- **First you save your Movie in Movie Maker.**
- **Second, you open DVD Maker, which I will show you how to open.**

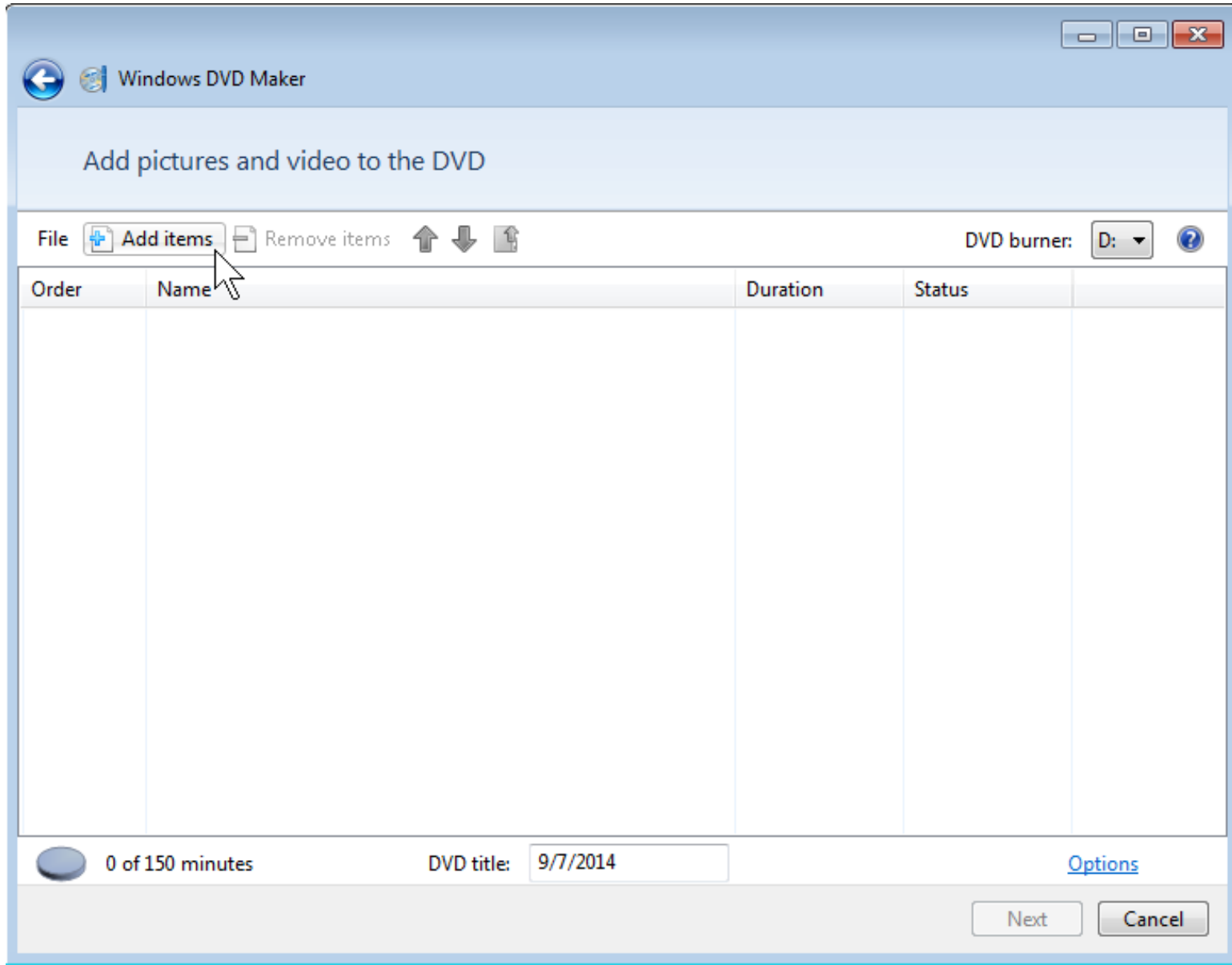

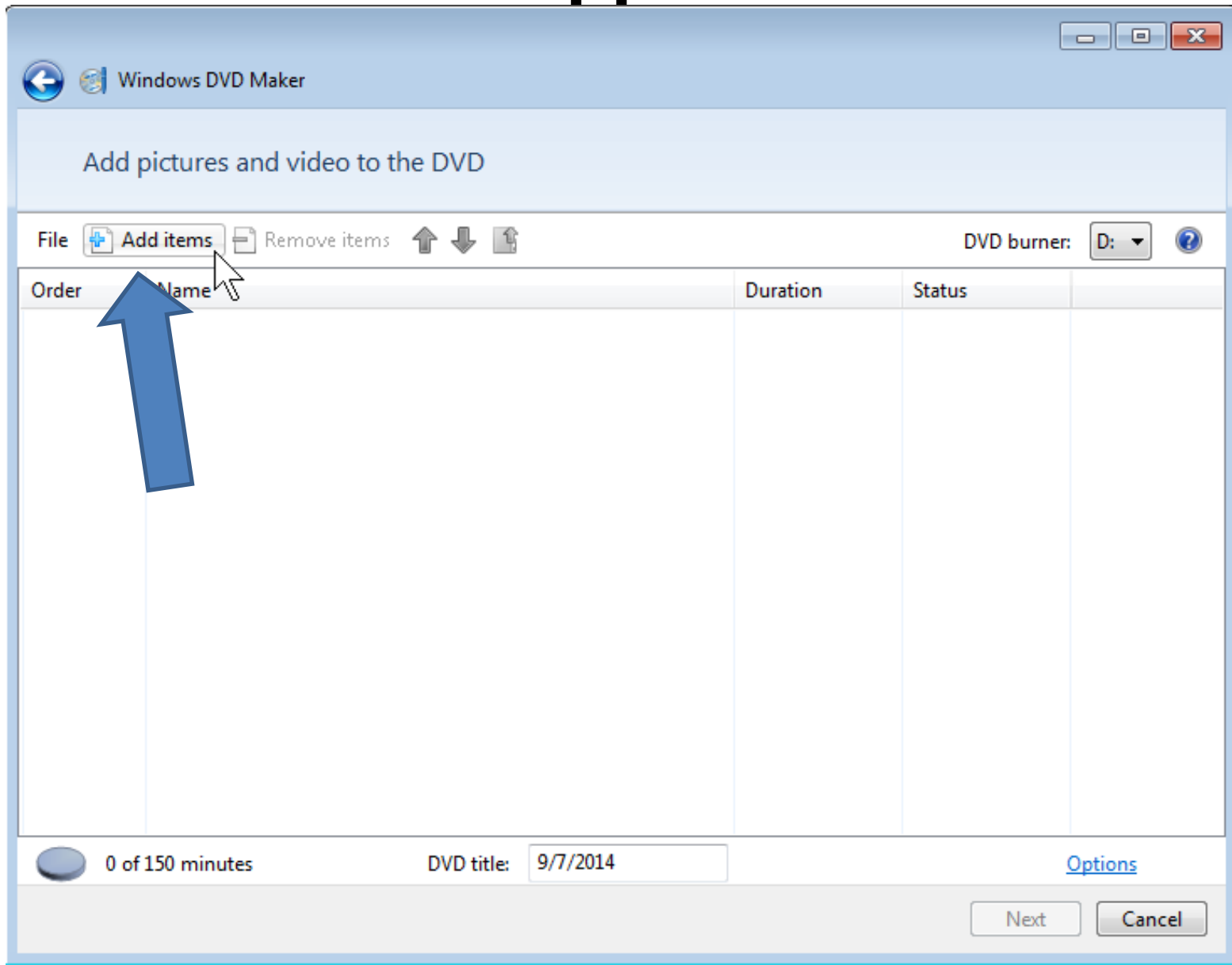


- Click on Start Menu in Windows 7.
- Then Type in DVD.

- Then click on it and next is what happens.

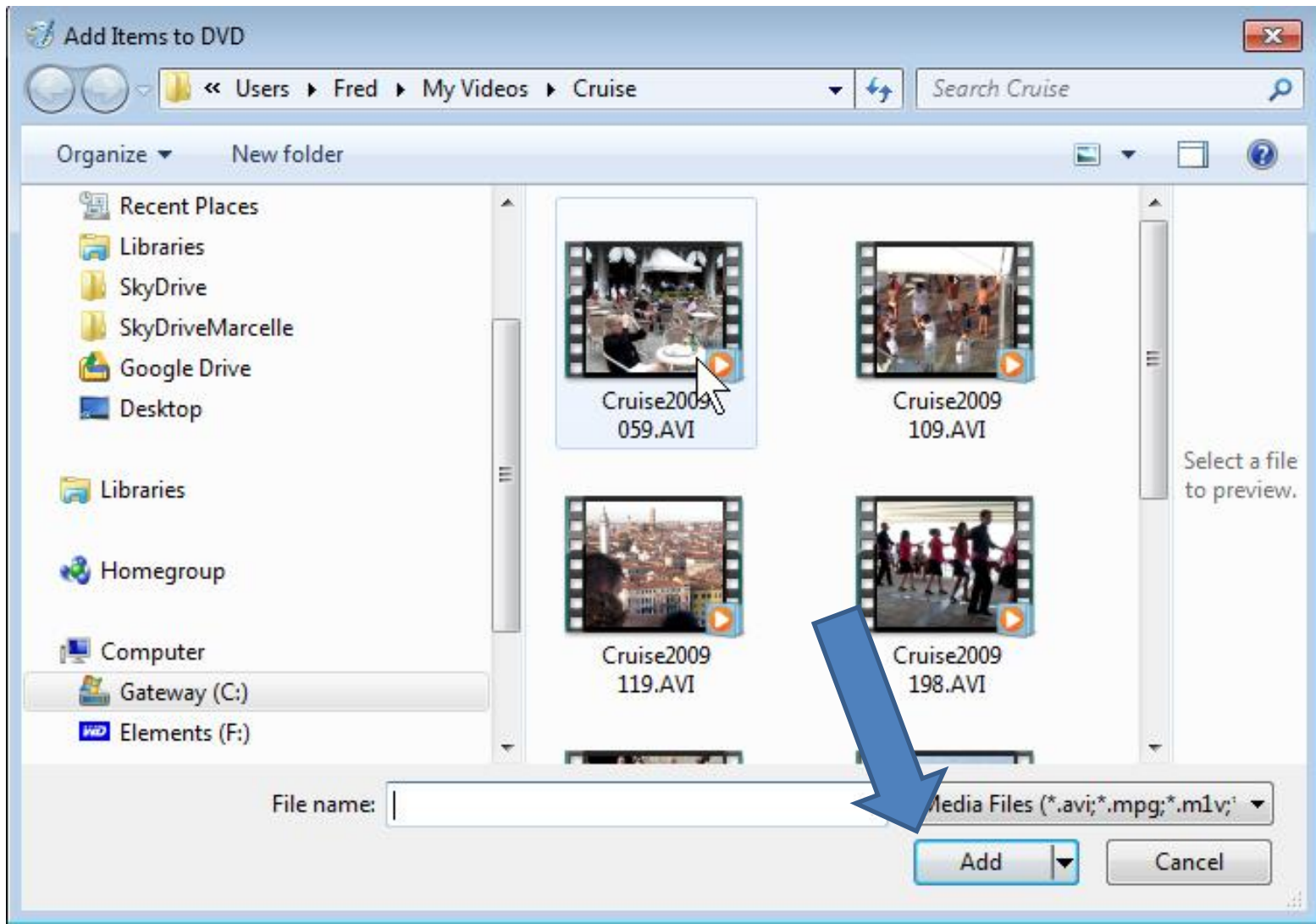
Windows DVD Maker Opens, next is what to do.



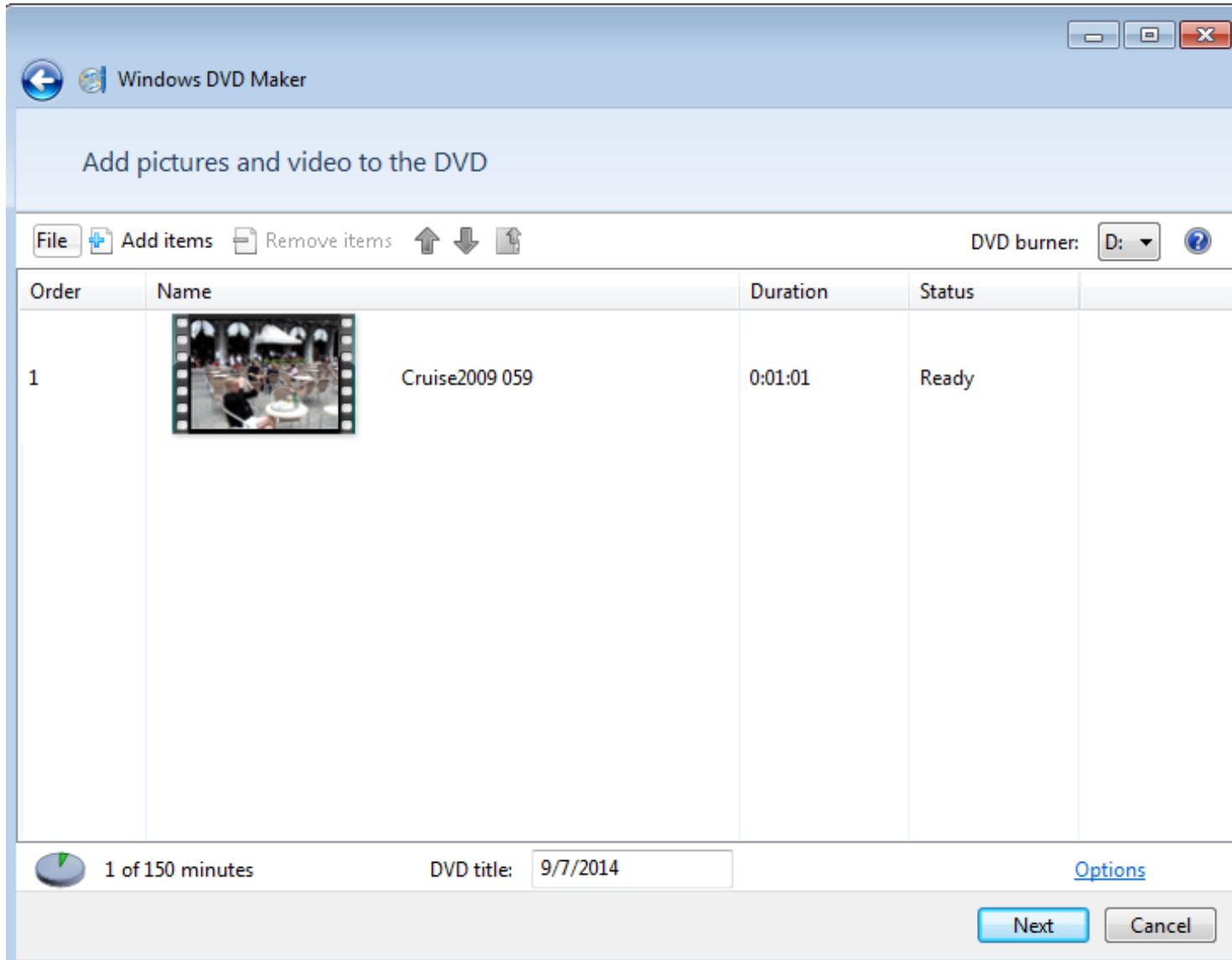
Click on Add items and next is what happens.

You then see it in Windows DVD Maker. Next is about Movie Maker 2011 version.

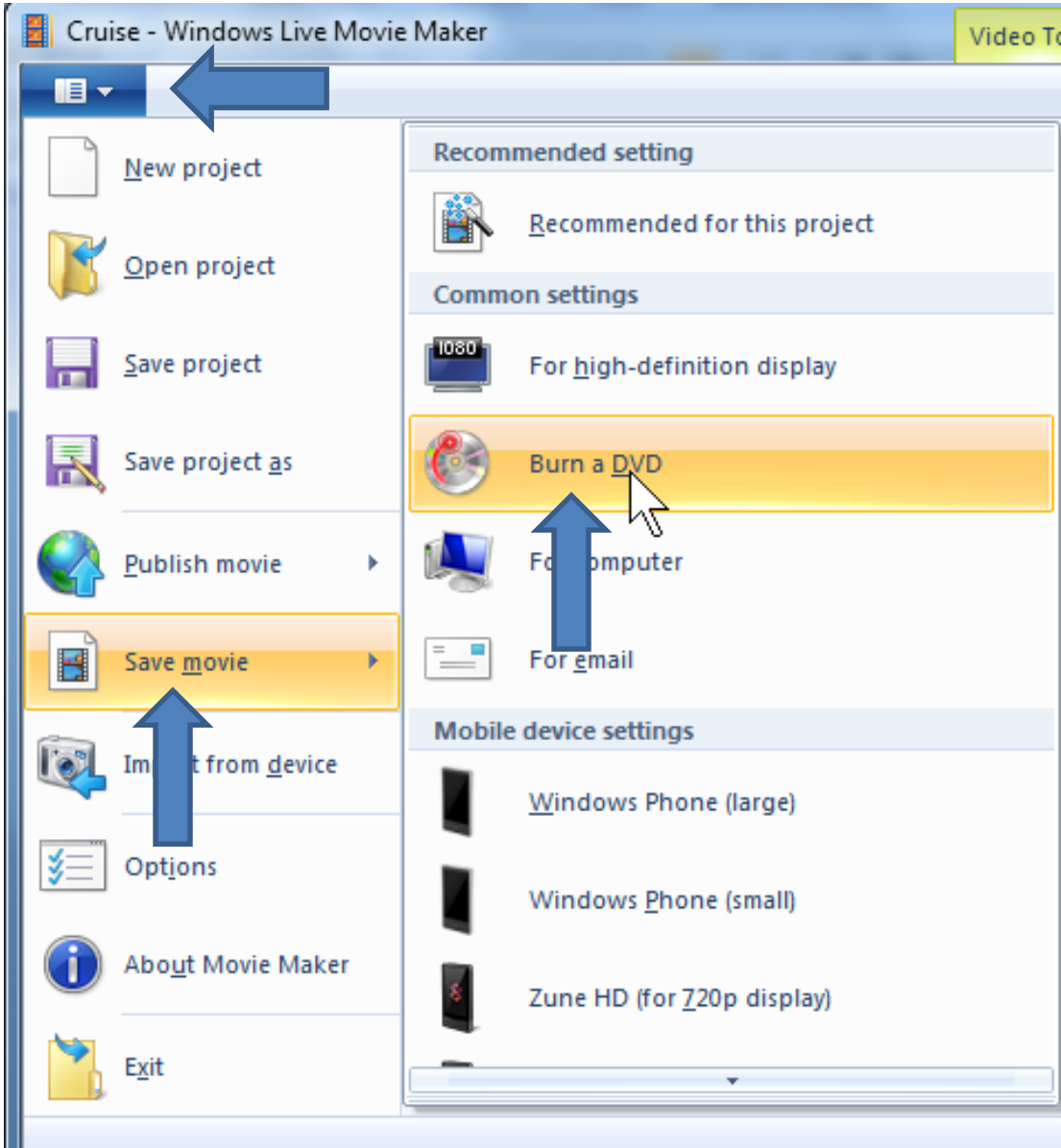


Part A – Add a Movie to DVD Maker

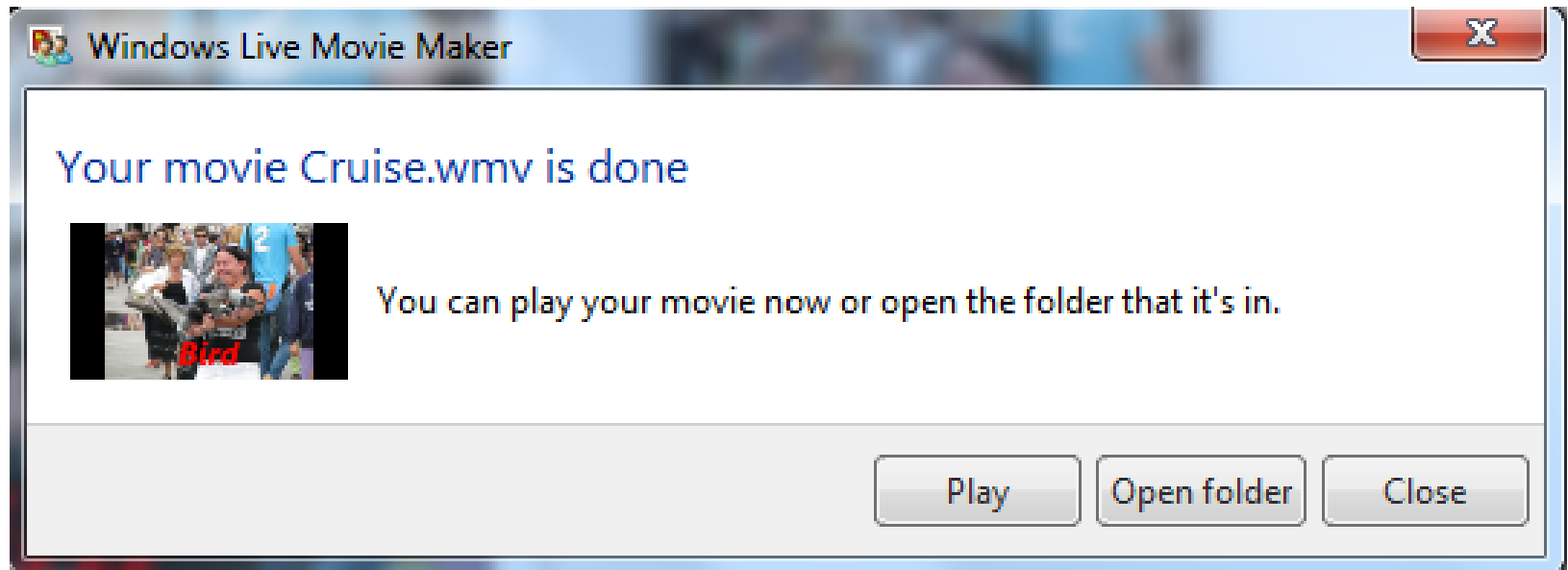
- **Next, I am going to show you how to add a Movie to DVD Maker with Movie Maker 2011 version.**

• As I showed you before, click on the Icon in the upper left. Then hover over Save Movie and click

on Burn a DVD and next what happens.



- A new window opens and once it is complete, you will see it is done, but very quickly, DVD Maker shows up over the top of it, which is next.



- You will then see your Movie in DVD Maker. This is the End of Step 16 – Part A.
