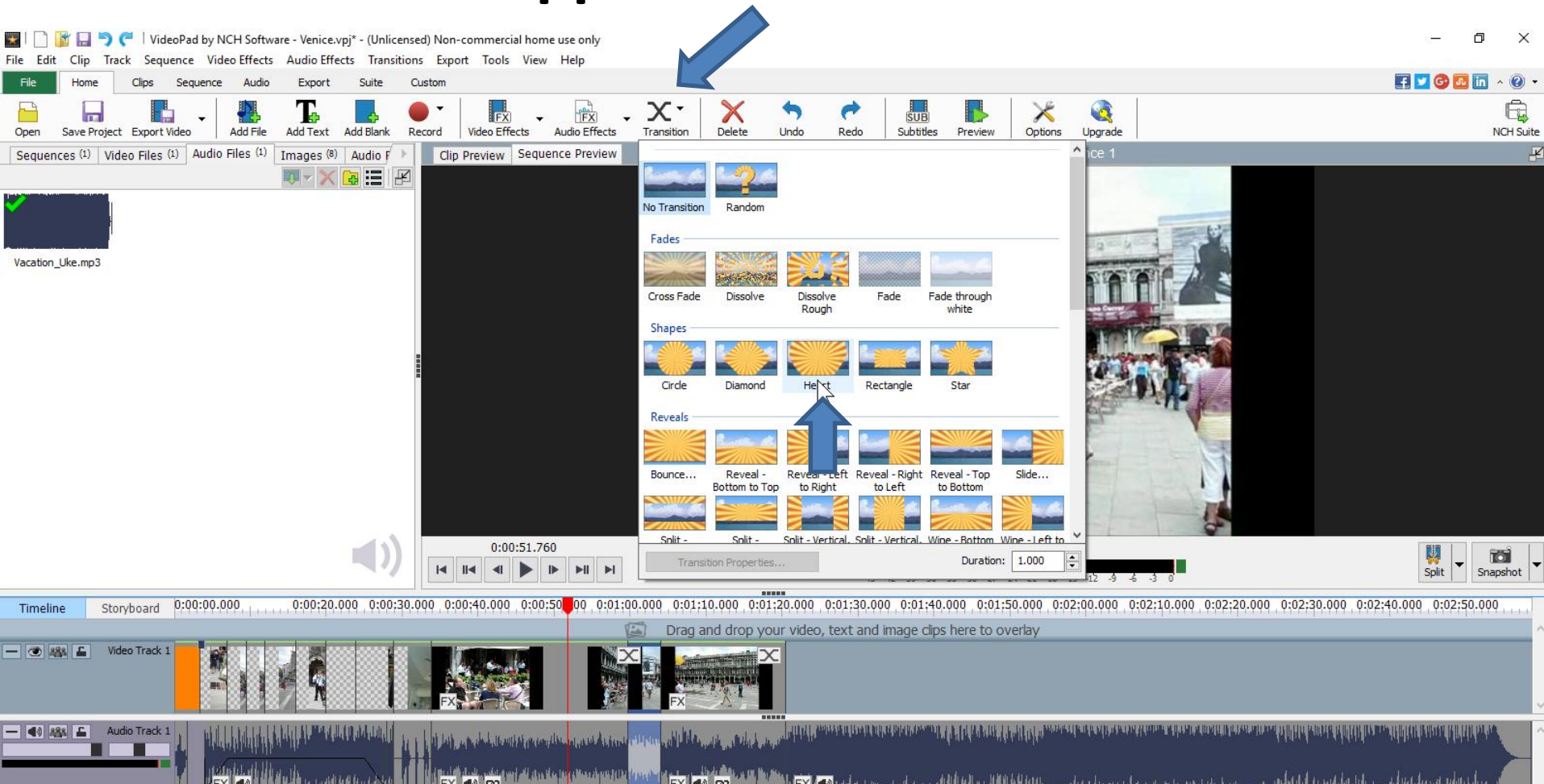


Step 10 – Edit Videos

Part C – Change Transitions, Video Effects.

- You may not want to Change Transitions and Video Effects on a Video vs. images.**
- You follow the same process as images.**
- As I mentioned before, you can Change Transitions or Video Effect on different parts of the Video, when you Split.**
- Next is what happens when you split that I did before and I did undo so it is split two times.**

- You first click on the video that was split two times and then click on Transition and then click on the one you want, like Heart.
- Next is what happens.



- A new window opens and I recommend you click on the second one.
- Next is what happens.

Clip Transitioning

One or more clips need a handle for this transition

Please select one of the following resolutions:

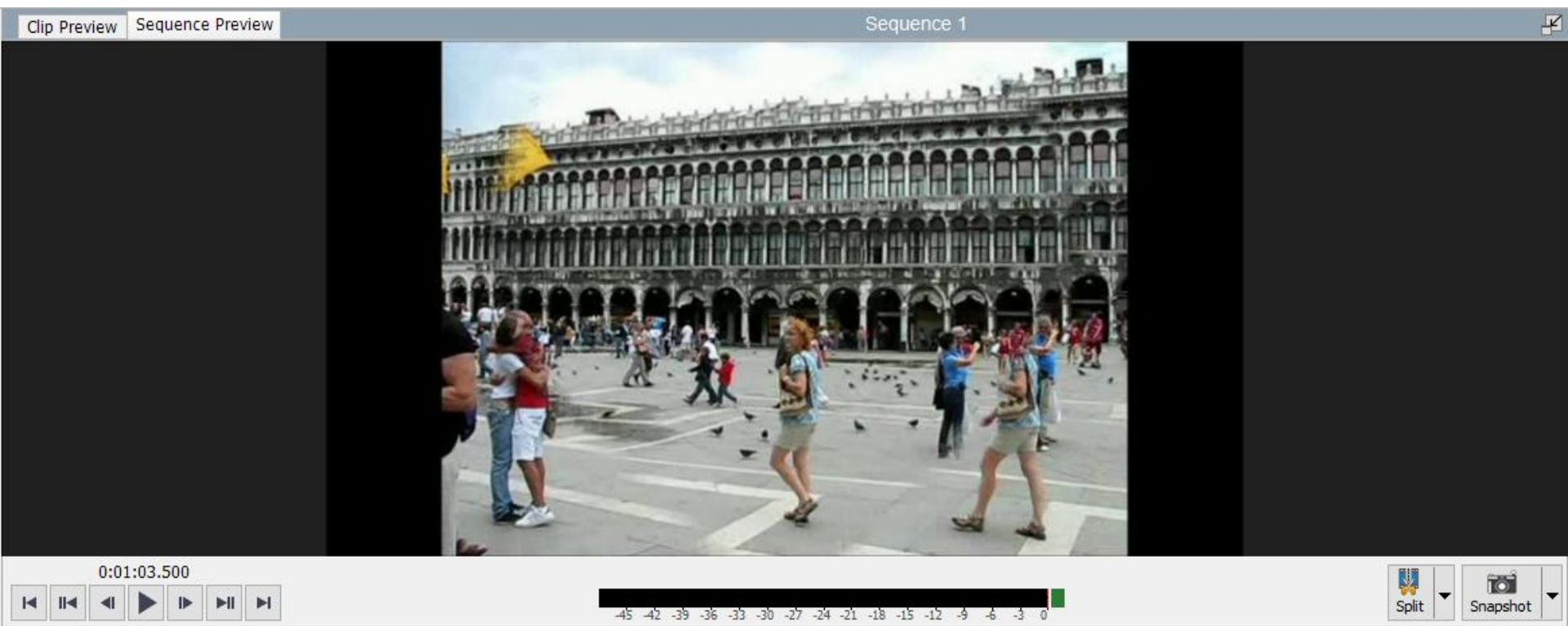
→ Freeze clip location
This option prevents clips from changing position in the sequence timeline. When possible, the video will be extended. Otherwise, the first or last frame will be used for the duration of the transition.

→ Move clip location
This method changes the position of the clip on the timeline to cover the duration of the transition. This creates a smoother transition.

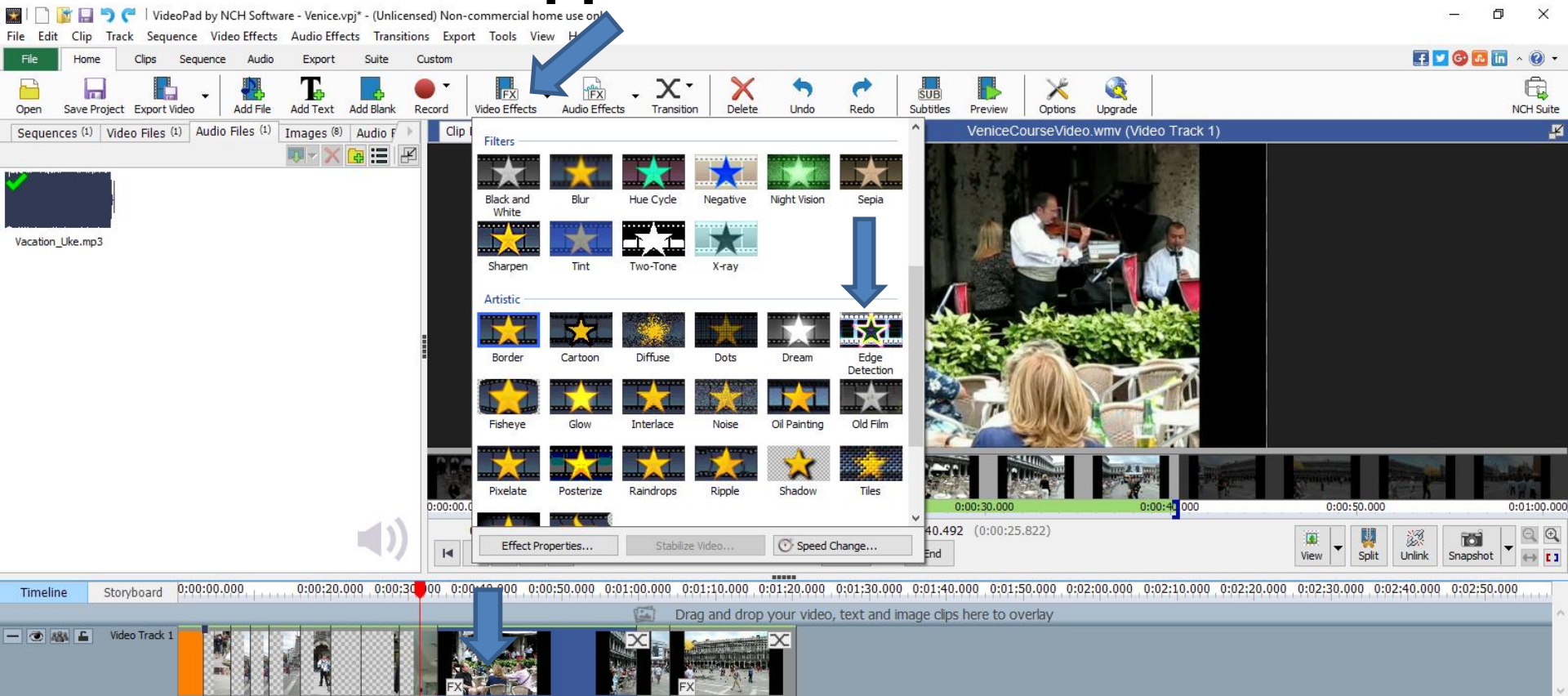
Always use this choice and do not ask again



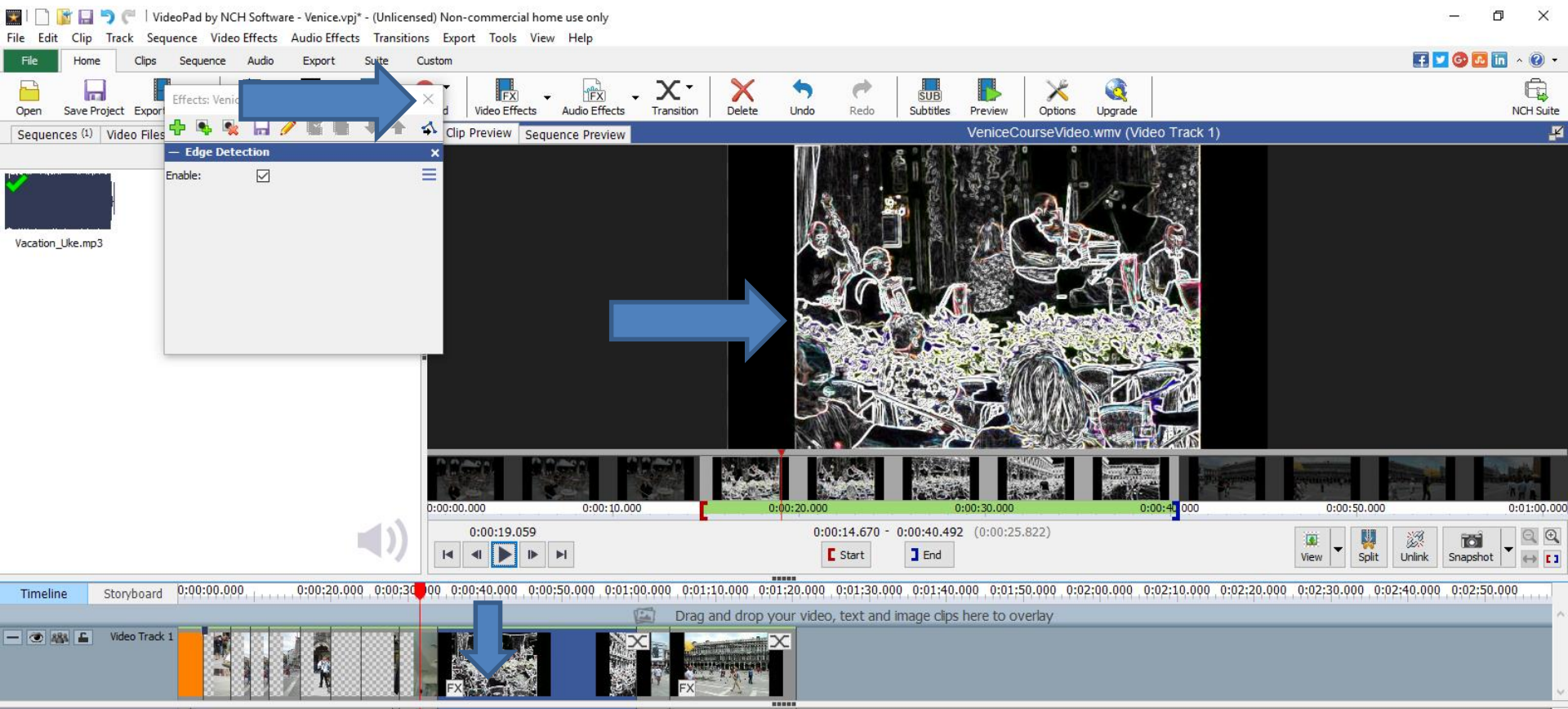
- It adds the Transition to the next video. When you play, you will see it, but not as much background in an image.
- Next is Video Effects.



- You click on the video you want to add Video Effects, like the first one, and then click on Video Effects and you see a list.
- I scrolled down and clicked on Edge Detection.
- Next is what happens.



- A new window opens that shows Edge Detection that you can close on the X in the upper right.
- When you play you see the Edge Detection Effects.
- As I mentioned you may not like it.
