- **DVD Maker comes with Windows 7. It does not work with Windows 8 or 10.**
- **You can export a Video on VideoPad in Windows 7 to your computer, which is Step 8.**
- **First I will show you how to open DVD Maker in Windows 7.**

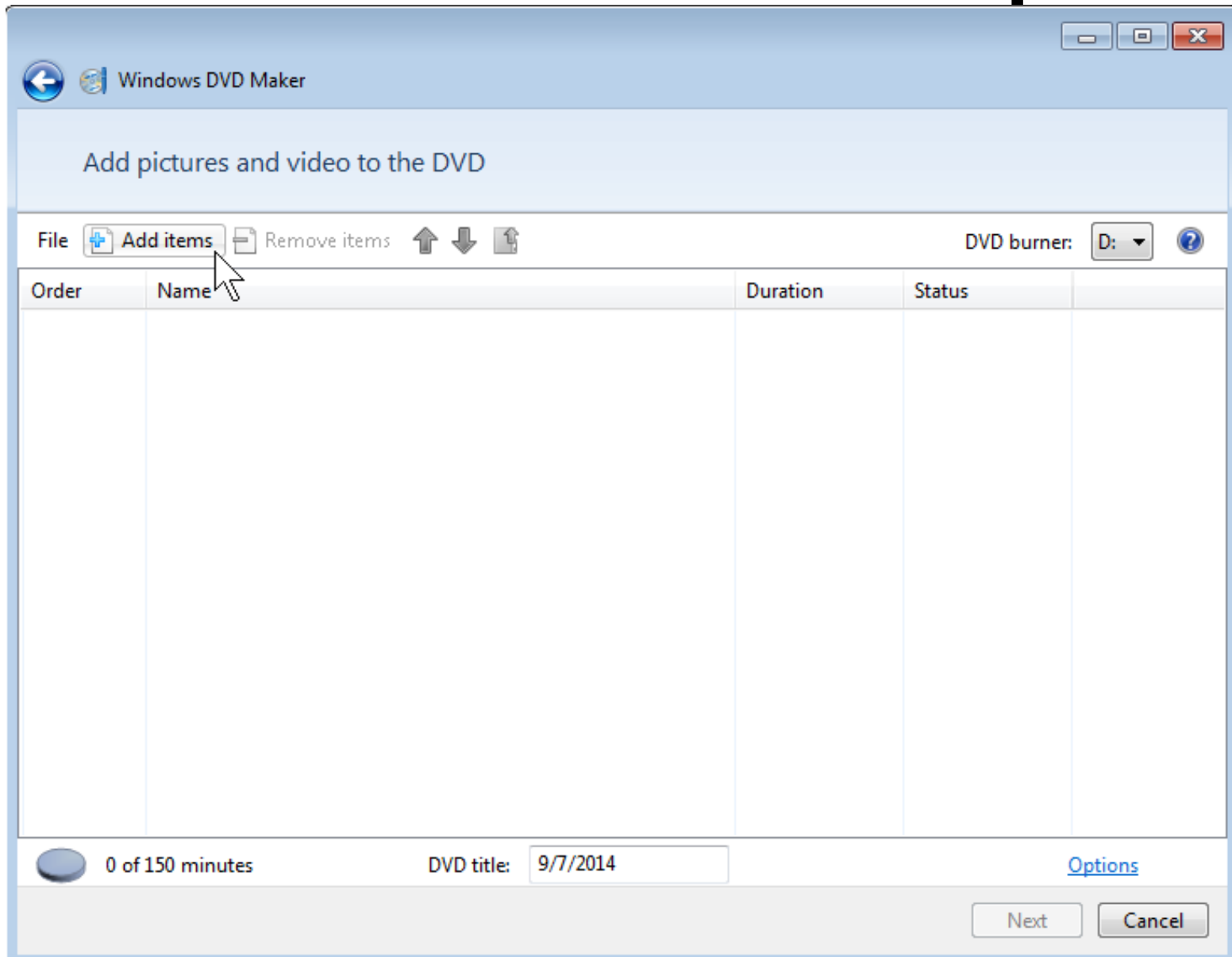

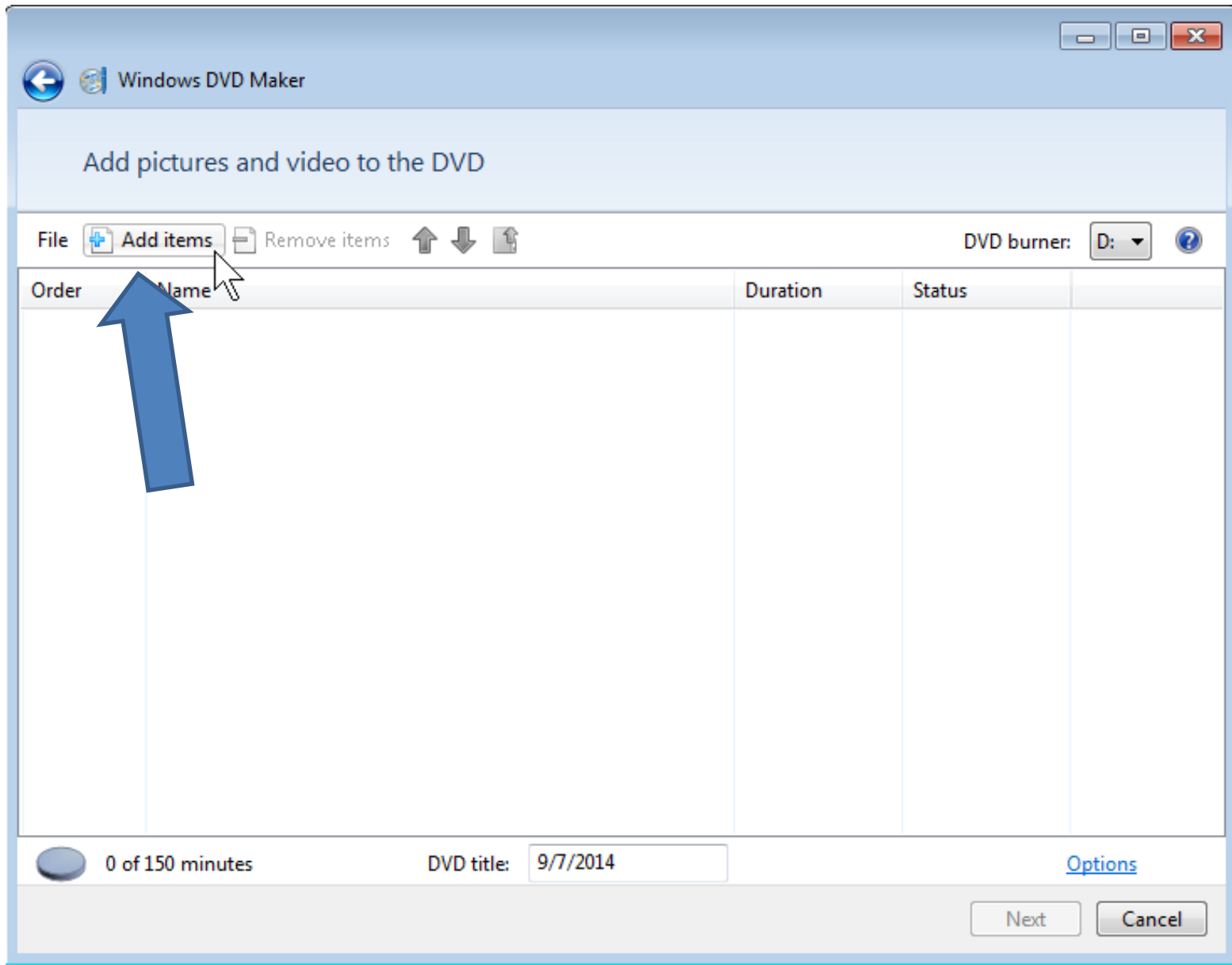
- **Click on Start Menu in Windows 7.**

- **Then click on it.**



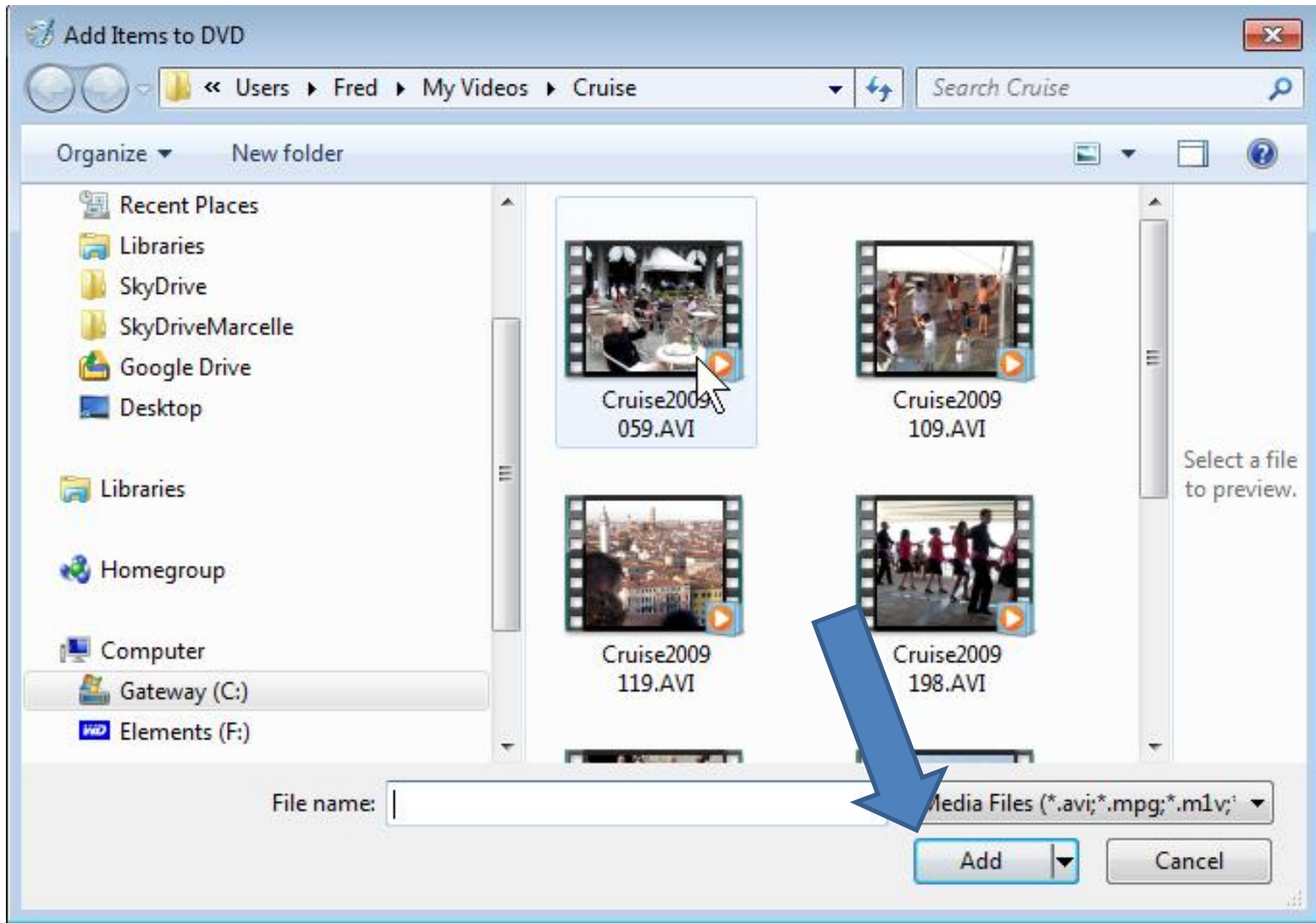
Windows DVD Maker Opens



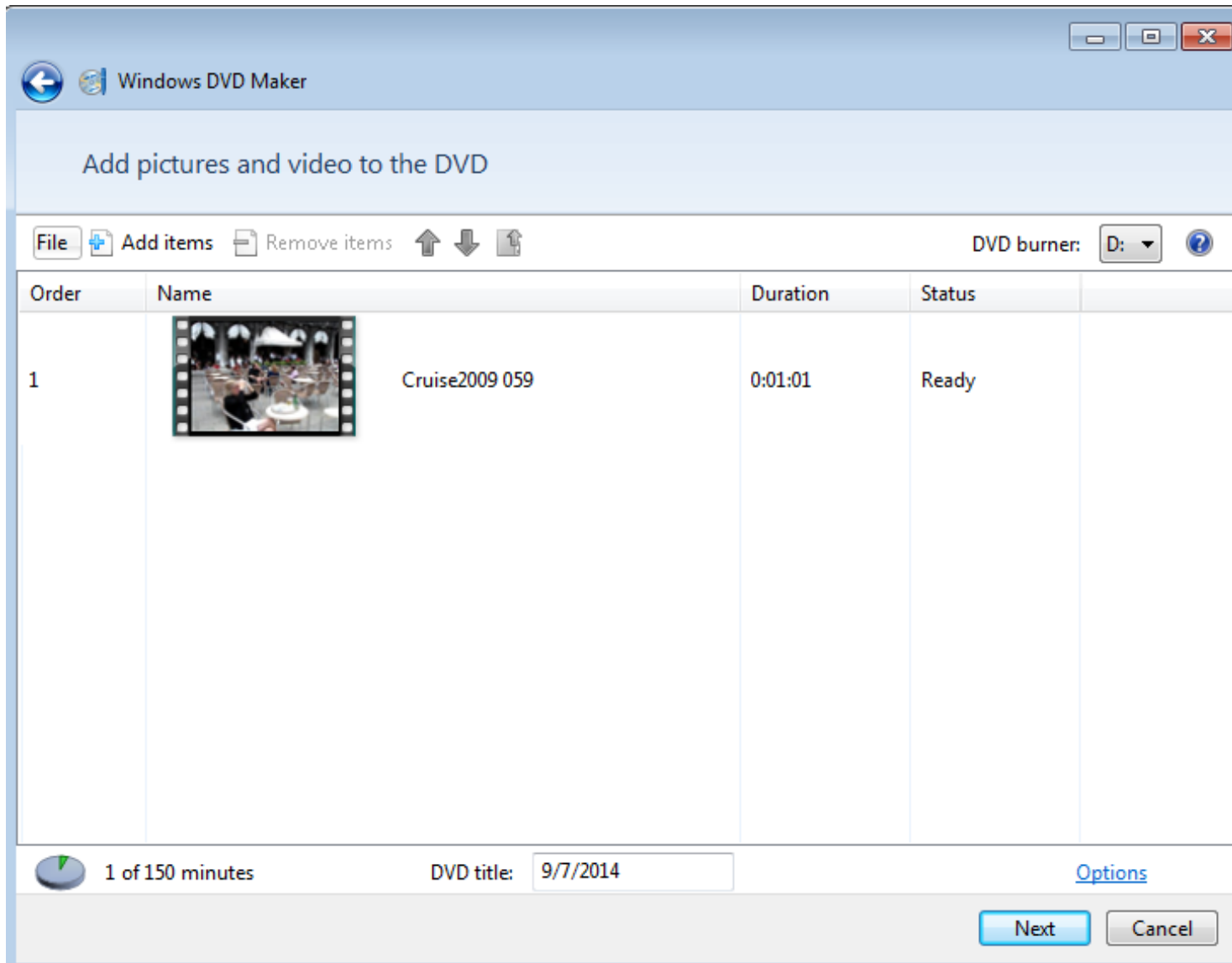
Click on Add items



Windows Explorer Open – Find the folder with the Video and click on it and click on Add.

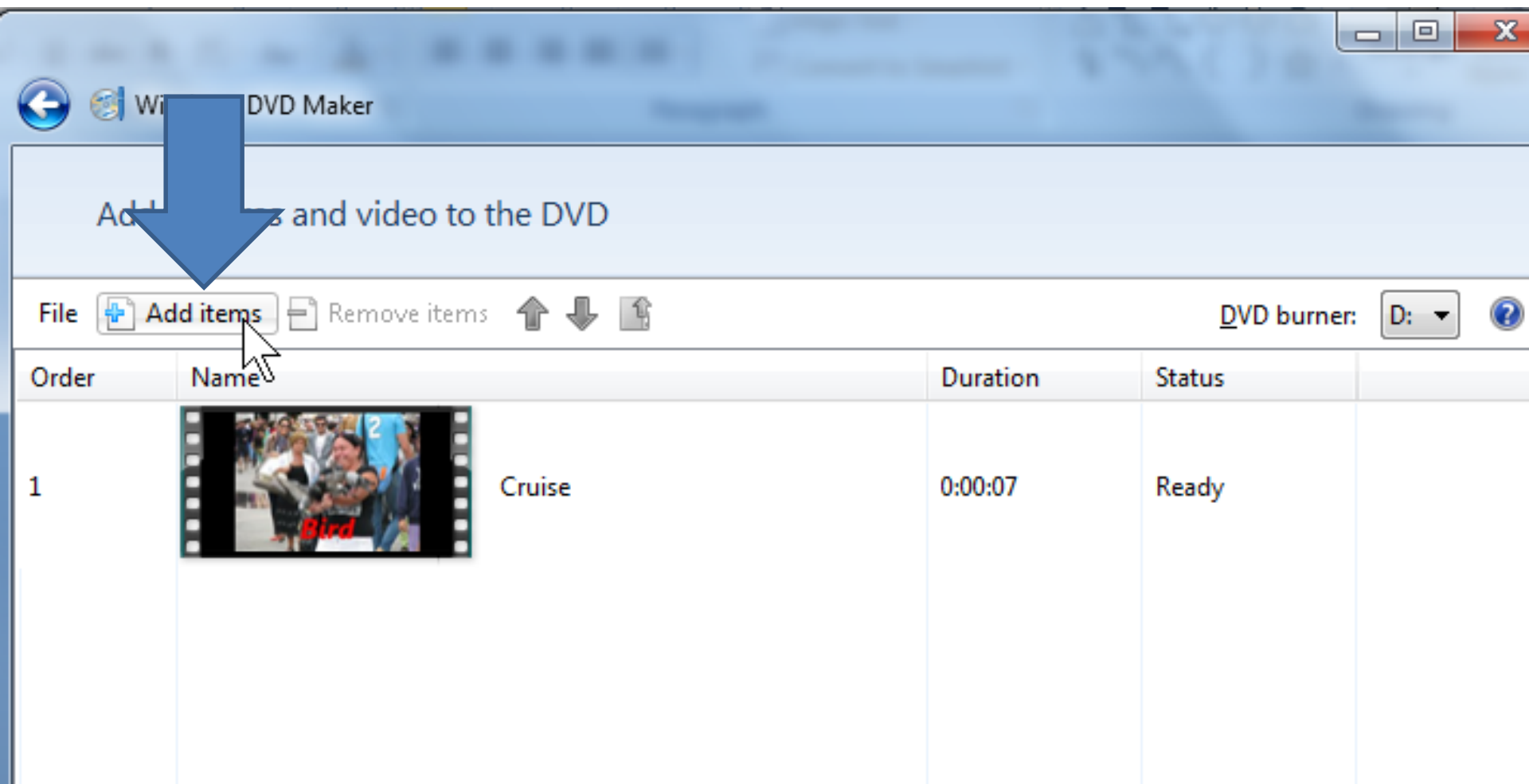


You then see it in Windows DVD Maker

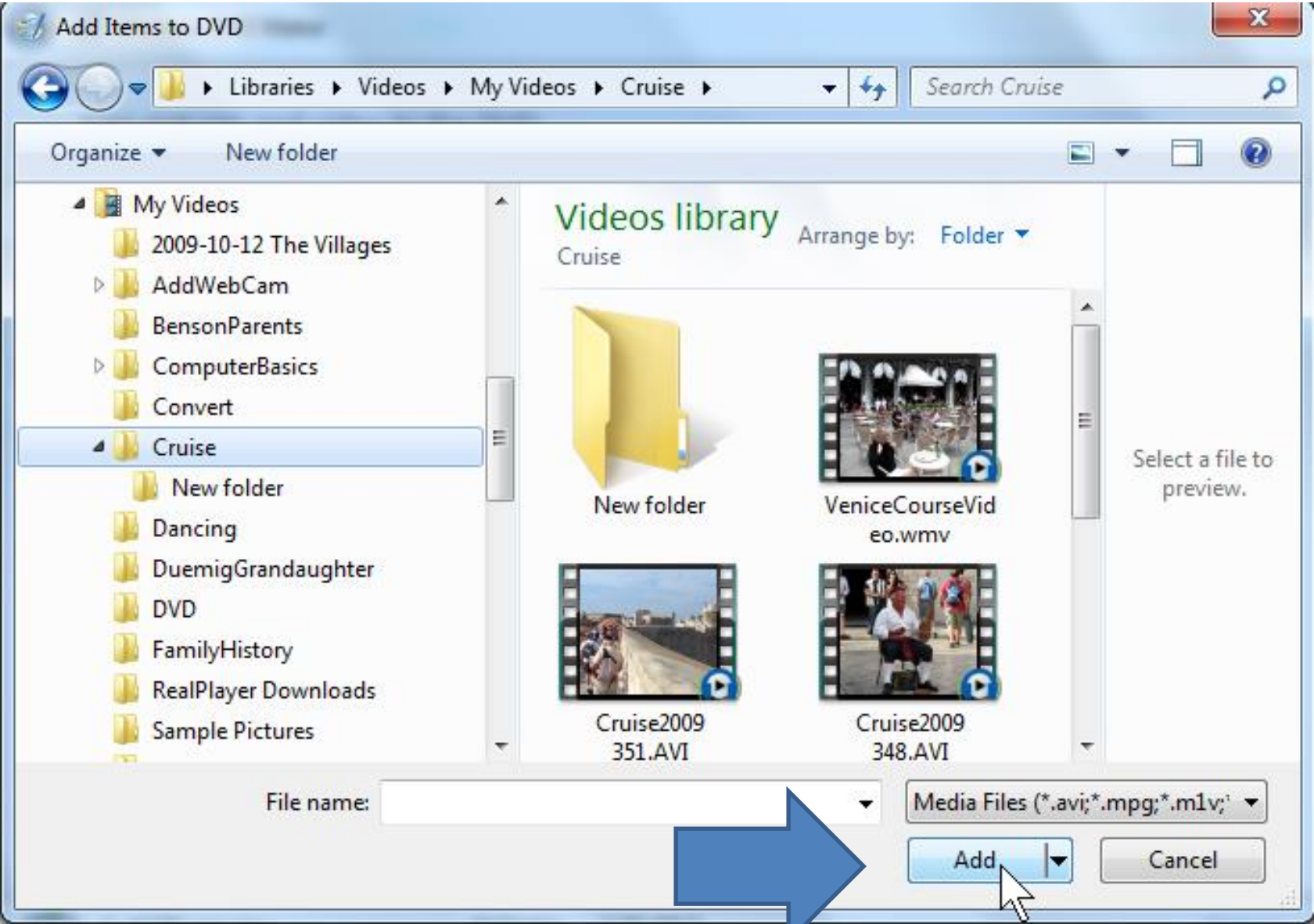


Add Other Video

- **Windows Explorer opens. Find the folder and video and click on it and then click on Add**



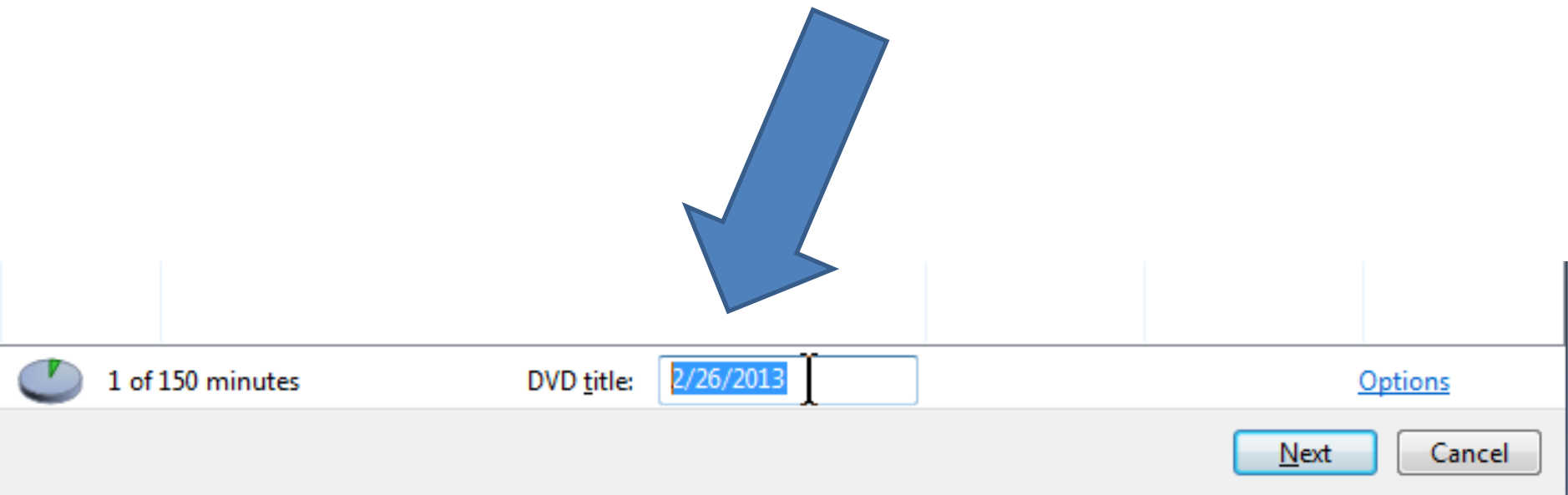
- You then see it. You can click on it and click on move it up if you want, or remove it.

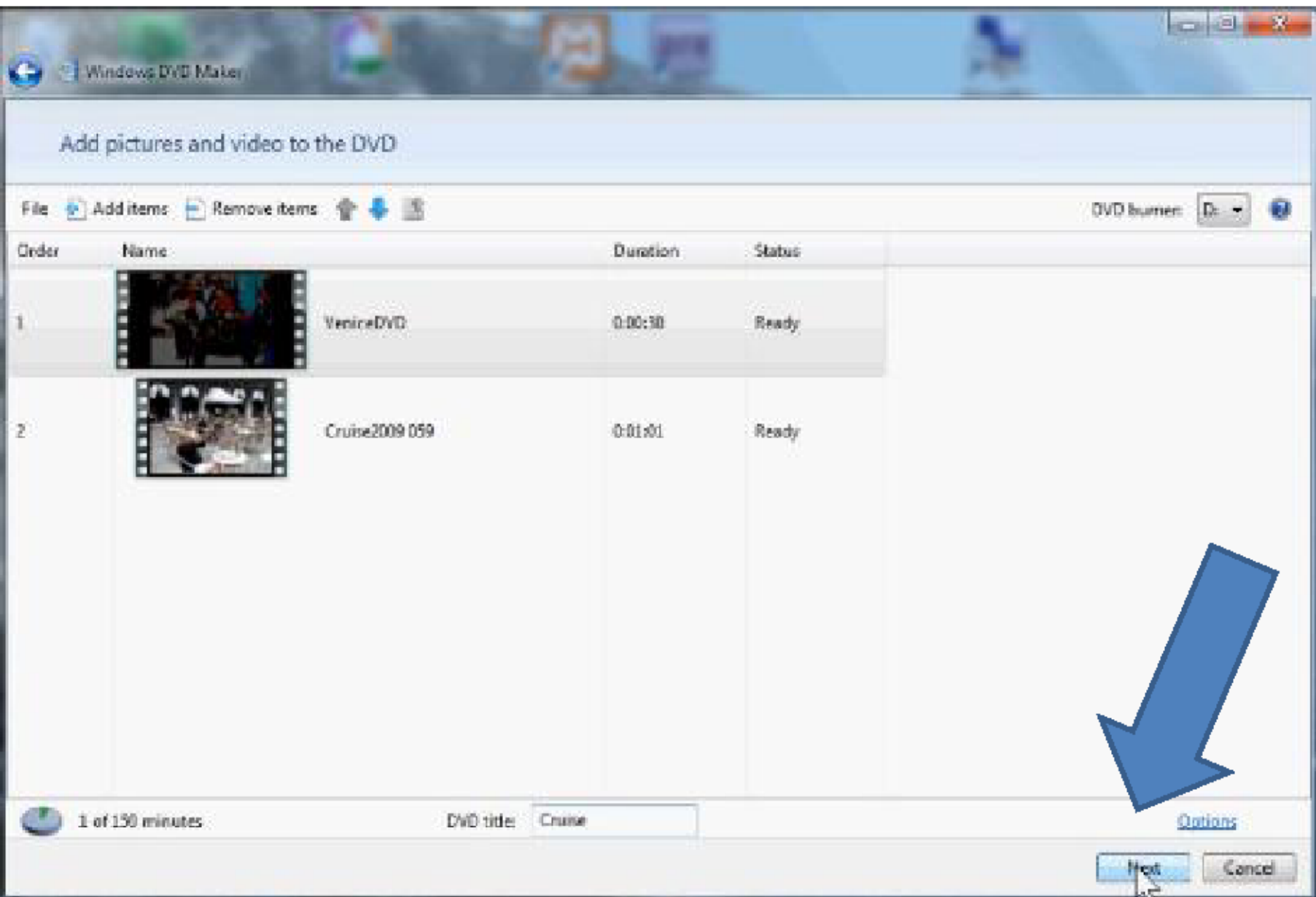

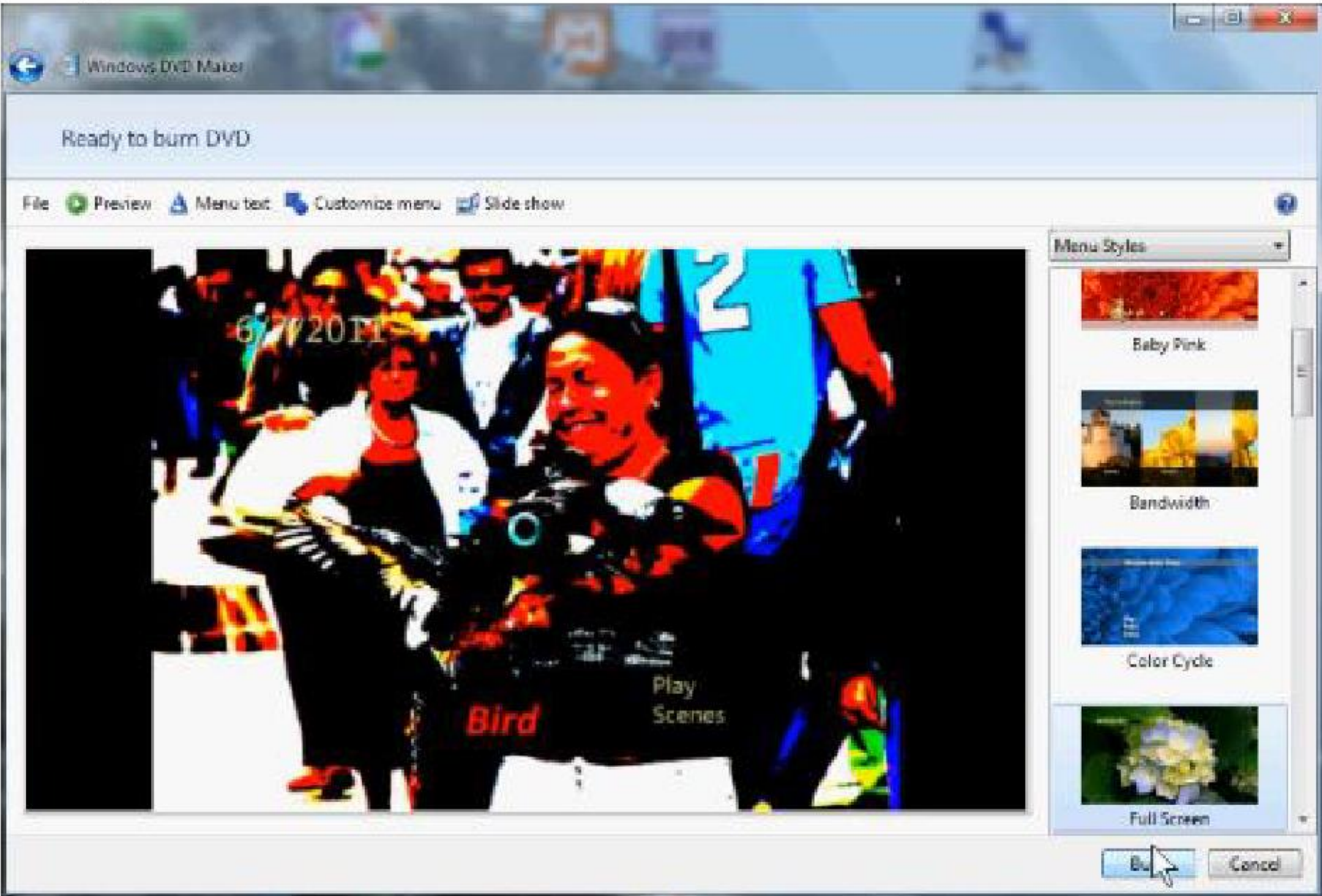
- **At the bottom you can highlight and change the DVD title.**

- **Next is Menu Style**



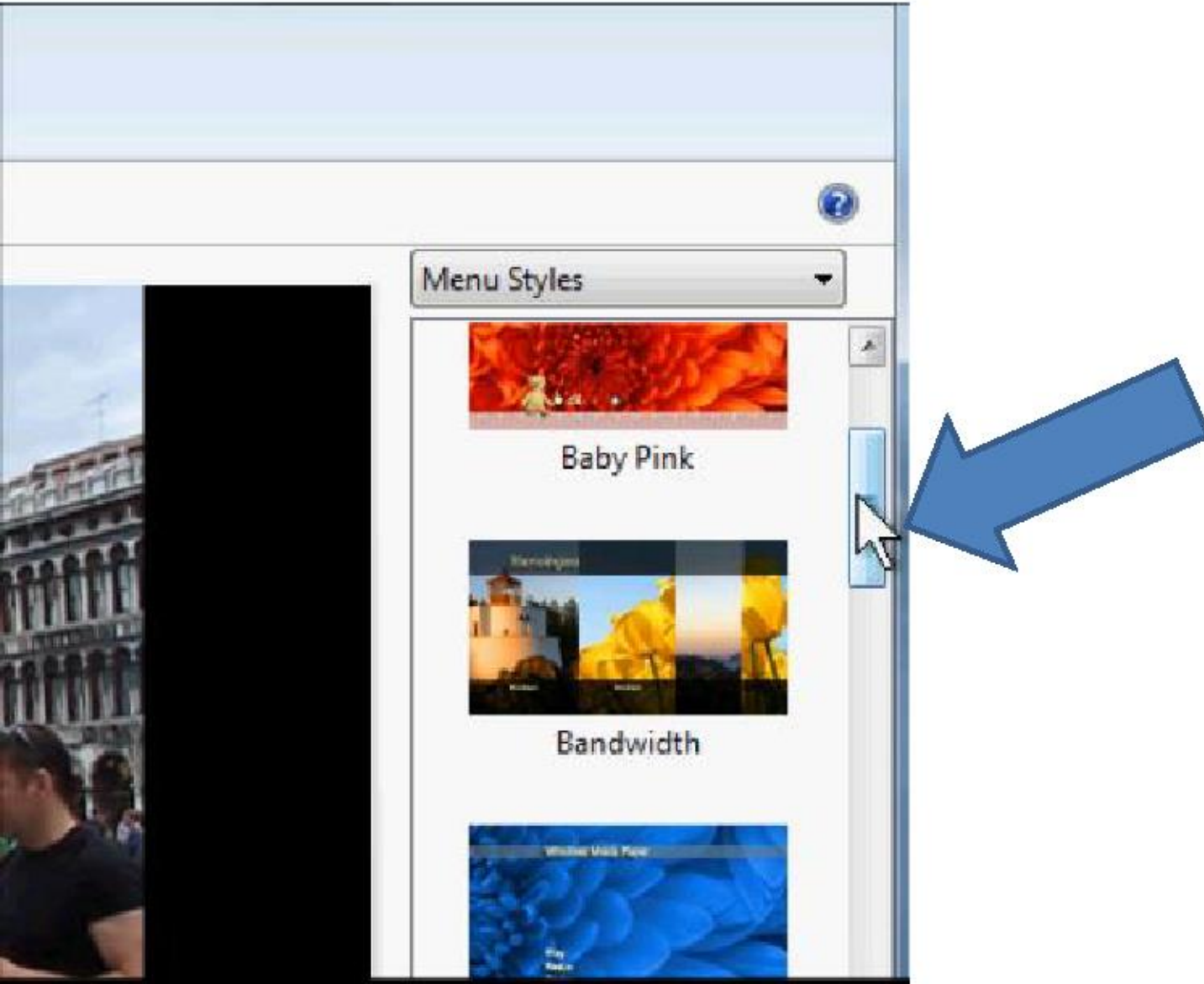
- Click on Next in the lower right.



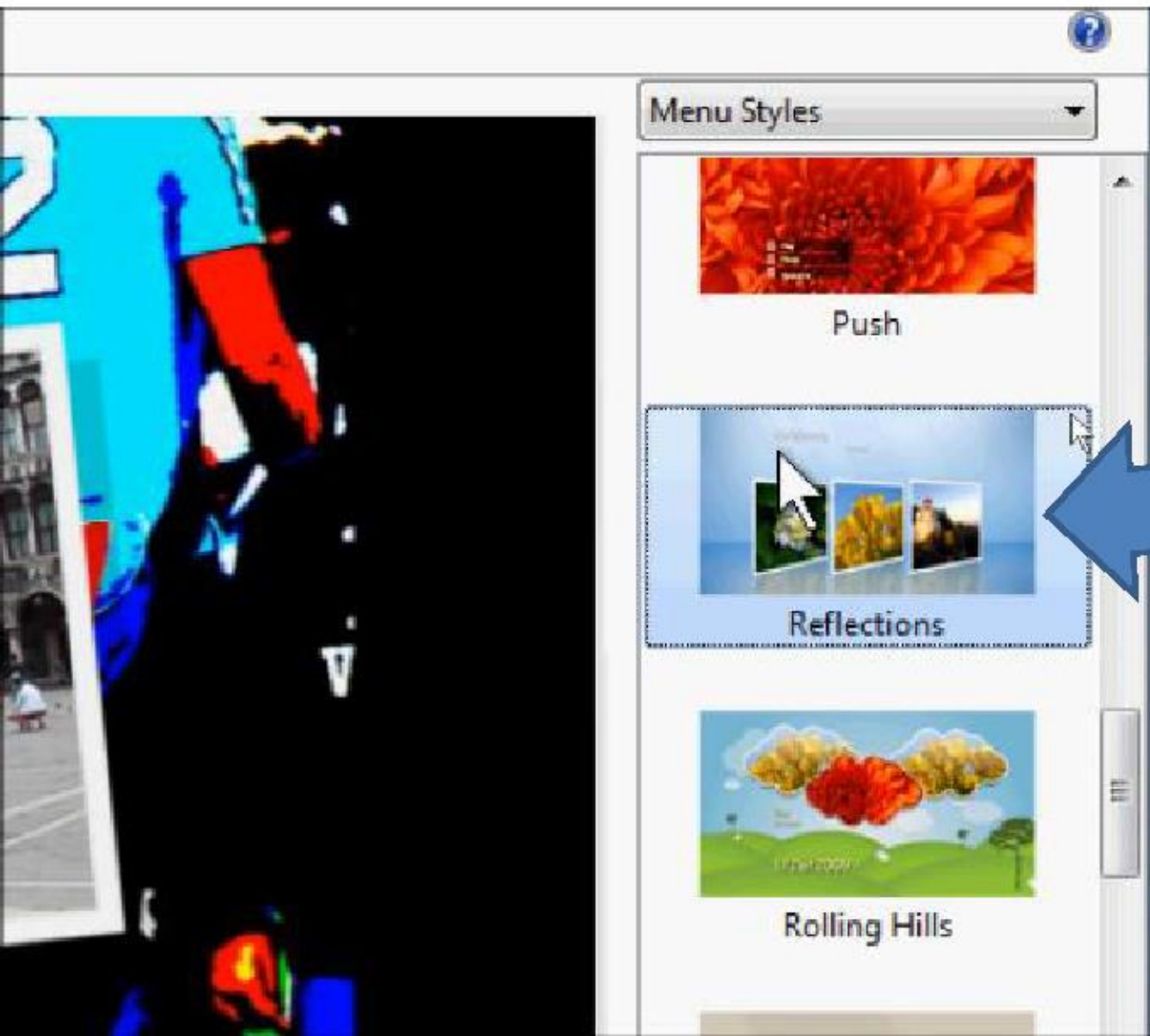
- **Window changes and you see Menu Styles on the Right.**

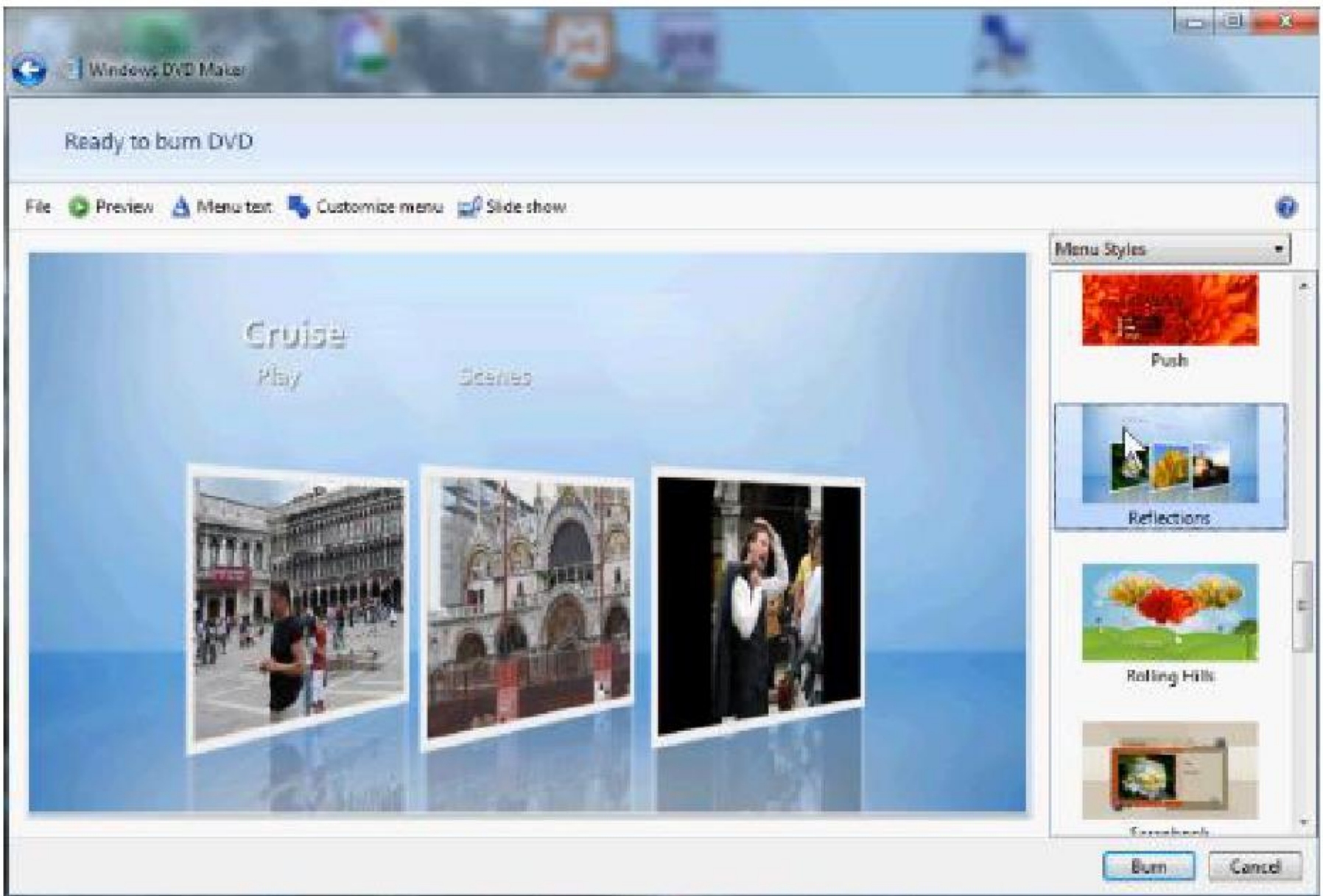

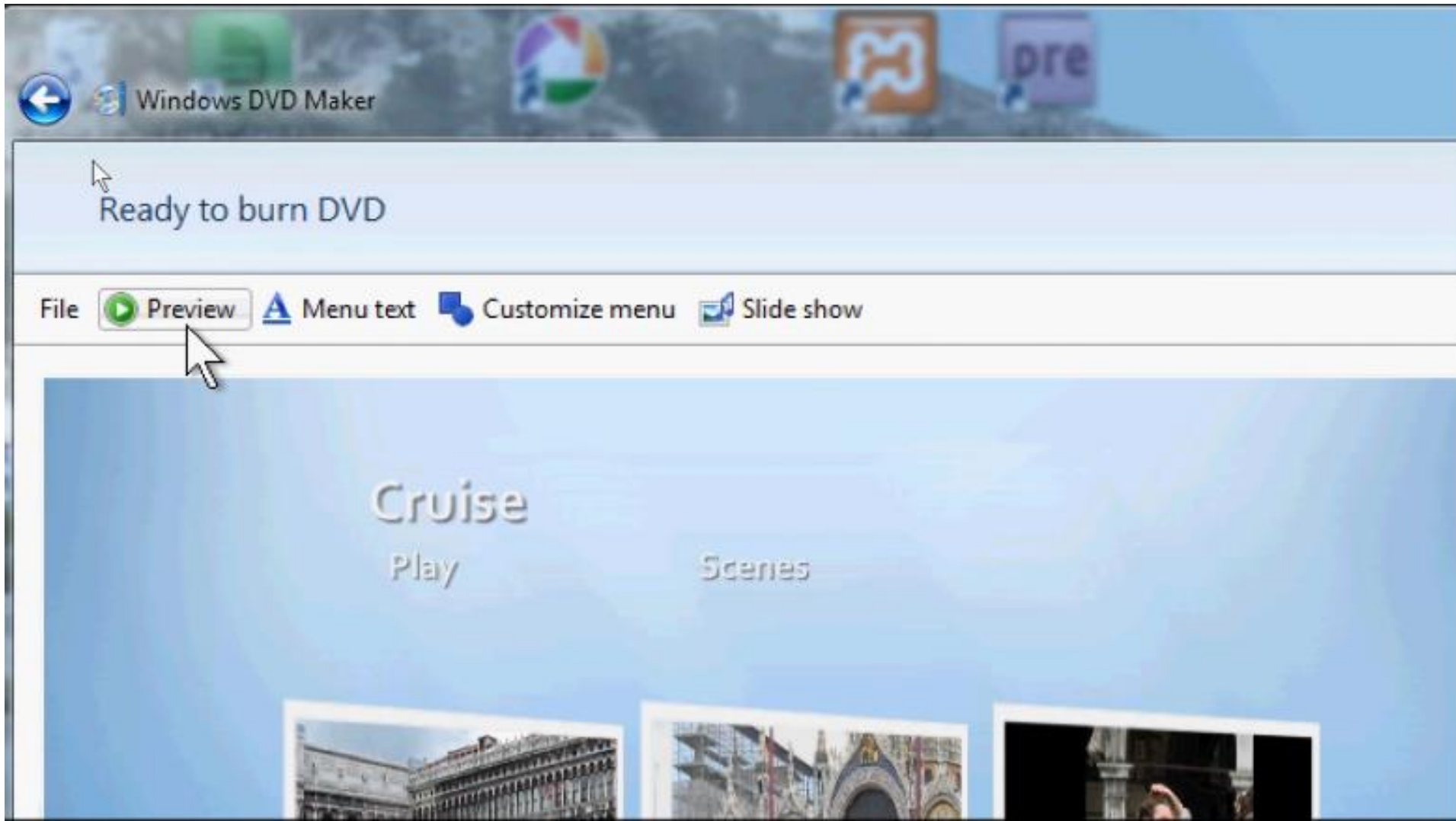

- You then see the results.

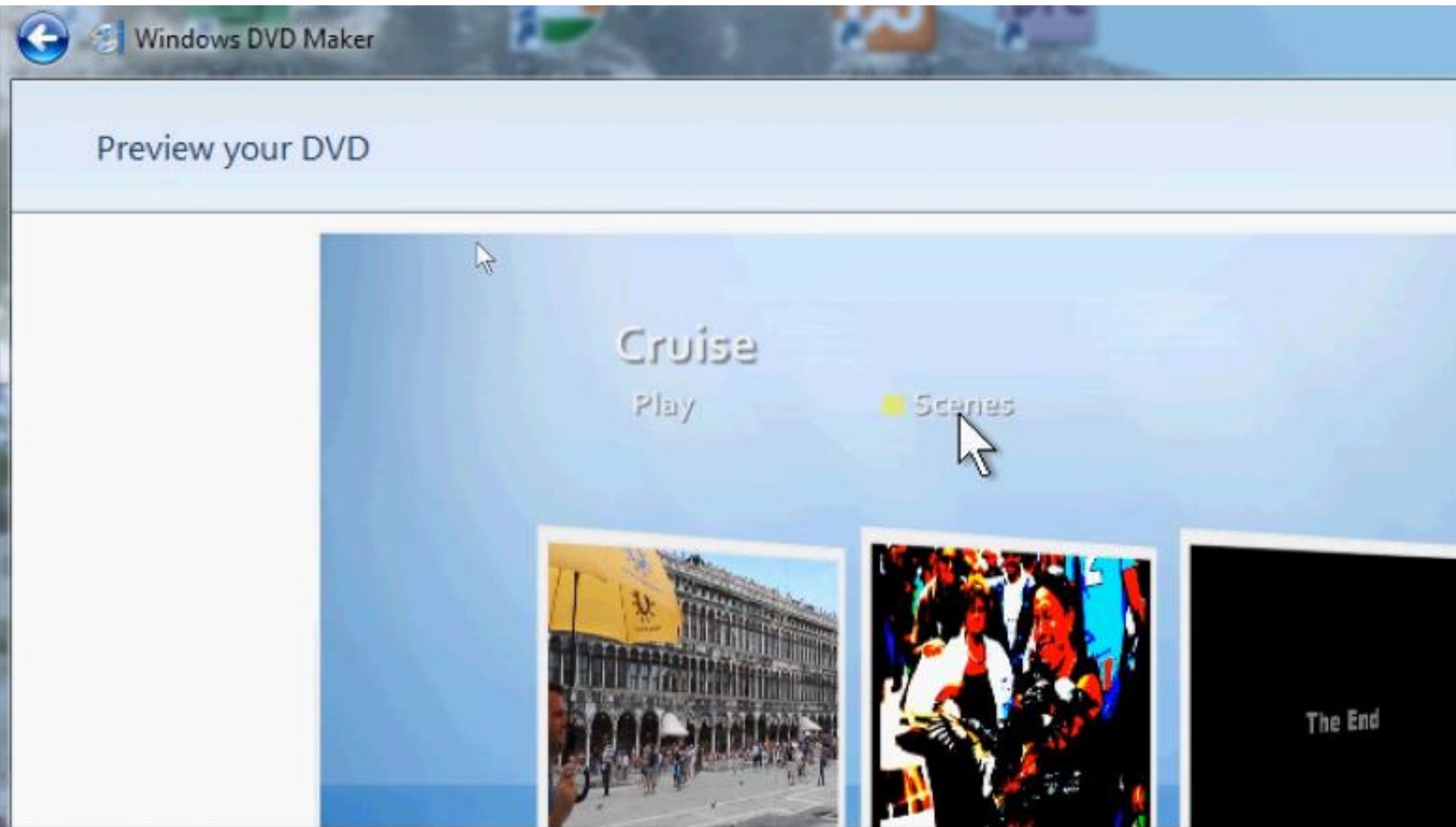


Next is to Preview and then Burn

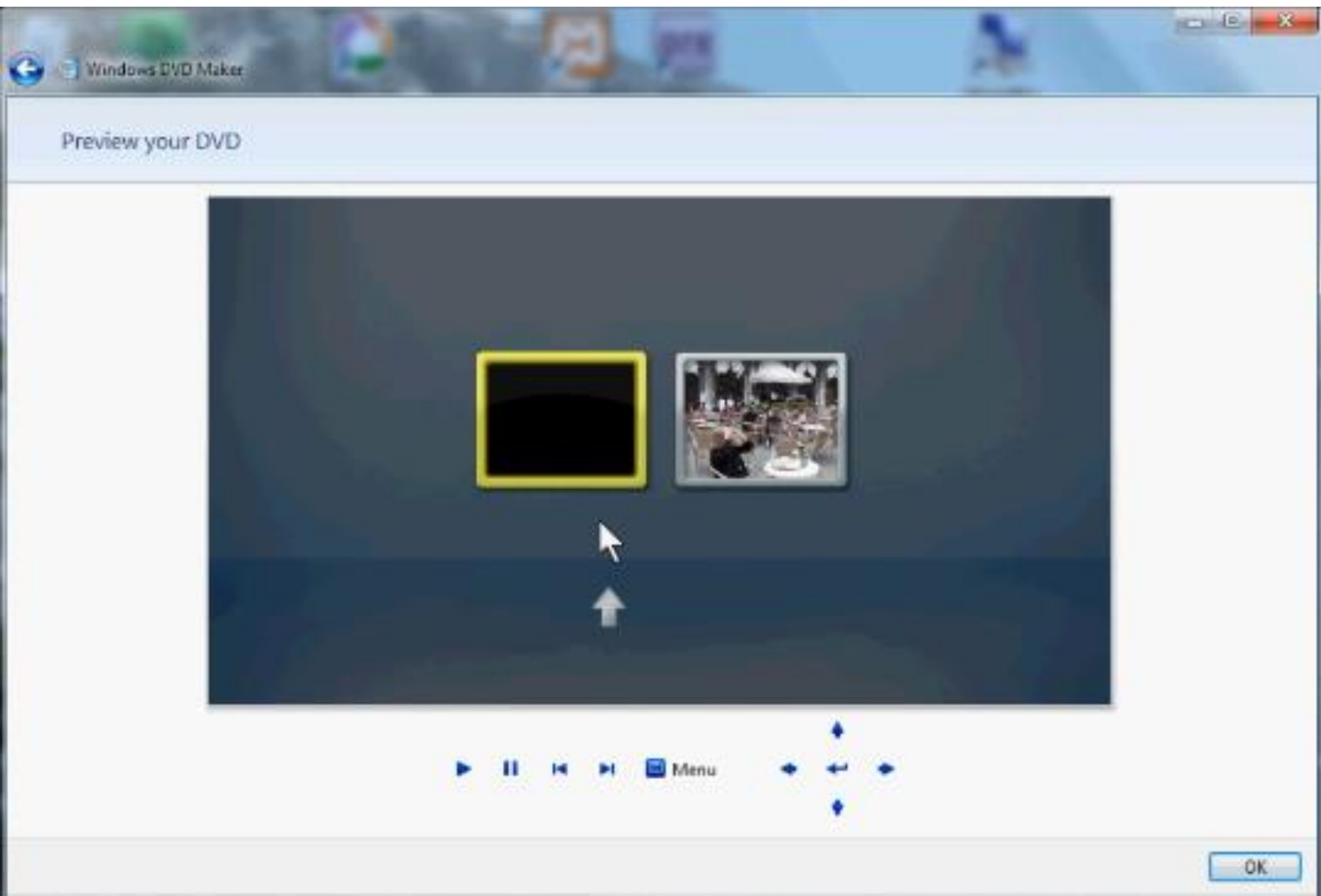
- Click on Preview in the upper left.



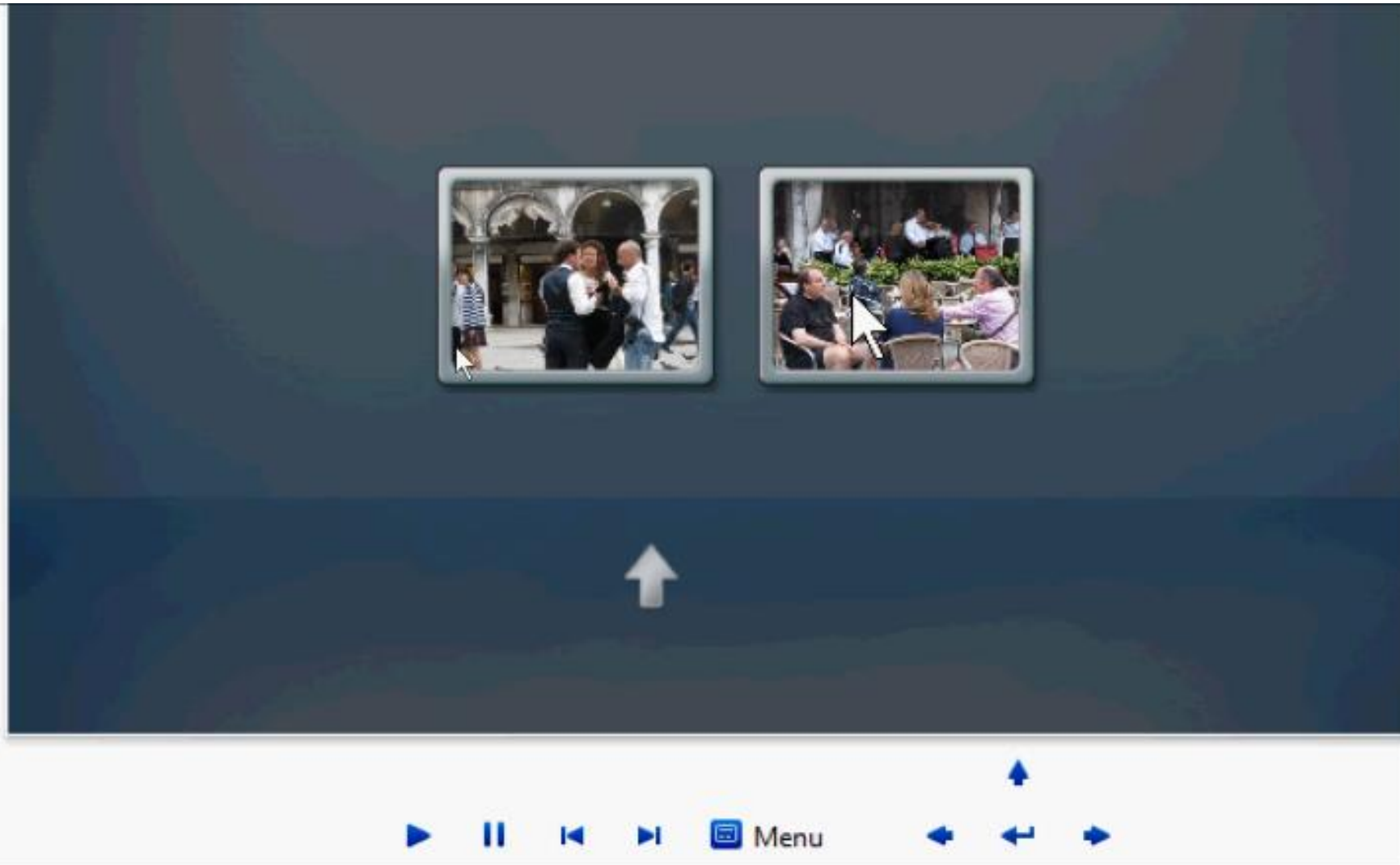
- You then see Preview your DVD and Play and Scenes. Click on it.



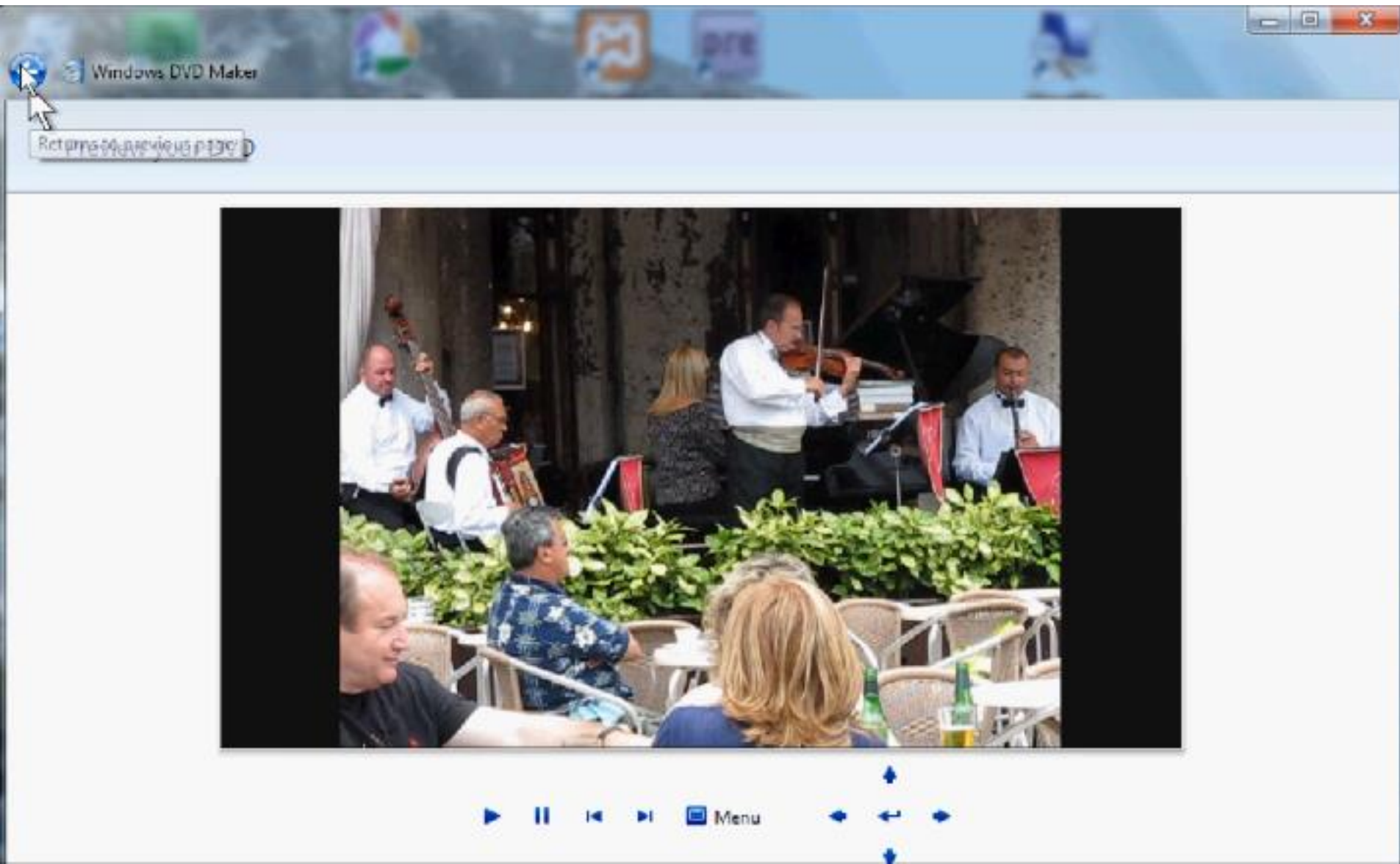
- You then see the two “Videos”



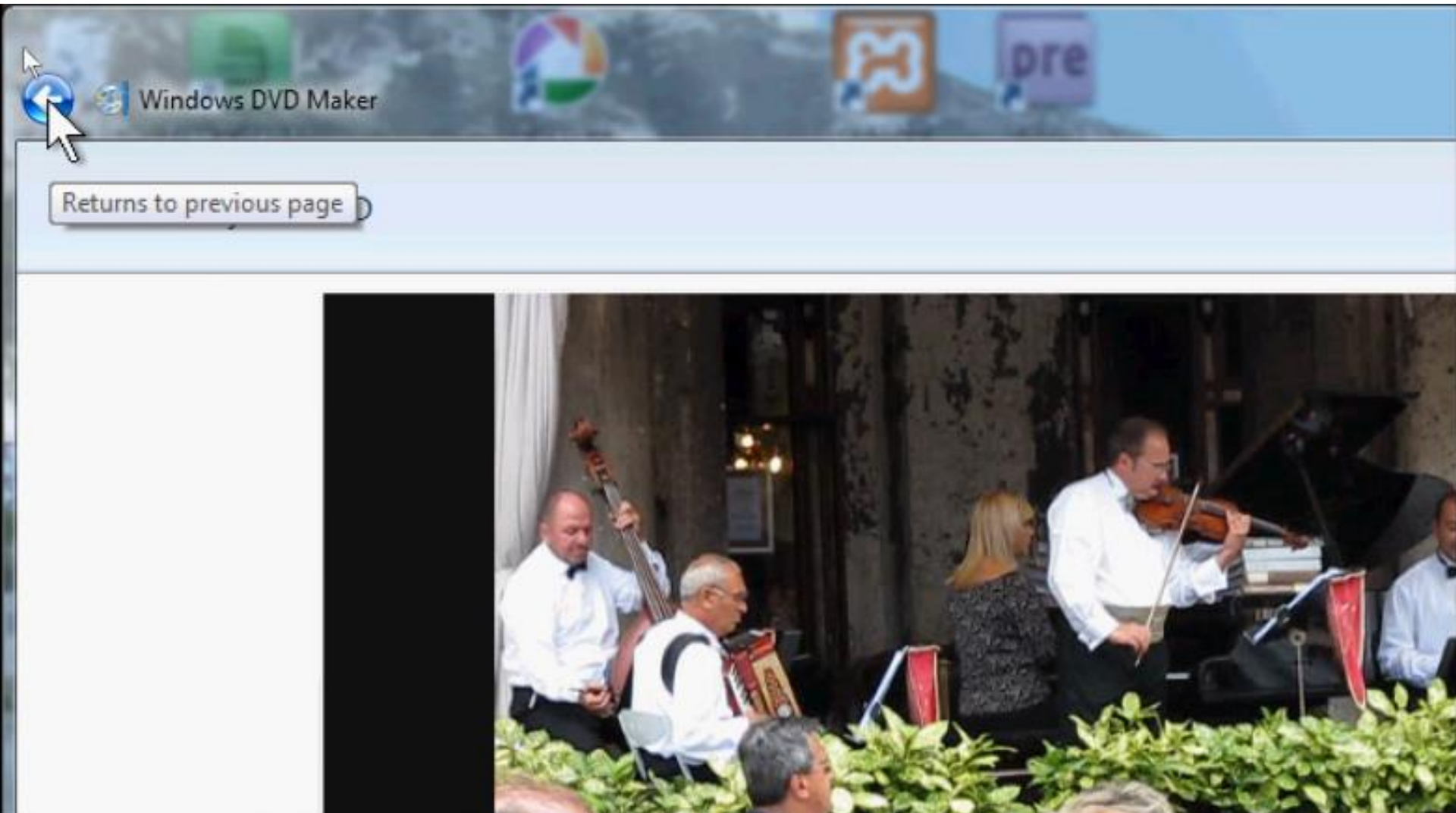
- You then see the two “Videos”. Click on one on the right.



- You then see it playing.



- Then click on the arrow in upper left to return to previous page.



- You are now ready to burn the DVD. Note – as I mentioned before, do not do the next step, even on your laptop.



- You should insert a DVD first, then click on Burn in the lower right.



- If you did not insert a disc, this window pops-up. This is the End of Part B.
