

Step 12 - Part D – Add Other Tile?

- **Note – I suggest you do Undo again to put the video back.**
- **One reason to add a Title is if you added two videos from vacations and you wanted to add a title of different location.**
- **Second reason is if you split and want to add a title of the area you split.**
- **Next is to Add Title as I showed you how to do it before in Step 5 – Part C. It is the same process.**

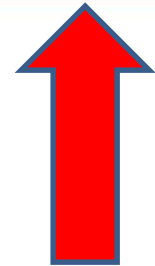
- Part D – Add Other Title

- Next is to Add Title again.



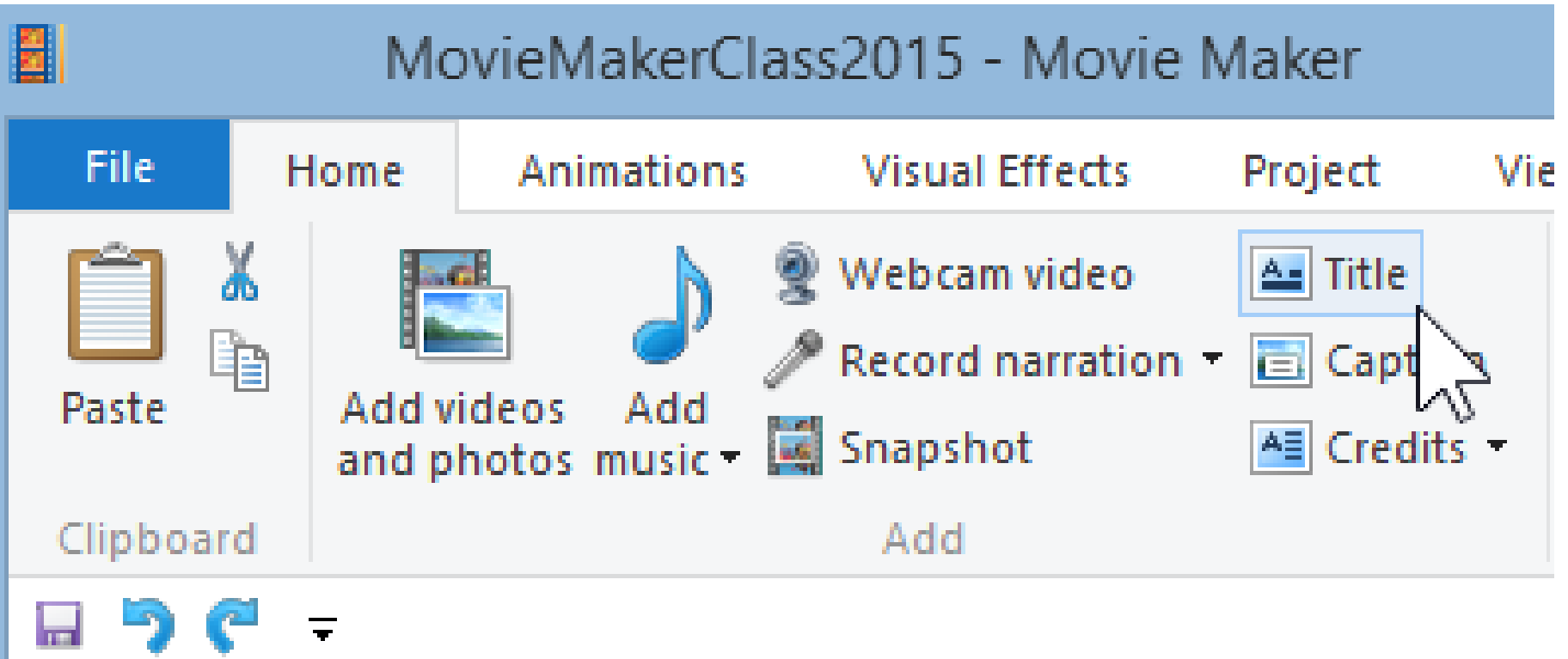

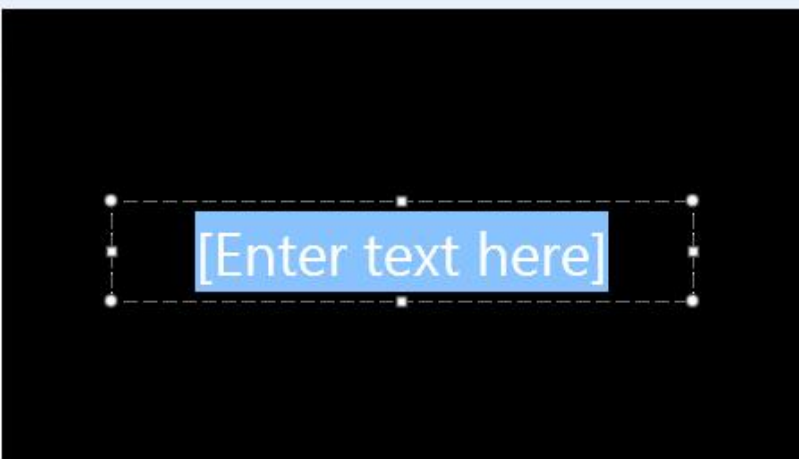
A Venice

- Next explains add Photo option.

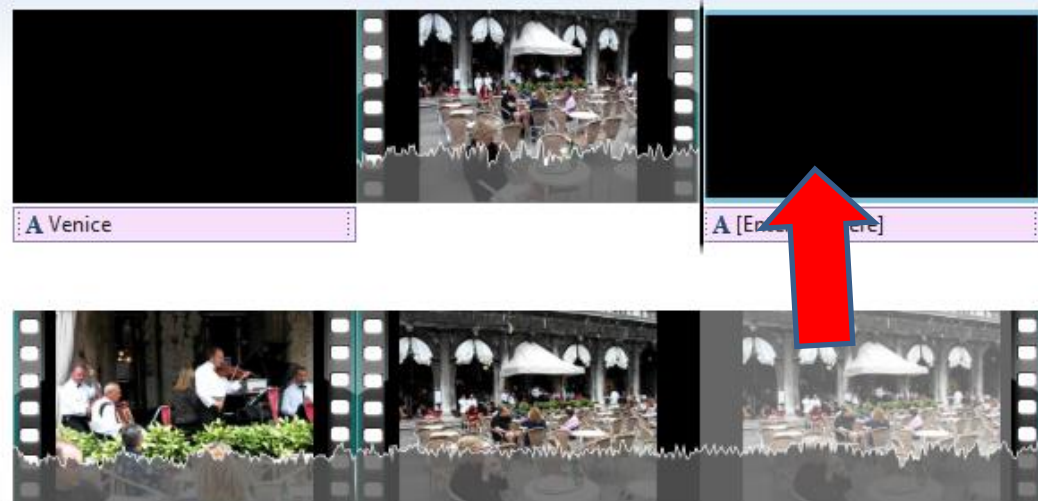
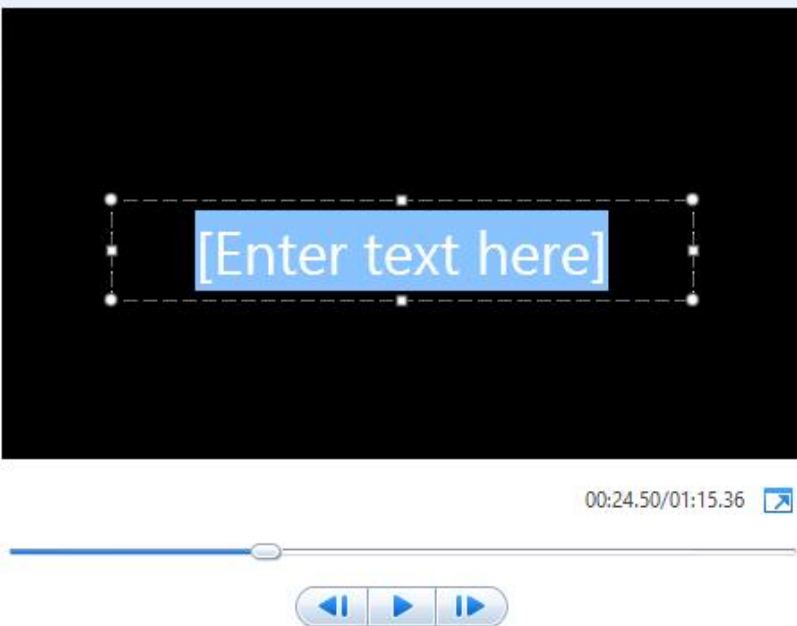

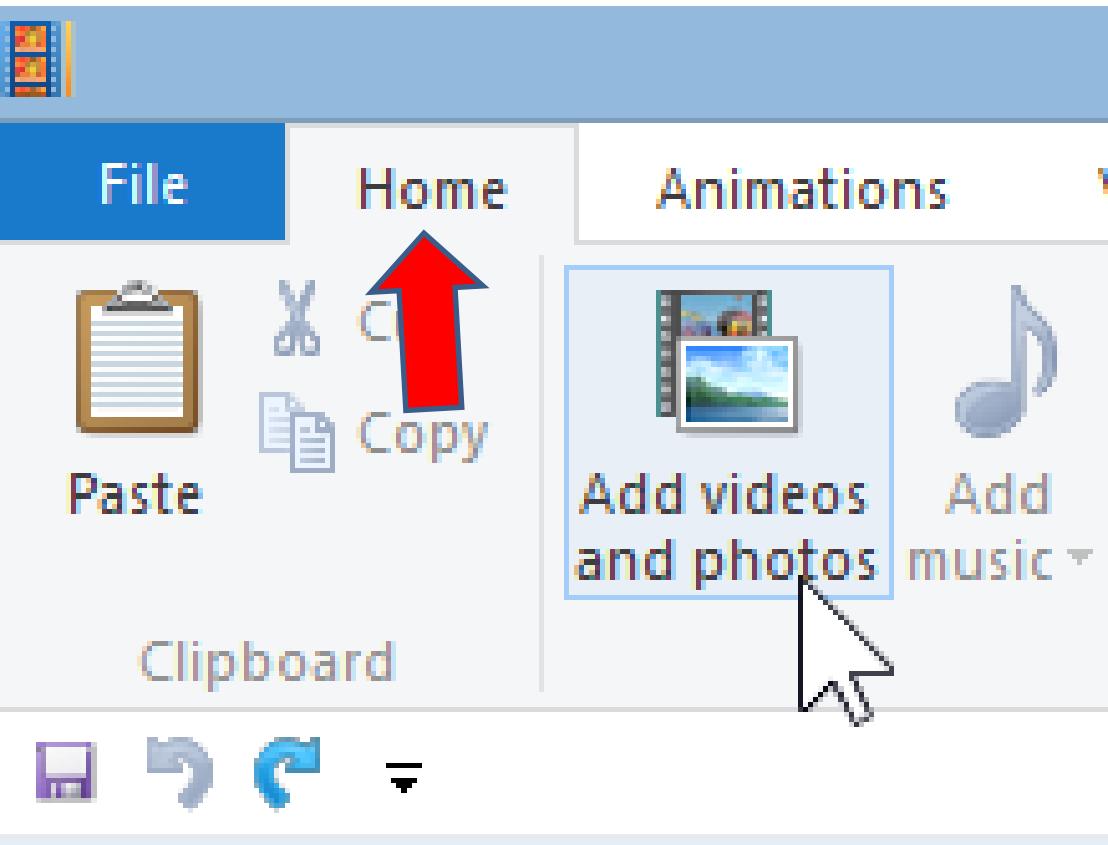


- **You have two options to add Photo between the split.**
- **The first option is to add Photo from your computer, as we did add Photos in the first course.**
- **The second option is snapshot the Video and it makes a Photo. Part D shows you how to do that.**
- **Next is the first option.**

- **First click on the new Title.**
- **Next is to add Photo.**

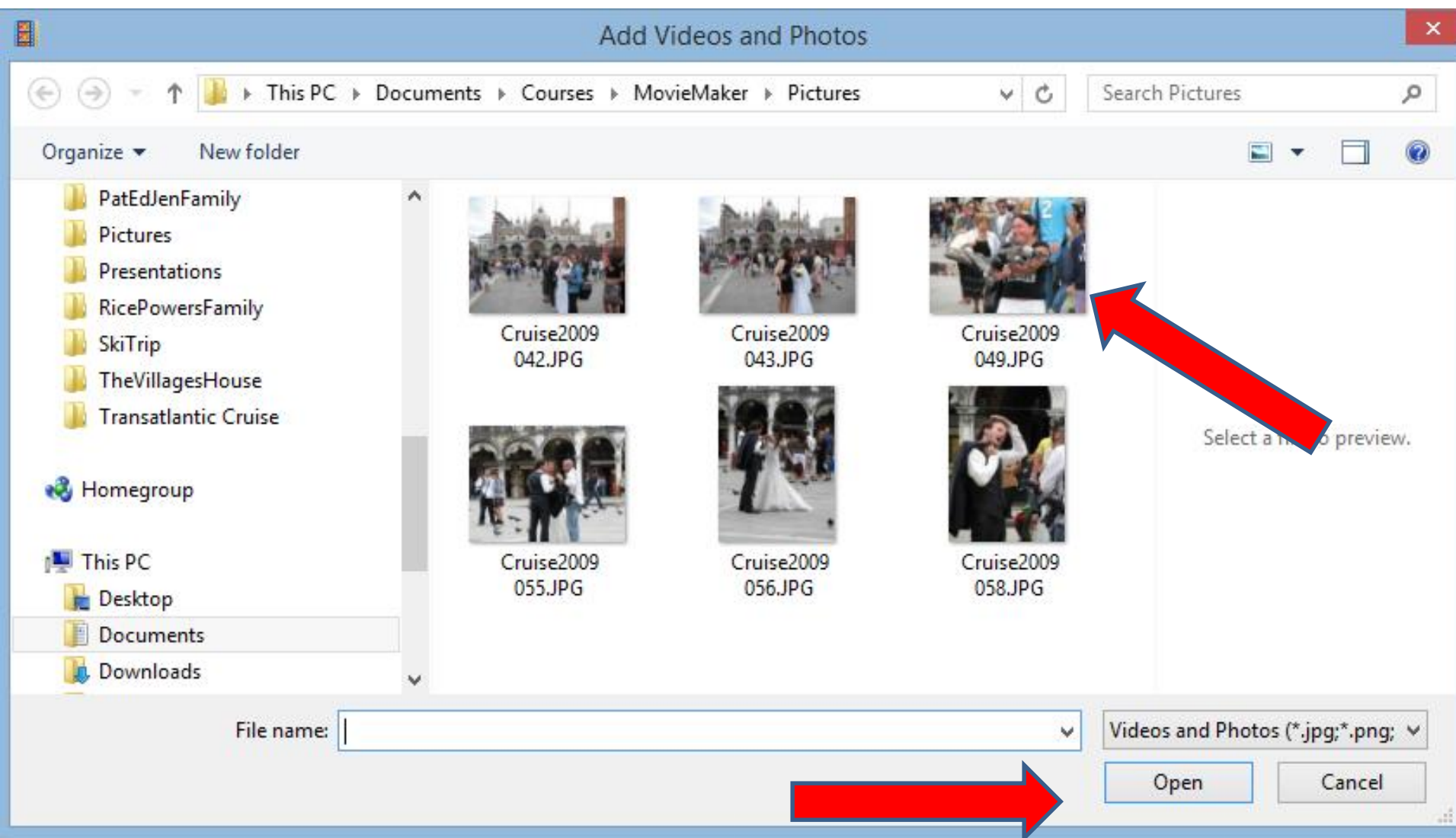


Make sure you are on the Home Tap and then click on Add videos and photos.



- File Explorer opens.
- Find the folder with a photo you want.
- Next is a sample.

Double click on one. Or just click on it and then click on Open and next is what happens.



You then see it.

- **Note – if you add a caption in Photo Gallery, it does not show on the picture. But, it shows in on Movie Maker. This is the End of Step 12 - Part D.**
