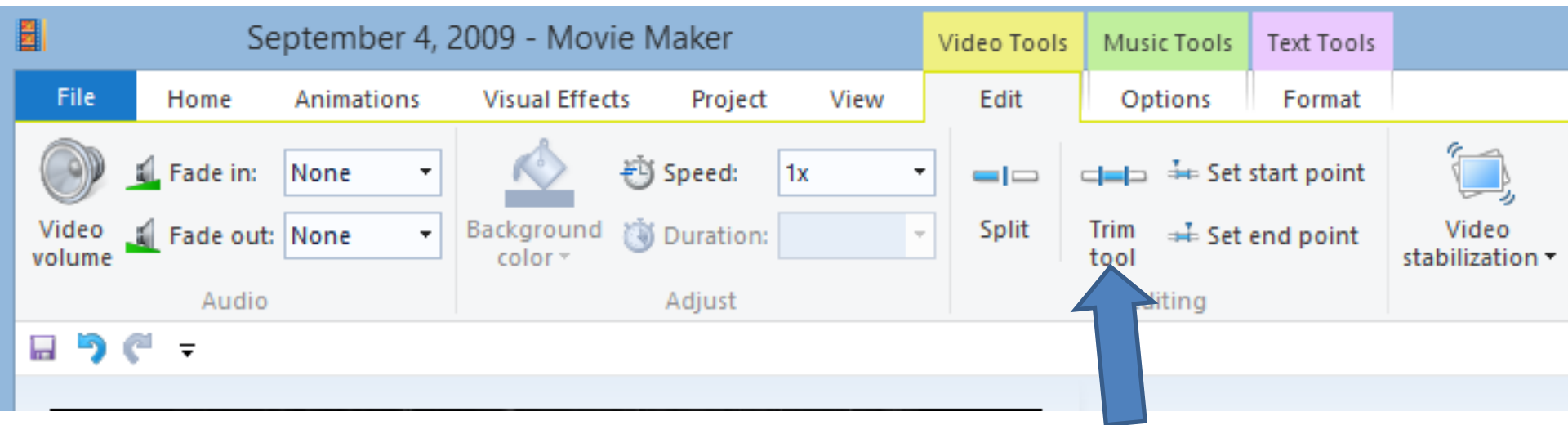

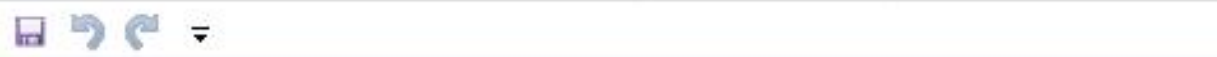
